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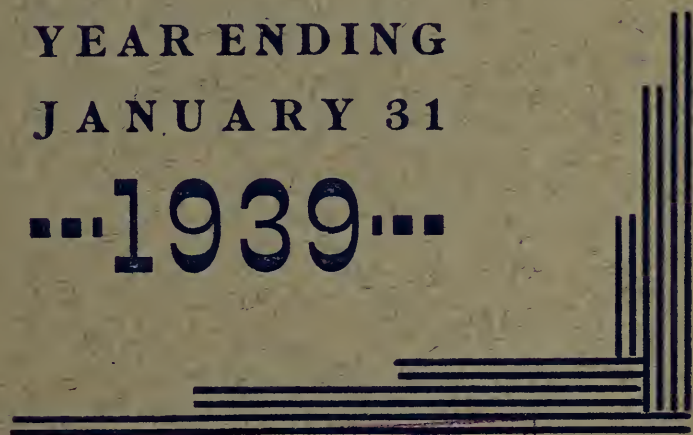

Warrant for the Annual Town Meeting,

March 14, 1939

The State of New Hampshire

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of
[L. S.] Tuftonboro in the County of Carroll
in said State, qualified to vote in
Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Tuftonboro, on Tuesday, the fourteenth (14th) day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. (\$9,431.50 figures of Budget Committee.)

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred and twenty - nine dollars (\$129.) for the Lakes Region Association.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three dollars, the State to raise one thousand nine hundred and thirty - three dollars (\$1,933.), for State Aid Construction on the Ledge Hill Road.

5. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Fire Department as now organized, this organization being in accord with the vote of the adjourned meeting of April 1938, such acceptance being recognition of the present organization as the official Tuftonboro Fire Department.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of eleven hundred and eighty dollars (\$1,180.) for Fire Department purposes, this sum to be paid over to the Treasurer of the Fire Department by the Selectmen.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of forty five hundred dollars (\$4,500.) for tarring the following roads: Tuftonboro Neck, Wawbeek, Union Wharf, Ledge Hill, High Street and the New Road; the balance to be expended for improving the Union Wharf Road, High Street and the New Road.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty five dollars (\$25.) for the purchase of Forest Fire Tools, the State to raise an equal amount.

9. To see if the Town will vote to grant a discount on taxes paid in full before a date to be determined by the Town.

10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes of the levy of 1939.

11. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
