THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Pittsburg in the county of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Pittsburg on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next, at Ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget and raise money for the same.
2. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of Taxes.
3. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue that portion of the road, known as the Covill Road, from the Harlan Cross buildings so-called, to the site of the old Covill buildings when and if the Owner or Owners of the Old Covill place provide a wagon trail to Round Pond satisfactory to the Town.
4. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue that portion of road from the Old Bridge site at Indian Stream to the Tabor Road so-called.
5. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue that portion of road from the Old Bridge site at Indian Stream to the now used State Highway.
6. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue that portion of road from the now used State High-

way to the old bridge site in Pittsburg Village on Mill Street.

7. To see if the Town will vote to buy two hundred feet of Lake frontage on Back Lake, to be leased to the New Hampshire Guides Association, Inc., and appropriate money for same.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for the purpose of cutting out the Town Line.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) to be laid out on what is known as the Danforth Road starting at the top of the hill and going to Grant Covill's.
10. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.
11. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Superintendent's Report

To the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of the Pittsburgh School District:

FOREWARD

This report is being made at a time when the world is engaged in a great struggle between the democracies and the totalitarian states in which the avowed purpose of the totalitarian governments is the complete annihilation of democracy and the democratic way of life.

We need not review the international situation leading to the bold attack upon the United States. Our nation is arming to defend itself.

America must be strong—strong to meet the thrust against her way of life from armed aggressors; strong to solve her own domestic problems by peaceful democratic means. To the building of a stronger America the schools of the Nation are dedicated. By patient processes of instruction and training they seek to develop in the youth of the land those essential knowledges and skills and that devotion to our democratic way of life which make for national strength and unity.

In this time of crisis the North Country stands ready—ready to give of its youth and resources and ready to do its part in training boys and girls to preserve for the world at least one nation where freedom and liberty for mankind survive.

Health

Now, more than ever, due to war conditions and the impending food rationing, nutrition is all important to adults and children. Especially to children as their growth and development is so dependent upon

well balanced meals. A child in good physical condition is less likely to develop defects than the one that is undernourished. The N. H. State board of Health offers pamphlets on nutrition, planning well balanced meals, food purchases and the amounts and varieties needed for a family. These pamphlets are very helpful and free for the asking.

During the early summer the State Department of Child Health will sponsor an infant and preschool clinic. Parents are urged to bring their children for a thorough examination and Diphtheria Toxoid, if desired. This clinic is given free of charge and parents should avail themselves of this opportunity. Physical defects occurring in early life can be detected and corrected before the child reaches school age.

Teachers

During the past year there were but two changes in the teaching personnel of the district. Arthur Danielson, Bates, with previous teaching experience at Mexico and Ipswich was selected as the new Head master. Priscilla Lane, Mass. State, was elected to fill the French and English vacancy. Both vacancies were in the High School.

Buildings and Equipment

The buildings are for the most part in good condition. The biggest single improvement was the installation of new light fixtures throughout the Village building. A new lathe, motor, and electric grinder were added to the M. T. Room. An electric stove and refrigerator were installed in the D. A. Room. The village building was redecorated below the dado. A new radiator was procured for the Danforth furnace.

All desks were varnished, broken glass replaced, floors oiled, composition boards reslated, and numerous other minor repairs and improvements made.

Enrollment and Attendance

The total district enrollment is 155 as compared with 177 and 168 for the two previous years. The largest single drop is in the Danforth Primary, from 27 a year ago to 13. There are four from Pittsburg attending school at West Stewartstown and one at Canaan. In the High School we have twelve from Clarksville and one from Stewartstown.

The series of epidemics is directly reflected in our percentages of attendance, without exception the lowest in years. The High School made the best record with 95.05 which is far below the 97 considered worthy of commendation. On the other hand, the tardiness record was very good, there being but 124 cases for the entire school year. The best records were made by the Danforth Intermediate and Village Intermediate with 6 and 5 respectively.

Notes on the Budget

The school board's total budget for 1942-43 is \$20,359.00 as compared with \$19,627.50 for last year. It seems certain that expenses will be higher but the board's budget reflects a very modest increase of less than a 4 per cent over the figures for March 1941.

The budget is reduced by an estimated income of \$600.00 so that the requested appropriation is \$19,859.00. This is \$631.50 more than the appropriation for the school year 1941-42.

Conclusion

It is always gratifying to note the regard that individual citizens and local organizations have for their schools. Your interest in the well being of the entire school system, your support and your cooperation are most cheering.

I take this opportunity to again express my appreciation to the members of the school board, parents, teachers and friends for the interest and support they have given to the schools during the past year.
