SEAL To the inhabitants of the Town of Shelburne, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Shelburne on Tuesday the eighth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
- 3. To hear the report of town officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 4. To hear the report of the budget committee and act thereon.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of town highways and bridges.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid construction of highways.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the library.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.
- 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care and repair of town buildings.
- 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for relief.
- 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the cost of fire equipment.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$57.00, based on a 1-100 of 1% of assessed valuation, to be paid as its share of the expense of carrying on an advertising and other beneficial program for the section of the state known as the White Mountains Region, of which this town is a part, in cooperation with the State of New Hampshire and other towns in said region, to be paid by the Board of Select-

men to the Treasurer of the White Mountains Region.

- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the celebration of the anniversary of the ratification of the federal constitution by the state, June 21, 1938, said sum to be expended under the direction of the Selectmen.
- 14. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 15. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking inventory.
- 16. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds.
- 17. To bring in your votes for a delegate to the Constitutional Convention.
- 18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

To the School Board and Citizens of Shelburne:

Your school at the present time has an enrollment of 32 pupils with four pupils in the Eighth Grade.

The work this year is proceeding in a satisfactory manner and as shown by visits of inspection and by the use of standardized tests, pupils are progressing in accordance with their respective grades and abilities.

Last June, eight pupils finished work of the Eighth Grade and were graduated with appropriate exercises.

These pupils are now continuing with their education at Gorham High School. In all there are now sixteen pupils registered in High School at Gorham, and there will probably be a few more next year.
