TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

[L. S.]

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Strafford in the County of Strafford in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Strafford on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following ", subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the support of the poor including Old Age Assistance.

4. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.

5. To see if the town will accept State Aid for the construction of Class 2 road and raise and appropriate the sum or (\$921) for said purpose; or will accept State Aid for the construction of Class 5 road and raise and appropriate for said purpose the sum of (\$754.16). 6. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

 \sim 7. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to issue serial notes or bonds to an amount not exceeding (\$19,000), nineteen thousand dollars for the purpose of refunding outstanding indebtedness of a like amount.

V8. To see if the town will vote to appropriate and raise the sum of (\$200) to purchase snow fence.

 $\sqrt{9}$. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of (\$150) to fix up sheds and make minor repairs to town hall.

p10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of (\$150) for cement culverts.

 $\sqrt{11}$. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of (\$150) for street lighting.

 $\sqrt{12}$. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of (\$200) for white pine blister rust control, to be spent in cooperation with the State Forestry Department and Recreation Department.

 $\sqrt{13}$. To see if the town will vote to change from the surveyor system to the road agent system of highway maintenance and elect three road agents for same.

14. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Strafford qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 9th day of March 1937, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.

2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.

6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant.

8. To see if the district will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the district, as determined by the School Board in its annual report. 9. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the salary of a special music teacher, in connection with other neighboring districts.

10. To see if the District will vote to build a new centralized school building to cost not over twenty five thousand dollars, (\$25,000) and to choose 3 persons to act with the School Board as a Building Committee, and to authorize application for Federal Aid, and to authorize the issue of bonds to the amount of not over Fourteen thousand dollars (\$14,000) and to take any other action relating hereto.

11. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate in order to meet expenses connected with the new building project.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

To the School Board and Citizens of Strafford:

This year has been marked by several noteworthy celebrations of outstanding persons and events in the history of education in this country.

The Tercentenary of Harvard University commemorated the founding of that institution, described in "New England's First Fruits," published 300 years ago: "After God had carried us safe to New England and we had builded our houses, provided necessaries for our liveli-hood, rear'd convenient places for God's worship and settled the Civil Government, one of the next things we longed for, and looked after was to advance *Learning* and perpetuate it to posterity...."

HORACE MANN (1796-1859) one hundred years ago gave up his career as a lawyer and his presidency of the Massachusetts Senate to serve for twelve years as the first Secretary of the State Board of Education of that Commonwealth. His tireless advocacy of the free common schools earned him the title of "Father of Public School Education." He founded the first Normal School in America and crowned his life by serving as President of Antioch College in Ohio. Among his immortal sayings are the following:

"The common school is the greatest discovery made by man."

"A patriot is known by the interest he takes in the education of the young." "Be ashamed to die until you have won some victory for humanity."

WILLIAM HOLMES McGUFFEY, whose centennial is being observed, through his famous "Readers," taught previous generations to read and guided to ideals that are still potent. By the truly scientific method of trying out his selections on actual groups of boys and girls, he laid a solid foundation for a long popularity with children and educators. Some citizens of Strafford who read this will remember with pleasure "The Lame Dog," "The Birds Set Free," "Harry and the Guidepost," "Meddlesome Matty," and others. Abiography and a book of selections have recently been published.

Citizens of Strafford and neighboring towns are beginning to consider more and more seriously the improvement in school advantages that might come from a consolidation of grades by means of a centralized building or some rearrangement using present buildings. The one-room school of eight grades with as high as 36 pupils is becoming less and less acceptable as a permanent organization in our rural communities. Meanwhile standard schools are being maintained, with instruction, health supervision, and other activities faithfully carried on. Electric lights have now been installed in all three schoolhouses, saving eyesight and making possible more continuous and efficient work, especially in cloudy weather or during the short days.

The percentage of attendance at Austin-Cate Academy last year was 98.89, the highest in Union 44. In the "Future

Farmers of America" original prize speaking contest vocational school in the state, Orson Lowell won first place and a gold medal for his essay on "The New Hampshire."
