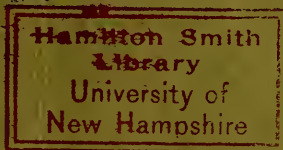

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Stewartstown on Tuesday the eighth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

1. To choose by ballot and major vote the following Town Officers:

- (a) Town Clerk.
- (b) Selectmen for the three years ensuing.
- (c) Treasurer.
- (d) Five Road Agents.
- (e) One or more Constables.
- (f) One or more Sextons.
- (g) Collector of the Diamond Pond rent.
- (h) Overseer of the Poor.
- (i) Trustee of the Trust Fund.
- (j) One Library Trustee for the three years ensuing.

2. To choose by ballot and major vote all other necessary Town Officers.

3. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget as submitted by the Selectmen.

If not to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year, as follows:

- (a) Town Officers' Salaries.
- (b) Town Officers Expenses.
- (c) Election and Registration.
- (d) Municipal Court.
- (e) Town Hall Expenses.
- (f) Damages and Legal Expenses.
- (g) Health Department.
- (h) Vital Statistics.
- (i) Interest on Loans.
- (j) State Tax.
- (k) County Tax.

4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Poor.

5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Libraries.

6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the care of Cemeteries.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise seven hundred twenty, (\$720.00) dollars for Street Lighting.

8. To see what sum of money, if any, the Town will vote to raise, in addition to that required by law, for Town Road Maintenance.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Winter Roads.

10. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the Maintenance of Highways and Bridges as follows:

(a) State Aid Maintenance

(b) Trunk Line Maintenance

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the following departments:

(a) Police Department.

(b) Fire Department.

(c) Sewer Maintenance.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay on Long Term Notes.

13. To see if the Town will vote to accept Highway State Aid.

14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of the municipal year and pay debts out of the tax money when it is received.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Stewartstown:

Some outstanding features of our schools this year are larger and better per cent of attendance, better school achievement, better transportation.

The schools at West Stewartstown have been considerably crowded at times which has necessitated new seating arrangements, new grade arrangements in the school rooms, more books and more supplies.

Several families have kept their children in school better than last year and their improved attendance is a distinct and evident benefit to these children.

In the east side schools the attendance in the majority of schools has also been excellent, but it would be much improved if two or three families felt more keenly their duty to keep their children in school each and every day. Good habits of punctuality and attendance are strongly conducive to good health both of mind and body. Any person who as parent or guardian allows a child to remain away from school, when the school is in session, is not only breaking the law and subjecting himself to the penalty of the law, but he is taking away from his child one of his greatest rights; namely, the right to advancement in school life from early years, which are the most important years of any person's life, for in those years habits of thinking and of doing are inculcated in children which usually last to the end of life. Children cannot make the customary advance if they are out of school any appreciable amount of time.

We respectfully ask all parents to keep children in school every day if possible, also to interest themselves in ascertaining how well they are doing their work at school, also whether the children are interfering or being interfered with to and from school.

It has been the policy of the School Board and of the Superintendent during the past year to equip our schools rather better than usual with the necessary modern text books to keep up to the various grades of school work according to the course of study as outlined for the public schools. New geographies, his-

tories, civics, arithmetics, readers, spellers, manuals and work books have been purchased to take the place of worn out or obsolete texts. It stimulates and interests pupils and teachers to have new texts. Many cases of valuable books for reading and information have also been obtained from the Public Library Commission at Concord. These books are furnished all schools for the nominal expense of express one way.

Transportation

The school law states that transportation shall be furnished to pupils living over two miles distant from school or more than one mile distance from a regular bus line of school transportation.

Those families living a less distance away are to furnish their own transportation. We feel that the new bus transportation installed by Mr. George Weeks on the Riverside route has been very comfortable and satisfactory. It has also saved tuition across the river and is economical in itself.

All those engaged in the management of the Stewartstown schools; School Board, Teachers, and Superintendent have striven for the benefit of the pupils in their charge.

To all those who by word or deed have helped a boy or girl or teacher or the rest of us to attain a good objective along the way to an education and a better and brighter outlook in life, we express our thanks.
