TOWN WARRANT
THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Wakefield in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Wakefield Town Hall in said Sanbornville on Tuesday, the fifth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

You are hereby notified to meet in the Town Hall in said Wakefield on Saturday, the twenty-third day of March, next, at seven of the clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

2. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to pay Town bills in anticipation of taxes.

3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to enter into a contract to obtain tax maps of the Town and to commit the sum of \$40,000.00 of the Revenue Sharing money for that purpose. (Approved by Budget Committee)

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to enter into a contract to have the Town reassessed and to commit \$40,000.00 of the Revenue Sharing money for that purpose. (Approved by Budget Committee)

5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell at public auction a certain parcel or parcels of land received by Tax Collector's Deed. (Land formerly owned by Mrs. A. H. Small (Jenelle L. Small)) (Approved by Budget Committee)

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,300.00 to finish the rebuilt portion of the Dearborn Road. (Approved by Budget Committee.)

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the

sum of \$1,200.00 to finish the rebuilt portion of Rhines Road.
(Approved by Budget Committee)

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to rebuild and finish the Sanborn Road from the State of Maine line to Route 153, approximately 3/10ths of a mile.
(Approved by Budget Committee)

9. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to establish an assessment policy for property subdivided for the purpose of developing tracts of land consisting of ten (10) lots or more in the original subdivision.

10. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the State of New Hampshire pay scale for town employees. (Submitted by petition of 15 voters) (Disapproved by Budget Committee)

11. To see if the Town of Wakefield will vote to elect by ballot a permanent police officer for full-time duty in the Town in the position of Chief of Police at the next succeeding annual meeting of the Town: said permanent Chief of Police to continue to hold such office during good behavior, unless sooner removed for cause by the Selectmen, after notice and hearing, or unless the Town shall vote to rescind its action herein proposed establishing the permanent police officer, all pursuant to RSA 41:47 and 41:48. (Submitted by petition of 16 voters.)

12. To see what action the Town will vote to take on the petition to have the Selectmen "lay out, and bring before the town meeting in March, 1974, a portion of the Lord Road bordering Pine River Pond, at a point beginning at the mail boxes at the Ballad Ridge Rd., so called, to a point beyond Wentworth Cove, a distance of approximately one and six-tenths miles. This road to be accepted and hence forth be officially known as the Lord Road.

The Wm. Lord Co. will deed a 50' foot right-of-way to the town for said road." (Submitted by petition of 11 voters) (Disapproved by Budget Committee)

13. To see if the Town will vote to accept as Class V Highways the following roads located in Forest Hills, so called:

Forest Drive

Keating Drive	460 feet
Dulko Circle	1120 feet
Martin Lane	690 feet
Great East Lane	1850 feet
Shady Lane	300 feet

14. TO SEE IF THE TOWN WILL VOTE TO ELECT A BOARD OF ASSESSORS OF THREE MEMBERS, IN ACCORDANCE WITH R.S.A. 135:2 APPROVED MAY 14, 1973: EFFECTIVE DATE JULY 13, 1973. (Submitted by petition of 30 voters)

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to be used by the Two Hundredth Anniversary Committee. (Approved by Budget Committee)

16. To hear reports of committees and take appropriate action thereon.

17. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for partial participation to the Lakes Region Association, this money to be spent for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural resources and advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other towns in the Lakes Region. (Approved by Budget Committee)

18. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to accept gifts and/or Federal & State Aid in the name of the Town of Wakefield. (Approved by Budget Committee)

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$305,349.00 to defray Town charges as submitted by the Budget Committee.

GAFNEY LIBRARY, INC.

1973 saw many changes at Gafney Library. In January Mrs. Barbara Winton joined the staff as a volunteer and in March was officially voted Asst. Librarian. Mrs. Hazel MacBrien suffered a heart attack Jan. 20th and Mrs. Winton served as Acting Librarian actively assisted by Trustee Mr. Alden Young. Mrs. MacBrien returned to work the end of April but only on a part time basis. Mr. Young assisted Mrs. Winton Tuesdays and Thursdays when the library opens at 1 P.M. for classes from Paul School, and he did the night sessions until Sept.

One of the State Library rulings for Affiliated libraries is the stipulation that evening hours be at least two hours in length. As of Sept. 1, Gafney Library changed its evening hours to 6:30 P.M. thru 8:30 P.M. on Tuesday and Thursday, with no evening hours on Saturday. Mrs. Winton took over the evening sessions at that time.

Throughout the years, several girls have donated their services to the library on Saturdays and vacations. During the past few years, Miss Jeanne Nason and Miss Deborah Brown have quietly helped their librarian and their community in this way.

Another State Library ruling, states that librarians must take a

series of eight courses in library techniques. Mrs. Winton took two courses in a two weeks crash session at U.N.H. during the summer. The approximate cost was over \$200.00. Friends of Wakefield Libraries had a balance of \$153.00 which they donated to Gafney Library for this purpose. Mrs. Winton must take two courses each summer for the next three years to become an accredited librarian.

The benefits of affiliation are clearly apparent. We have borrowed over 3500 additional books thru the bookmobile. Also available are the resources of the State Library and its Affiliates on an Inter-Library Loan basis. Gafney has filled 163 special requests in 1973 using this valuable service.

Public Buildings are now required to have hot water, so a small electric water heater was purchased and installation was made free of charge by Richard Swinerton. The carpeting was installed at the entrance by Shea & Son. The library ceiling was insulated by Al Mills and he is presently refinishing and painting the interior of the library.

Vital statistics show that our book circulation continues to increase, with a total this past year of 20,847, and we have added 72 new borrowers to our file of satisfied patrons. We now have over 10,150 books and shelving is an ever present problem. "Weeding" is a constant necessity as are additional bookcases and mobile steel carts.

At the Annual Meeting, held in September, the Following Officers were re-elected: President, Mr. Arthur S. Burleigh, Vice President, Mr. Morace F. Richter, Secretary, Mrs. Hazel MacBrien, Treasurer, Mr. Alden N. Young, Directors, Mrs. Adelaide Hughes and Rev. Allen W. Clark. Mr. Samuel Paul also serves on the Board as the elected Representative of the town.

The personnel and patients at Carroll County Home are serviced weekly by Trustee Mr. Alden Young, assisted by Mr. Walter Wentworth. Books are selected by the librarians periodically for the third and fourth grades at Union School and delivery is made by Mr. Young.

We hope you will give us the pleasure of serving you during 1974.

N., Mrs. Betty Freeman, Physio-Therapist, and Mrs. Joan DeCelle, occupational Therapist, are part time employees. More full time help is needed, but due to lack of funds this is impossible.

The total number of nursing visits during the year were 2,635 and 316 by our physio-therapist.

HISTORY OF THE SANBORNVILLE WATER DISTRICT

The Sanbornville Water District was formed in August 1938. The boundaries of the district at that time started with the erection of a well house adjacent to the residence of Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence Nason; running to the Brookfield town line in a westerly direction; thence from the Nason residence followed Route 16 to Rines Road, taking in St. Anthony's Cemetery and thence running south on Rines Road to the farm of Walter Thomas. There it terminated. Following Route 109 the system ran to the junction of Routes 109 and 16, crossed Witchtrot Road and terminated at the residence of Arthur and Shirley Flynn. Back to the Jcts. of rts. 109 and 16, the system continued south, turned at the Lovell Lake Road and terminated just before the residence of Mr. and Mrs. Winslow Stringer; the last hydrant in that location.

Back to the Jcts. of Rte. 109 and 16, the system ran up the hill and terminated at the residence of the late William Streater.

All side streets in Sanbornville village were covered, namely, High Street, School and Cedar Streets. Cosmar Drive, Beech, Church and Summer Streets, also Forest, Geary and Burroughs avenues.

At that time there were approximately 65 water users. The district has now grown to over 350 users, with something over \$14,000.00 in charges assessed each year.

1974 will be the second of your Commissioners assessing charges on a semi-annual basis, namely \$20.00 twice a year.

The system needs correction. Many errors were and have been committed by temporary service to certain sections beyond the water bounds. Namely, Rines Road south of Thomas; Witchtrot Road East of the Flynn property. That portion served east of the Stringer property. One service north of the Streeter property, all of Forest Hills new development and the new well located in the town of Brookfield together with five takers in that town.

The Commissioners respectfully request the town authorities assist in correcting these inequities.

Joseph E. Soucy of Rines Road deserves the praise of the entire Town. Joe has been caretaker of the pumping stations since the inception of the system. It is Joe's duty to see that pressure is attained at all times, this he does religiously. During his absence this winter Vinton "Skinny" Miliner has ably attended this important chore. We salute both these fine gentlemen.

In Summation: The District is growing rapidly. Of importance is the fact, water meters MUST be installed, as it is unfair for persons, particularly retired men and women, living on fixed incomes to pay a flat \$40.00 per year versus those households with large families. It is also imperative that the stand pipe be emptied, cleaned and repainted.

SCHOOL WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of WAKEFIELD qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 16th day of March, 1974, at 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

To see if the District will raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred sixty three thousand seven hundred sixty three dollars (\$263,763.00) for the construction of an eight room addition to the Paul School and whether the district will vote to authorize the issue of serial notes or bonds upon the credit of the district for all or any portion of the sum so raised and appropriated; and to authorize the school board to determine the terms and conditions upon which the notes shall be issued, including their sale, the time and place of payment of the principal and in accordance with the municipal finance act, N. H. Rev. Laws, Chapter 33 and any amendments relating thereto. (Recommended by Budget Committee)

2. To see if the district will raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred twenty seven thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$227,340.00) for the construction of a combination auditorium-gymnasium on to the Paul School. (Disapproved by Budget Committee.)

3. To see if the district will vote to continue the present building committee, if Article 1. is adopted, to supervise the construction of said addition, provided that the plans and specifications for the addition shall be approved by the School Board acting as required by law and the School Board be further authorized to execute any and all contracts or agreements in connection with the construction of said addition.

4. To determine and appoint the salaries of the school board and truant officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.

5. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

6. To choose agents and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

7. To see whether the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the purpose of hiring professional educational consultants to determine the feasibility of creating a new school district and/or the most economical and efficient method for the education of the children of this town.

8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district.

9. To see if the district will authorize the school board to make application for and to receive, in the name of the district, such advances, grants-in-aid or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government and/or state agencies.

10. To see if the district will vote pursuant to RSA 31:105 to provide indemnification for district employees, school administrators, school board members, district officers or agents from personal loss or expense including reasonable legal fees and costs, if any, arising out of any claim, demand, suit or judgement by reason of negligence or other act resulting in accidental injury to a person or accidental damage to property providing the indemnified person was at the time of the accident acting within the scope of his employment or office.

11. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

The greatest problem that continues to plague the Wakefield educational system, as indicated in the above figures, is the lack of classroom space. Never was this more apparent than this year when 39 first grade pupils had to be crowded into one classroom. According to the 1973 census and kindergarten reports, the same situation will occur in the 1974-75 school year and the year following.

It is pleasing to report that only one teacher had to be replaced this past year. When large turnovers of teaching personnel are eliminated, the continuity in curriculum is maintained and the number of school problems that arise seem to be minimized. An additional teacher was hired because of the large 1st grade enrollment.

Another matter of importance to the voters of the district is the possible effect of recent legislation on the operations of the district. To this end, a brief review of new laws and changes which are of significance is presented.

Legislation having to do with handicapped children. The school district has been made responsible for the education of handicapped children from the time of birth until these children reach the age of twenty-one. Previously, it was responsible only after the child reached age five. The tuition liability for these children is limited to the state average cost, although current advice indicates that the district may pay more should it wish to

do so. Districts are liable for transportation when a handicapped child reaches age four. Since handicapped children are learning disabled to a greater or less degree, the statutes now permit the employment by districts of learning disabilities teachers, the certification requirements of these teachers having been established by the State Board of Education. Another handicap which has been much in the news is that of children with kidney disease. A law has been passed to make the state responsible for the payment for the care and treatment of children with end stage kidney disease.

Legislation which has an effect on school finances in general. A number of districts in the state have reconsidered rejected bond issues immediately upon their defeat. This is no longer possible because at least seven days must elapse before a vote of reconsideration may be taken, and notice of the reconsideration must be published in a newspaper at least two days before the new vote. Each school, if it does not already, must make a lunch or breakfast available for pupils. No waiver beyond September 30, 1979 will be granted. This could cost money for equipment or facilities, as well as labor. Even though the dual enrollment program has been pretty well defeated by court actions, the child benefit program has not been ruled out, and a number of new benefits, such as driver education programs, educational television, lunch programs, have been made eligible. In order to place the sweepstakes program on a fiscal year, rather than a calendar year basis, sweepstakes benefits will be paid in September, instead of December. The first year of this operation will reduce the payment by one third, as a result as only eight months, not twelve, will have elapsed. If a foster child is placed by a state agency in a district other than the child's original home, the new district will receive a sum of money, presently \$200.00, toward the payment for the child's education. When students attend a vocational program in an AREA vocational high school, such as Dover Vocational, which is not the usual high school for the district, districts which do not maintain high schools will be responsible for tuition up to the amount the high school of regular attendance, or the state average cost, whichever is higher. In the past, districts which tuitioned high school students to other districts have been responsible for tuition only up to the state average cost. Under the new law, districts must be responsible for whatever the receiving public high school charges, unless there is a contract calling for a different payment. The state average for

high schools this year is \$931.00, but some high schools in the state charge as much as \$1,200.00 for tuition, the difference being the responsibility of the parents.

Additional programs which the schools must provide. The legislature added two more programs which school districts must include in the school curriculum. One is a mandate to provide instruction in the venereal diseases, which have become epidemic in New Hampshire, and the other is to provide instruction in nutrition education to be incorporated in the regular course of instruction.

Legislation effecting the operations of school boards and districts. Under the "right to know" law, any official who refuses a citizen access to a public document is personally liable for attorney's fees if a court order supports the citizen. School districts may adopt the absentee ballot when the Australian ballot is in use in that district, but if adopted, candidates must file at least thirty days before the election. This requires an article in the warrant. Immunity from civil suit has been granted to school board members for action taken in a legal school board meeting. A school district may vote at a district meeting to indemnify any official employed by it while acting in his/her official capacity for loss or damages resulting to them personally. The District shall indemnify its employees and officers acting in their official capacities when a suit involving civil rights is involved. The district may purchase insurance to cover its expenses in the actions mentioned above. There must be a warrant article to cover this expense if the district decides to purchase insurance.

There were, of course, other actions taken by the legislature, some of which effect all districts, and some of which effected particular districts, but, it appears that those of general interest have been summarized above.

In closing, we would like to express our appreciation for the cooperation we have received from the citizens, the school board members, the pupils, and the staff.

REPORT OF THE PRINCIPAL

To the School Board, the Superintendent of Schools, and the citizens of the Wakefield School District. I respectfully submit my fourth annual report.

The opening of school on Wednesday, September, 5, 1973 found most of the staff members returning from a busy and informative summer. They were bustling with new and inovative ideas to help in providing a well rounded education for the children. Well over half of the teachers were involved in summer school programs.

This year's professional staff consists of ten regular classroom teachers, part time remedial reading teacher, music teacher, school nurse, and learning disabilities specialist.

We only had one change in our faculty this year. Miss Donna Gofton left for personal reasons. We were most fortunate to replace her with Mrs. Ann Pilkovsky teaching math at the Junior High level. Other additions to our faculty include: Miss Althea Sheaff, teaching in grade one; Miss Cynthia Lourie, grade two aide; Mrs. Kim Hughes, Learning Disabilities and Mrs. Patricia Sylvestro Learning Disabilities aide.

The new social studies series has been instituted in grades two through eight. The teachers and children are most delighted with this new program.

We are presently working on our reading curriculum which at present is a little outdated.

Last Spring we administered achievement and ability tests to all of the elementary children in the District for the first time. The program will be continued for the purpose of measuring and evaluating your child's yearly progress. Learning difficulties, when correctly diagnosed, can be remedied, thus enabling more students to find success in academic achievement.

Congratulations to Mr. Lover and his 1973 baseball team for their 6-1 seasonal record. This was by far the best season for many years.

October of this year brought intramural flag football. The program was once again quite successful with approximately fifty boys participating. Sportsmanship, techniques, and skills were emphasized.

November brought National Education week climaxed by Open House. The program was augmented by a Book Fair sponsored by the fifth grade class. Monies realized from this enterprise will be used for a class project.

There are presently over eighty children enrolled in the ski program. Mr. and Mrs. Edwin Quinn have most generously offered the lessons and the facilities to the Wakefield School children enrolled in this program free of charge.

I would like to take this opportunity to express the school's appreciation to all our friends and the active and involved parents of the school who gave of their time, talents, and interest for the benefit of the children during this past year.

WAKEFIELD SCHOOL DISTRICT HEALTH REPORT 1972-1973

During the 1972-1973 school year I spent a total of 74 days at the Paul and Union Schools. I have continued to work with the local Nursery School, in an attempt to help these children comply with the new State Law requiring immunization and examination of all children prior to their entry into the Public School System.

All children, grades one through eight, had the following tests and measurements: height, weight, hearing, vision and hemoglobin (blood test). All children were given an opportunity of having a urinalysis examination. Any child whose test results were not within normal limits, was referred for further examination and/or treatment.

Physical examinations were performed on students in grades 3, 5 and 7. Dr. Gerard G. Bozuwa examined a total of 67 children. The ten children who were found to have abnormal tonsils, heart murmurs, orthopedic or skin problems were referred for further examination or treatment. First grade students were not included in the program because they are now required, by law, to be examined prior to the start of the school year.

Several children were seen by Mrs. Shirley Ganem for evaluation of their speech. Children requiring speech therapy were seen by her on a regular basis, during school hours.

A total of 207 children participated in the Dental Cleaning and Fluoride Program, which was done by Mrs. Ruth Jones. The Dental Repair portion of the Program was not offered this year as we could not find a dentist who was willing to do this.

This year arrangements were again made for children to attend the local Immunization Clinics. A total of 56 children were involved. During the "Measles Alert" program in the Spring all elementary children, not previously immune to this disease, were immunized. The value of these clinics is evident in the fact that, to my knowledge, there were only two cases of communicable diseases among the school children this year.

With vaccine and equipment supplied by the N. H. Tuberculosis Association all employees of the School System, who had not had recent chest x-rays, were tested for T.B. Volunteers and students of the Nursery School were included in this program. There were no positive reactions.
