REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

The school board of the town of Surry would respectfully present the following report:

By act of the legislature, the school year closes with the summer term, and our report to the State superintendent has to be made in August instead of February. So frequent changes in our school laws may be of benefit to the cause of education, but to our understanding, it only multiplies the duties of school officers. What good can result from having this report made in August instead of the time of our other annual reports is not visible to the naked eye.

The teachers have labored hard for the success of the schools, and have given general satisfaction. We think the past year has been a prosperous one for the schools, and that good improvement has been made, although the discipline in some is not quite what it should be. The parents should co-operate with the board and teachers that they may be able to raise the standard and make the schools more successful.
