

Go the Inhabitants of the Town of New Castle qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

FIRST. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

SECOND. To choose all necessary town officers and agents for the year ensuing.

THIRD. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools for the year ensuing.

FOURTH. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the poor the year ensuing.

FIFTH. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges for the year ensuing.

year ensuing. SIXTH. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for contingent expenses for the year ensuing.

SEVENTH. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the money necessary to pay the interest on town bonds the year ensuing.

EIGHTH. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to the commission of the Collector of Taxes the year ensuing.

NINTH. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money on the credit of the town at a rate not to exceed six per cent.

TENTH. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the public library for the year ensuing.

ELEVENTH. To see if the town will allow a discount on taxes paid within a limited time.

TWELFTH. To see what action, if any, the town will vote to take in the matter of transfering its rights in Ocean street and along the beach against the property of the heirs of A. N. Osgood to the United States, in case it should be determined by the United States government that the land bounded by land of Hackett and Rand on the south, Wentworth avenue on the northwest and said Ocean street and said beach on the east and southeast, necessary as an addition to the present military reservation at Fort Constitution.

THIRTEENTH. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
