THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Warner in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:
(L. S.)

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Warner on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$8,000.00 for summer and winter maintenance of highway.
4. To see if the Town will vote to transfer from its existing surplus, the sum of \$3,000.00 for the purchase of a new truck, plow and wing.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the purpose of publicizing the natural advantages of the Town, in connection with other Towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust in the Town, in cooperation with the State Forestry Department.
7. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the motion passed at the 1933 March meeting in regards to the electing of a Road Agent.
8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to appoint a Road Agent for three year terms.
9. To see if the Town will vote to accept the bequests of a fountain as named in a trust under the will of Ida M. Redington and to authorize the Selectmen to execute and deliver a contract to be made between the Town of Warner and the Trustee under the will of Ida M. Redington by the terms of

which the Town will bind itself to furnish water to said fountain and to keep it in a suitable state of repair as long as the fountain lasts.

10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow money on notes of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

11. To hear reports of Officers of the Town heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

12. To see if the Town will vote to support United States membership in a general system of international cooperation, such as that proposed at the Dumbarton Oaks Conference, having police power to maintain the peace of the world.

13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to have additional street lights installed on Main Street between the Congregational Church and Mill Street.

14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

In the elementary school 360 half day sessions were held, but on account of harvesting and apple picking the high school had only 342. Although it may seem to some that considerable time was lost by high school pupils from actual book study, the contribution which they made to the war effort and the imperative harvesting of food which otherwise would have been lost was essential. The school was commended by county and state authorities for the high quality of the work done by its pupils and the efficient management of the teachers in charge. Following is a tabulation of the work done by pupils and teachers of the high school in the fall of 1944.

Pupils worked in groups on 8 different farms and individually on 20 home farms.

A silver cup was awarded to the school by the New Hampshire Horticultural Society for having the greatest number of man hours per registered pupil in New Hampshire.

At the end of the school year we believe that no pupil will have less knowledge of the subjects studied than he would have had with full time under former conditions.

The total pupil registration and average membership continue to decline as may be noted above. The percent of attendance is low in the elementary grades but good in the high school. The amount of tardiness has decreased. The total number of pupils registered was 195. Of these 39 were tuition pupils in the high school and 12 in the graded school. Two pupils from Warner district attended in Bradford. This makes the total number of pupils residing in the district and attending public schools 146.

On March 27, 1944 an O. S. Y. A. Course in the Production, Conservation and Processing of Food for Family Use was started under the auspices of Simonds High School. This included the planning for garden crops, planting, cultivation, harvesting and preservation of these crops for home

consumption. The building formerly occupied by the Warner Garage was rented for the project. A steam boiler, three large pressure cookers, all the necessary piping, large tables, two evaporators, cooking vat, electric can sealers and other equipment were installed. The tables were built and covered with sheet metal by the boys of the Agricultural Classes. They also cleaned up the building, painted and made many necessary alterations. The plumbing was done by Mr. Fred A. Savory, Mr. Earl H. Little and Mr. Clifford Ellsworth. All the cost of equipment, labor for installation, rent, fuel, labor for supervision, secretarial and janitorial services was borne by the Federal Government.

A three day school of instruction for supervisors of similar projects in Connecticut, New Jersey, New York and New Hampshire was held at the Cannery in June with an attendance of about 30.

During the summer the Canning Center was under the supervision of Mrs. Philip Estey, teacher of Domestic Arts, and Mr. Clifford Ellsworth, teacher of Agriculture at Simonds Free High School. When school opened in September Mrs. Margaret B. Courser became supervisor and will continue to act in that capacity until the close of school in June 1945.

During the summer and fall of 1944 ninety-seven families made use of the Cannery and preserved food products as follows.:

- 2,200 cans fruit
- 4,300 cans vegetables
- 400 cans meat
- 1,100 miscellaneous

These results show that the project was well worth while for this community. The use of the Cannery is free to any citizen of the United States. In view of the continued food shortage and increased needs of our armed forces we expect that the Federal Government will again support the project for next year. We hope that many additional families in Warner and surrounding towns will come to know and make use of the facilities of the Simonds Free High School Canning Center.

On January 8, 1945 an O. S. Y. A. Course in Repair, Maintenance and Construction of Farm Machinery was started in the part of the Warner Garage not occupied by the Cannery. This is under the instruction of Mr. Clifford

Ellsworth. As in the Canning Course, the necessary equipment and cost of instruction, rent, etc., are furnished by the Federal Government. There is no expense to the school or the individual. Some of the equipment received consists of a forge, grinder, acetylene welding outfit, many small tools and material necessary for repairs. Other items will be added as needed. To date about seventeen men have registered for work in this course. It is open to anyone not enrolled in high school.

The year 1944 has been a very busy one for teachers and students at Simonds Free High School. As a result of the cooperation of the Prudential Committee, the headmaster, teachers and pupils in the labor of harvesting and establishing the Cannery and Farm Machinery Repair Course, we feel that a substantial contribution has been made to food production and the war effort. The lessons learned in community planning, the working together for a common purpose for the common good and in harmonizing individual viewpoints are surely as valuable as a week or two of French, Ancient History or even Quadratic Equations.

We wish to thank the School Board, Prudential Committee, teachers, pupils and parents for their continued interest and effort in forwarding the educational interest of the district.

FOREST FIRE WARDEN'S REPORT

HELP THE WAR EFFORT BY PREVENTING FOREST FIRES

No one is exempt from helping to win the war! Everyone, regardless of age, has his or her place in the overall effort! Some men, because of age are called upon to bear arms; man ships, submarines and planes; minister to the injured and maintain morale. Women, in larger numbers, are serving with the armed forces as nurses and members of the several women's military organizations—WACS, WAVES, SPARS, etc. War industry has taken millions of men and women whose accomplishments have been the marvel of the world. Civilians at home are doubling up on their activities because of the shortage in manpower, purchasing bonds, assisting in numerous patriotic undertakings, maintaining home morale and, on the whole, carrying on with a cheerfulness and determination that is typically American. Yet, despite the time, thought and effort we are all putting into the war effort in general, we are, true to our American characteristics, heedless and careless about many important things and one of these is FIRE as it relates to our forests.

Much harm can be done the war effort because of our carelessness with fire. Lumber has gone to war in a BIG WAY! Our New Hampshire forests are contributing their full share insofar as manpower permits. Fire, the greatest enemy of the forests, destroys, during each of these critical years, hundreds of acres of valuable trees that could contribute to the war effort. Forest fires disrupt the war's business by taking men from their important work in industry and on the farm and reduces production of necessary war materials and food. Forest fires require the spending of much money and material that might otherwise be diverted into vital war channels. Forest fires are, for the most part, unnecessary and avoidable for ninety-eight percent of such fires are, annually, the result of human carelessness—yours

and mine. This can and should be remedied—NOW! YOU can HELP THE WAR EFFORT by PREVENTING FOREST FIRES! The rules of the game are simple.

1. *Always* be careful with fire in or near woodlands.
2. Comply with regulations governing the use or starting of fires there. Remember
 - a. You need written permission from your local forest fire warden for debris burning fires when the ground is not covered with snow.
 - b. Be sure your match, cigar, cigarette and pipe ashes are OUT before dropping them.
3. Be fire-minded NOW as never before; be careful; caution others to be careful; be cooperative and thus help your warden, your town, your nation and yourself!
