THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

NELSON TOWN WARRANT

TO THE INHABITANTS of the Town of Nelson, in the County of Cheshire, State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED to meet in the Town Hall in said Nelson on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, at 7:00 of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following articles:

ARTICLES OF A GENERAL NATURE

- 1. To choose necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$21,710.00 to defray Town Charges for the year ensuing.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to increase the Selectmen's salaries, the Chairman to receive \$600.00, the Second Selectman to receive \$400.00, and the Third Selectman to receive \$300.00 per annum. (By petition.)
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to hire a book-keeper at a salary of \$500.00 per annum. (By petition.)
- 5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town in anticipation of taxes for the year 1978.
- 6. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction, or by advertised sealed bid, to any proper buyer any and all parcels of property conveyed to the Town by the Tax Collector or other deeds and to execute, acknowledge, and deliver appropriate deeds thereof.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for and to accept gifts and/or Federal or State Aid in the name of the Town of Nelson and grant them power to expend such funds.
- 8. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to receive monies from the State under the Highway Grant, these monies to be used to supplement summer and winter road maintenance.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,802.00 for the support of the Town

Library.

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 to help defray necessary and proper expenses of Old Home Day; the sum of \$175.00 to help defray necessary and proper expenses of Memorial Day.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the care of the Town Common.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,300.00 for the maintenance of the cemetery.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$340.00 as its fair share of the operating costs of the Cheshire Hospital.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$264.00 as the Town's share of the operating costs of the North Cheshire County Home Health Service.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$185.00 as its fair share of the operating costs of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.56 as the Town's share for the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$146.00 for the support of the Monadnock Region Association, or take any other action relating thereto.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for the proper expenses of the Nelson Board of Adjustment.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the proper expenses of the Nelson Conservation Commission.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the proper expenses of the Nelson Planning Board.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Trustees of Trust Funds to adopt the practice of publishing their annual reports in summary form only.
 - 22. To choose the members of the Nelson Planning

Board, two members being elected for a one-year term, one member for a two-year term, and one member for a three-year term. (The fifth member shall be a Selectman, appointed by the Selectmen, ex officio, whose term shall correspond to his official tenure. Thereafter, the term of an elected Planning Board member shall be three years.)

23. Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 72:43-B and 43-C for Expanded Exemptions on Real Estate which provides for a resident 65 years of age up to 75, a \$5000.00 exemption; a resident 75 years of age up to 80, a \$10,000.00 exemption; a resident 80 years of age or older, a \$20,000.00 exemption. Provided that the resident owns the real estate individually or jointly with another or his spouse with whom he has been living for at least 5 years as man and wife; said resident had a net income of less than \$7,000.00 or combined income with spouse of less than \$9,000.00; and owns assets of any kind, tangible or intangible, less bona fide encumbrances, not in excess of \$50,000.00.

ARTICLES DEALING WITH PROTECTION

- 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,600.00, which sum is to be paid to the City of Keene for the use of its landfill.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for Civil Defense purposes.
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the proper expenses of the Police Department.
- 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the proper expenses of the Fire Department.
- 28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to fight forest fires.
- 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to pay for damages done by dogs.
- 30. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 as a subsidy for ambulance service for the ensuing year, March 15, 1978 to March 15, 1979, it being understood that townspeople will still be charged for individual calls.
- 31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for necessary expenses of the Nelson Rescue Squad.

- 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 for a warning system for the Fire Department and to authorize the Selectmen to accept and expend any matching funds that may be available.
- 33. To see if the Town will vote to establish a new Fund and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00, this Capital Reserve Fund to be applied to the purchase of a new truck for the Fire Department, it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from the Fund except by vote of the Town and upon recommendation of the Fire Department.

ARTICLES DEALING WITH ROADS

- 34. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$27,000.00 for the maintenance of the roads and bridges.
- 35. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 as its share of F.I.C.A. (Social Security) payments for its employees.
- 36. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000.00 for General Highway expenses --- gas, repairs, and supplies.
- 37. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$489.40 as its share of TRA construction costs, the State's share being \$3,262.68.
- 38. To see if the Town will vote to accept additional Highway Subsidy funds in the estimated amount of \$3,535.54, these funds to be used in conjunction with TRA funds.
- 39. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to be added to the Equipment Capital Reserve Fund, it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from this fund for the purchase of road equipment except by vote of the Town and upon recommendation of the Town Equipment Committee.
- 40. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$35,000.00 for the purchase of a new or a used payloader and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw \$16,000.00 from the Equipment Capital Reserve Fund for this purpose, the remaining \$19,000.00 to be raised through property taxes; and, further, to authorize the Selectmen to borrow the \$19,000.00 by long-term notes.

ARTICLES OF A SPECIAL NATURE

41. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appro-

priate the sum of \$1,600.00 to repair the roof of the Town Hall.

- 42. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$3,000.00 to drill a well that will service both the Town Hall and the Brick Schoolhouse.
- 43. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00, this sum to be held in the Town Buildings Capital Reserve Fund for the renovation or remodelling of the Town Hall, it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from the Fund except by vote of the Town.
- 44. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,000.00 for the Reassessment of the Town, or take any other action related thereto.
- 45. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Revenue Sharing Fund, established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, for use as set-offs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated; and, further, to authorize the Selectmen to make pro rata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced, or take any other action relating thereto.

- 46. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to help make up the deficit in our budget.
- 47. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for a property map of the Town, the next step toward meeting the 1980 State deadline for a tax map of each town.
- 48. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Brick Schoolhouse Fund a sum not to exceed \$5,000.00 to repair the roof and to purchase storm windows for the second floor.
- 49. Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 72:62 for a property tax exemption on real property equipped with solar energy heating or cooling system, which exemption shall be in an amount equal to 100% of the cost of the solar energy system installed, if it added to property already equipped with a fossil fuel system, or equal to the same percentage of the difference in cost between the solar energy system installed and a fossil fuel system of the same capacity, if it is included in new construction, or to alterations in previously unheated property? (By

petition.)

50. To see if the Town will express a sense of the meeting on the following questions regarding Route 101:

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

It was a very productive year at the Olivia Rodham Memorial Library.

We started registering all our regular and new patrons as they came into the Library, and to date we have one hundred registered users.

During the Fall and Spring terms at Keene State College, the Librarian completed two Library Technique courses: one entitled "AV in the Public Library", and the other, "Programs and Services for Children". This completes all the courses offered by the State Library and the University of New Hampshire. A total of nine courses were completed.

The Librarian is serving on the Advisory Council on Libraries, which meets monthly in Concord. She attended eight of these Council meetings in 1977. She is also serving on the Planning Board and the Qualifications Committee for the District Advisory Council and attended five such meetings in Claremont, Peterborough, Antrim, Walpole and Newport. She also attended three Service Center meetings in Peterborough, two Book Meetings at the Keene District Office, and four Trustee meetings.

The Librarian showed the film, "Rabbit Hill", to the young people at the Town Hall during Old Home Week. She also showed a slide program which she wrote, entitled, "The Little Dog Who Collected Sticks". We are still showing some excellent films the second Wednesday of each month in the Library at 7:30 P.M. An average of fifteen people attended last year, and everyone is welcome!

Last winter the Librarian taught five sixth-graders a nine-week library course, which ended with a trip to the Keene Junior High School Library.

Once again, our library received a Certificate of Merit for meeting state requirements in 1976.

Eighteen young people took part in the Summer Reading Program entitled "Poki's Tail". After each book was read, a brightly colored yarn was added to Poki's tail. Ice cream was served to all at the end of the summer.

The Bookmobile made three visits and left 1,925 books. Thanks to all who helped pick out the books and stayed to help shelve them afterwards.

Eleven pre-schoolers visited the library in November, where they were shown a film and told some stories by the librarian.

Books were taken every two weeks to the school and pre-school during the school year. My thanks to Sydney Plant, Joan Warner, Celia Wiechert, and Dorothy French for their help in carrying the books to the young people.

Seventy-four books were obtained on Interlibrary Loan.

Four hundred seventy-five books were catalogued during the year.

As you will note below in the recap of this year's activities, the Department has been busy, with most categories showing increases. The one bright spot is the great reduction in the number of reported breaks and property thefts. We feel that this is due, in large part, to the increased patrols, especially those that have been made in the late evening hours. REPORT OF THE NELSON FIRE DEPARTMENT

Thirty-four calls were responded to by your Fire Department in the year 1977.

These calls consisted of four house fires, three smoke investigations, five chimney fires, two brush fires, thirteen Rescue calls, one Mutual Aid assistance, two investigations, (fire alarm warning systems), one search and rescue, one downed wire, one boat fire, and one truck fire.

A total of two hundred man hours were spent by thirteen members at fire training schools in Keene State College and Meadowood Fire Training School.

Our Department is now up to twenty-seven active members, of which five are qualified Emergency Medical Technicians, and three are qualified Red Cross First Aid Instructors.

At present all three trucks are in running order, and things are beginning to shape up.

In the past year we have run into unexpected snags. The brakes on both tankers went bad and had to be repaired; also, the radios in M-1 and M-2 had to be replaced because of age and the high cost of maintenance. These two radios were replaced at an unbelievably low price of one thousand dollars, of which four hundred was paid by matching funds.

We are now faced with a serious problem. The alerting siren atop the fire house finally disintegrated due to metal fatigue, age, and extreme cold weather. This has to be replaced. In the meantime, I was able to borrow a siren from the Chesterfield Fire Department. This siren is much too small for our area, but at present is better than none.

Our number-one truck has reached its tenth birthday, which means we have just ten years left to build a reserve fund for its replacement. At the current cost of fire trucks, it means setting aside a reserve of close to five thousand dollars a year for the next ten years.

We now have water Fire and Rescue in our department. After the boat fire on Granite Lake last August, we were the grateful recipients of a boat, motor and trailer donated by a summer resident on the Stoddard side of Granite Lake. We are now in the process of equipping this boat for water rescue and so it can be used to supply water for any fires around lake shores.

I wish to thank you people for the preventive measures you have taken in the care of your chimneys. Due to your interest in safety, we have had only five chimney fires. We want to help you prevent this type of fire next year; thus, we are planning to set up a chimney-cleaning group in the department. This group will accept

requests and set up time for cleaning on Saturdays and Sundays. Any donations will be accepted by the Fire Department.

REPORT OF

THE NELSON VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT RESCUE SQUAD

An Open Letter To The People Of Nelson:

The leading causes of death among children and young people are automobile accidents, drownings, and burns. Children are frequently injured by bicycle accidents and the accidental ingestion of hazardous substances, as well as by skiing, snow machine, and motorcycle accidents. Even with precautionary measures, accidents can occur when we least expect them.

Only a minute handful of people noticing the emergency medical personnel at work really see that the tragedy is carried within each one of them. They are all well trained; they know how to effectively use splints, bandages, CPR, and the thousand other little things that literally mean the difference between life and death. But --- that training never prepares them for a night standing next to a small limp body, or feeling the trembling grip of someone as they rush him toward the hospital, or the tear-reddened eyes of a mother whose child they are desperately trying to save. The praise they receive is deeply personal and usually on a one-to-one basis.

While parts of our society seem oblivious to their work, the rescue worker serves so that life might go on. He or she is always prepared to help the victim, be it from fires, accidents, strokes, heart attacks, depressed suicide attempts, drownings, broken bones, burns, or emergency deliveries.

The people of this town are very fortunate to have such a group of dedicated people. Your Fire Department and Rescue Squad members have spent many of their own hours training, and learning new techniques to help the people of Nelson in times of emergencies. 1977 has shown an increase in both fire and rescue calls and the use of your Fire Department equipment, as well as an increase in manpower and hours volunteered for training.

Sometimes we tend to take the smell of smoke or a chimney fire too lightly. Let's look a little further and think of some of the possibilities for tragedy that can occur when a call for help is put in. One of your family or friends may be injured responding to the call, or a small child may lose his life in a fire that was started by that chimney you forgot to clean. We are here to help you, but our biggest job is to teach and encourage prevention. Prevention saves lives --- yours and your loved ones. It is our wish that each and every one

of you has a safe and healthy 1978. We stand ready to help you in any emergency, but the dedicated people of your Fire Department and Rescue Squad need your fullest support.

Article 2. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$19,710.00 to defray Town Charges for the year ensuing.

Article 3. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town in anticipation of taxes for the year ensuing.

Article 4. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction to any proper buyer any and all parcels of property conveyed to the Town by the Tax Collector or other deeds and to execute, acknowledge, and deliver appropriate deeds thereof.

Article 5. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to accept gifts and/or Federal or State Aid in the name

of the Town of Nelson and the power to expend such funds.

Article 6. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to receive monies from the State under the Highway Grant, these monies to be used to supplement summer and winter road maintenance.

Article 7. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,568.00 for the support of the Town Library.

Article 8. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 to help defray necessary and proper expenses of Old Home Day; the sum of \$175.00 to help defray necessary and proper expenses of Memorial Day.

Article 9. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the care of the Town Common.

Article 10. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,300.00 for the maintenance of the Cemetery.

Article 11. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$340.00 as its fair share of the operating expenses of the Cheshire Hospital.

Article 12. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$180.00 as its fair share of the operating expenses of the North Cheshire Home Health Services.

Article 13. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$180.00 as its fair share of the operating costs of the Monadnock Family Mental Health Services.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$299.20 as the Town's share for the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission.

Motion was made and seconded to pass over this article; written vote requested:

Motion made and seconded to accept article as read. Motion prevailed, and article was adopted.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$205.00 for the support of the Monadnock Region Association.

Motion made to pass over this article. Motion seconded and prevailed.

Article 16. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for the proper expenses of the Nelson Board of Adjustment and the administration of the Nelson Land Use Plan.

Article 17. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the proper expenses of the Nelson Conservation Commission.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to defray the cost for the printing and distribution of the Subdivision Rules and Regulations to all taxpayers of the Town.

Amendment: Motion was made and seconded to raise \$300.00.

Amendment: Motion made and seconded that Newton Tolman be given the job to have these printed and delivered. (Declined) Motion lost.

Amendment: Motion made that the Nelson Land Owners Assoc. pay for the printing and delivery. Motion seconded, and lost.

The amendment to raise \$300.00 was taken by a standing vote, Yes 47

No 54 Motion lost.

Motion made to accept article as read, and seconded Yes 74

No 30 Motion prevailed, and article was adopted as read.

Article 19. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the proper expenses of the Nelson Planning Board.

Article 20. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,340.00 for rubbish removal.

Article 21. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for Civil Defense purpose.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the proper expenses of the Police Department.

Amendment: Motion made and seconded that the Selectmen hire a uniformed policeman to be on duty at all times whenever the Town Hall or the Schoolhouse is rented for functions other than those of the Town of Nelson. The cost for this policeman's services shall be added to the rental fee.

Amendment: Motion made to strike out the word "uniformed". Motion seconded and lost.

Amendment: Motion made that it be left up to the Selectmen. Motion seconded. Both the second and the motion withdrawn.

The selectmen explained that they already take care of the Officier and they were sure it could be worked out. The original amendment lost.

Motion made and seconded to accept article 22 as read.

Motion prevailed.

Article 23. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the maintenance of the Fire Department.

Article 24. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to fight forest fires.

Article 25. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to pay for damages done by dogs.

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 as a subsidy for ambulance service for the ensuing year, March 15, 1977 to March 15, 1978, it being understood that townspeople will still be charged for individual calls.

Amendment: Motion made and seconded to raise \$300.00, motion withdrawn. Article was accepted as read.

Article 27. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for necessary expenses of the Nelson Rescue Squad.

Article 28. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,201.00, \$250.00 Town funds to be matched by a Federal grant of \$951.00 for the purchase of a portable radio, this equipment to be used by the Nelson Police Department for operation away from police vehicles with fixed radio equipment. If approved, the portable radio would also be available for use by the Nelson Rescue Squad.

Article 29. It was voted to join the Cheshire County Emergency Medical Services Board and charge the Selectmen with the appointment of the Town delegate to said Board. This board receives its funding through Federal and/or State grants, educational courses, and sale of course material, and does not charge its member towns or services with dues or any other fees.

Article 30. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$23,000.00 for the maintenance of the roads and bridges, and to withdraw Social Security from all payroll accounts over \$50.00 per quarter.

Article 31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to crush gravel. Motion made and seconded to pass over this article. Motion prevailed.

Article 32. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$16,000.00 for General Highway expenses---gas, repairs, and supplies.

Article 33. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$492.55 as its share of the TRA construction costs, the State's share being \$3,283.67.

Article 34. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund, it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from this Fund except by vote of the Town for purchase of road equipment and upon recommendation of the Town Equipment Committee.

Motion was made and seconded to take up Article 38 at this time.

Motion prevailed.

Article 38. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 this sum to be held in the Town Buildings Capital Reserve Fund for the renovation or remodeling of the Town Hall and/or the Old Schoolhouse, it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from the Fund except by vote of the Town.

Article 35. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to pave the West Shore Road around Granite Lake.

Motion made to pass over this article. Motion seconded and prevailed.

Article 36. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the repair and repainting of the Town Hall.

Article 37. To see if the Town will vote to withdraw the funds from the Dump Capital Reserve Fund and to transfer these funds to the General Fund, to be set against taxes. The amount to be \$4,632.61 plus the interest for 1977. Motion made and seconded to accept article, motion lost and article was defeated.

Article 39. It was voted to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$1,500.00 for the Reassessment of the Town.

Article 40. It was voted to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$2,000.00 for a property map of the Town, the next step toward meeting the 1980 State dead-line for a tax map of each town.

Article 41. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Revenue Sharing Fund, established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, for use as set-offs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated; and further, to

authorize the Selectmen to make pro rata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced, or take any other action thereto.

Appropriation Amount Related Article Highway Maintenance \$6,000.00 30

Article 42. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to help make up a deficit in our budget.

Article 43. It was voted to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$500.00 to make the small 2nd-floor room of the Old Schoolhouse suitable for a Selectmen's office.

Article 44. To see if the Town will vote to elect the members (5) of the Planning Board.

Motion made and seconded to accept article as read.

Amendment: Motion made to dissolve the Planning Board and the Subdivision Rules and Regulations formulated and adopted by it. Motion seconded.

The Moderator said he feels this amendment is not legal and even if accepted may not have any legal bearing. Motion withdrawn, and second.

Amendment: Motion made and seconded to change number of members from 5 to 6. Motion and second withdrawn.

Article 4. It was moved the the District raise and appropriate the sum of \$579.00 to send the fifth grade (13 students and 1 adult) to Otter Lake Conservation School (Camp Union). (13 students \times \$43 + 1 adult \times \$20 = \$579.00) The motion was seconded and Article 4 carried.

Article 5. It was moved that the District apply for a school lunch program waiver for the 1977-78 school year and raise and appropriate \$2,700.00 for the support of a locally administered school lunch program. Jon Punce

moved to amend Article 5 to read: that the District apply for a waiver to abandon the Nelson School lunch program. This amendment was seconded and defeated. Maury Collins moved to amend Article 5 to read: that the District apply to the State of New Hampshire for a permissive Federal School lunch program and that the present lunch program now in existence be continued in the school year 1977-78. This amendment was seconded and passed, and Article 5 carried as amended.

Article 6. It was moved that the District raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be deposited in the Capital Reserve Fund established at the March 1972 District Meeting for the "purpose of the construction of buildings and/or purchase of equipment, and/or the acquisition of land for school purposes." The motion was seconded and Article 6 was passed. We now have a total of \$2,289.30 in this account.

Article 7. It was moved that the District raise and appropriate \$141,967.00 for the support of schools, for the salaries of the school district officers and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District. The motion was seconded and Article 7 was passed.

Article 8. It was moved that we pass over Article 8. The motion was seconded and Article 8 was passed over.

Article 9. It was moved that the District exclude from its Social Security Plan services performed by election officials or election workers for each calendar quarter in which the remuneration paid for such service is less than \$50.00. The motion was seconded and Article 9 was passed.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:20 p.m.

The Nelson School Board during the 1977-78 school year established a Long-Range Planning Committee to review the educational programs and facilities of the Nelson School District. The Committee which represented parents, planning board members, teachers, school board members and administration, met throughout the school year to develop a report which will be presented to the school board and finally to the school district relative to its recommendations for the Nelson School District.

The Nelson School Board has established the following goals for the 1977-78 school year.

- 1. Study of Facility Needs for the Munsonville School.
- 2. Improve Public Relations with Nelson School District.
 - 3. Curriculum Review and Recommendations.
- 4. A Review of Public Law 94-192 Special Education and its impact on the Nelson School District.

In compliance with public law 94-192 dealing with Handicapped Education, the Nelson School Board has demonstrated foresight in the establishment of a local special education program for handicapped students.

During the 1977-78 school year, three youngsters have benefited from the program. If the program did not exist, these youngsters would be tuitioned to other schools for special services.

In the area of maintenance, the school has undergone a complete uplifting. The exterior of the building has been painted and the roof reshingled.

CONSERVATION COMMISSION

The year has suddenly come full circle. The Nelson Conservation Commission, like other Town servants, must pause for a moment of reflection. What have been our accomplishments? Where are we going?

On May 7, 1977 Nelson's spring was improved by the annual freshening of our "roadscapes". Enthusiastic throngs of old and young with trucks and litter bags earned the lemonade and cookies graciously offered by our neighbors, the Robertsons, and all were glad that Russ Thomas had initiated this useful fixture.

By July 13, thoughts had already turned toward winter. Dan Scully, of Total Environmental Action in Harrisville, came over to share the latest intelligence on retrofit, insulation and insolation. We are glad to have solar friends next door.

"Cordwood Round-up" was our most dramatic event. On August 8, in the wake of a summer deluge, our Green was suddenly enlivened by stove salesmen, hot dogs, Bobby Curtis's chainsaw, Win French's black powder, Les Clarke's Paul Bunyan tales, and Jim Bell's fire cautions. Somehow this managed to prepare us for woodpiles and the cold nights ahead.

Upstaged on October 17 were our youthful conservationists, students from the Munsonville school, who accomplished a wonderful mission. Guided by stellar surveyor Bill House, they staked out Nelson's eleven-acre Blacktop Mountain site. It was a joyous occasion.

With the new year, we addressed to a most important and pressing concern: land use in Nelson. On January 10 we held a preliminary meeting which we co-hosted with Selectmen, Planning Board, and Board of Adjustment members. Our guest speaker, Ron King, of the Society for the Protection of New Hampshire Forests, helped us focus on the problems land owners and conservationists must face if we are to preserve our splendid but fragile array of natural resources for our children and their descendants.

We urge all of Nelson to turn out for our follow-up information meetings in 1978, designed to help us all make intelligent plans for Nelson's future.
