#### TOWN WARRANT

#### State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Boston, in the County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

(L. S.)

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said New Boston on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To see if the town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act and choose a committee to carry out the provisions, or act in relation thereto.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation for the same.
  - a-For the maintenance of roads and bridges.
  - (b)—For the general expense of the highway department.
  - (c)—For the removal of snow.
  - (d)—For Memorial Day and care of memorial.
  - (e)—For the support of schools.
  - (f)—For town officers' salaries.
  - (g)—For town officers' expenses.
  - (h)-For election and registration.

- (i)—For the expense of the town hall.
- (j)—For police department.
- (k)—For fire department.
- (1)—For health department.
- (m)—For vital statistics.
- (n)—For street lighting.
- (o)—For town poor.
- (p)—For old age assistance.
- (q)—For interest.
- (r)—For damage.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid for the construction of class 2 road known as North Francestown road, raise and appropriate money for the same, or vote in relation thereto; or will accept State Aid for the construction of class 5 roads, raise and appropriate money for the same or act in relation thereto.
- 5. By request, to see if the town will vote to pay firemen six dollars each per year not to exceed 25 firemen, or act in relation thereto.
- 6. By request, to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,400.00 to purchase a fire pump and hose, or act in relation thereto.
- 7. By request, to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of railing or filling highway embankments, or act in relation thereto.
- 8. By request, to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the purpose of cooperating with the State in the control of the White Pine Blister Rust provided town labor is used in the expenditure of the appropriation, or act in relation thereto.
- 9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Wason Memorial library.

- 10. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay town debt.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to purchase any new equipment, raise and appropriate money for the same or act in relation thereto.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to close subject to gates and bars the highway leading from the corner easterly of the residence of Mrs. E. H. Wason to a point near the dwelling house known as the David Todd place, or act in relation thereto.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to sell or administer real estate acquired through tax sales.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money to meet the necessary expenses of the town.
- 15. To hear the reports of agents, officers, and committees heretofore chosen, or act in relation thereto.
- 16. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

#### REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

## To the Citizens of New Boston:

The current year is my twelfth as superintendent of schools in this supervisory union. When I came the union consisted of the following districts: Goffstown Town, Goffstown Ind., Bedford, and New Boston. There were three towns and four school districts and so remained until two years ago.

The following table will indicate, regarding each district, the number of teachers, pupils, and buildings in which schools were carried on. The figures given hold generally for about the first five years.

During the years from 1922 to 1933 the towns and districts remained the same. However, the tendency at work everywhere was bringing changes here in the union.

Bedford in these years moved with the tendency, noted everywhere, which led to the closing of one room schools. As the table above shows, there were nine buildings in use up to ten years ago, all but one were the usual one room rural buildings. First a two-room building at the center which brought together pupils from two or three other buildings. Following that, in order to take care of the increasing school population at another section adjourning Manchester, and the two-room building was erected. A

few years later, a third building, a three-room, was erected near the Country Club. These three modern buildings eliminated all the old one-rooms and provided increased school advantages to all.

New Boston, which had eight buildings in use in 1922, has now but one. All of the school population of the town comes to the village. The building, after changes, and remodeling, provides amply and comfortably for all with modern conveniences. The chief advantage, however, is in the educational opportunity, in providing in so far as is possible, equal privilege for all. There are three elementary groups, Primary grades, one to three; Intermediate, four to six; Junior High, grades seven to eight; and Senior High School.

In the Goffstown Town District, three one-room buildings were in use twelve years ago. Since that time, one has been closed in the East par tof the town. Two one-room buildings are still in use, each having more than twenty pupils.

During the school years 1932-1933 and 1933-1934, it became necessary for the State Department of Education to re-group the various towns in the State in order to decrease the number of supervisory unions. This meant that a number of the remaining ones had to be made larger. In this period of change, Bedford was taken from the Goffstown Union and annexed to that composed of Hudson, Merrimack, Litchfield, and Pelham.

In place of Bedford, Weare, which had previously been with Hopkinton, Henniker, and Dunbarton, was assigned to Union 19. This kept the number of towns and districts the same, three towns, and four districts; but increased the total number of teachers by eight, increased the number of buildings by seven; increased somewhat the number of pupils, increased by many miles the travel required.

The following year, 1933-1934, when further reorganization was imperative, Dunbarton was added to Union 19 in-

creasing teachers by four and adding about 80 pupils and three buildings. At the same time Bow was assigned to this Union, adding seven teachers, five buildings, and about 150 pupils. So that during the current year the Union is made up of five towns and six school districts.

The table below, similar to one used previously, gives corresponding data for the Union as it is at present.

The demands upon a superintendent are continuous and varied. The major portion of his time is required for supervision and inspection of schools. This can only be done by being where the work is going on, namely, in the school rooms.

The selection of teachers, the general supervision of their plan and work is a part of the whole plan. Observation of procedures, may give rise to questions, a suggestion as to plan, purpose, or method or material. In this state a superintendent's "job" isn't a swivel chair and desk matter. He must of necessity be in the schools.

Each of the fifty superintendents of the State send to the

State office a monthly report of the supervision. The summaries of these individual reports indicates that in this particular this supervisory union ranks well up in the number of these monthly calls. The following figures do not include the cities of Manchester, Concord, or Nashua, but do include the other 47 unions reporting each month.

During the current school year up to February 1, 1935, these school "calls" are as follows:

The examination, selection and purchase of all books, text books or reference, equipment, the determination of the amount and purchase of the supplies needed in the union, and the distribution of books and supplies, must be taken care of. Books purchased are decided upon by examination, securing judgment of teachers regarding them, consulting other superintendents, as to the best for various subjects. In all cases this purchasing is in the hands of the superintendent. It is assumed, if he knows his business, his judgment will not go far wrong, as he should be familiar with the best current books.

Supplies are usually "lumped" into one total amount. This secures a better price, at the outset, and also reduces transportation charges.

There are six meetings of School Boards each month, sometimes more, seldom less. In one recent month there were nine school board meetings. There is considerable time needed for clerical work, reports and for the securing of information for teachers and boards.

In the Union now are three Senior high schools, Goffstown, Weare and New Boston. New Boston and Weare provide agricultural courses along with the usual ones. Weare also is giving Home Economics for girls.

In last year's "Scholarship Day" competition for scholastic honors among the graduating classes from High schools in the state, the two highest places in the English tests came to two schools in this Union. Goffstown tied with Lancaster for first place. Second place, only one point lower, was taken by New Boston. There were nineteen high schools represented in this group competition.

These last few years have seen marked changes in New Boston schools. The building in the village has had its capacity increased by the addition of two class rooms at modest cost, and rearrangement of the laboratory. Last summer, a rather final change was brought about with a new heating plant and sanitary toilets. Also enlargements in the shop have been possible with the old woodshed, made available for an addition. Because of the small number of pupils at No. 2 school it seemed advisable to close it and bring the pupils to the village. Also No. 13 closed and those pupils likewise are brought in. So now all of New Boston school pupils are together in one modernized building, with ample room, heat, convenient and sanitary. While these are great gains the best gain lies in the fact that all now have the best the town offers. With scattered buildings and small isolated groups equal privileges cannot be offered. The educational gain by this plan may not be so obvious as the improvement of the building is. But the gain is there and more fundamental. The report of the School Board concerning last summer's work will certainly indicate with what care and judgment they put into effect. the vote of last school meeting regarding building improve-

As is customary in New Boston, clubs and groups have again contributed, in affairs of school, in the provision for the lawn which will improve so materially the appearance of the school corner, have enabled the school nurse to conduct a dental clinic and do the remedial work.

In closing, I wish to extend again to all individuals and

clubs and organization, and to the members of the School Board and teachers, my hearty appreciation for their cooperation.

### REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

Before submitting my annual report for the year 1933-1934, I wish to thank the Superintendent, members of the School Board, the teachers and the different organizations for their interest and kind co-operation in the health work of our schools, especially those who helped finance and make our dental clinic possible last September.

A dental clinic was held September 19 and 20 and October 4 and 25, 1934, 43 received complete care.

Toxoid clinic November 23, 1934. 21 school children received the treatment.

The correction of physical defects has always been a source of concern to our school physicians and school nurses. There are many homes where the family income cannot be stretched to include extra attention to school children who have defective teeth, tonsils, eyes, etc. The Child Health Recovery Program was made possible July the first, through an allotment of Federal funds to the New Hampshire Relief Administration for the purpose of providing treatment for needy children suffering from these defects.

Hot lunches were provided in many of the rural schools also milk and cod liver oil.

It might be interesting to know that through the Relief

and other sources this Union consisting of Goffstown Village, Goffstown Town School District, Bedford, Weare and Dunbarton, that 71 defective vision cases have been corrected, 57 have had their tonsils removed and 475 have received complete dental care through the seven dental clinics we have held since June, 1934.

A toxoid clinic has been given in three towns since the last report.

## REPORT OF BUILDING COMMITTEE ON HEAT-ING AND TOILET SYSTEMS AT SCHOOL HOUSE NO. 8

At the annual meeting of the School District of New Boston, March 13, 1934, the District voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00, to be used to install a heating plant and a water toilet system in the village school building.

They also elected a Building Committee of two—consisting of Mrs. E. H. Wason and Fred H. Cann, to act in conjunction with the School Board in expending same. This Committee was able to secure State aid from the New Hampshire C. W. A. and E. R. A. in excavating for the basement, septic tank and drainage ditches and began on the same the last part of March. This work was carried on during the spring and summer, together with that of purchasing and installing the heating plant and toilet system, and with other improvements to the building, was completed about September 1st, in season for the opening of the school, September 4th, 1934.
