A STATEMENT

The school census taken last September, 1940, showed 18 pupils in school while in 1939 there were but 13—an increase of five.

Last year an estimate was made as to the amount of State Aid as \$656.00, but, we actually received \$530.34—a loss of \$125.66.

Transportation was figured at \$720 but it is costing us \$1080.00—an increase of \$360.00. This in-

crease cost in transportation is due to the changes made by the State in its requirements for buses used for transporting children. These changes required a new bus because the old one was not large enough to accommodate the children to be transported—19—and to meet the new State regulations.

The tuition pupils last year were 12 and this year 19. This makes an increase in tuition of \$476 for the year. A large part of this is due to a transient family with five school children. There was an unpaid tuition bill for the last half of the year, 1939-1940, of \$408.00. We estimated a net balance last year of \$220.00 but in reality we were in debt \$.70. Therefore, we are asking a special appropriation of \$973.00 to balance our account. Article 8 in the school warrant.

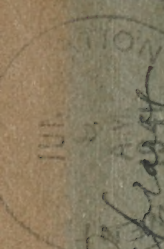
