THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Whitefield, in the County of Coos and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs. You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman to serve for a period of three years, a Town Treasurer, Highway Agent, two Library Trustees, a Trust Fund Trustee, Auditor, and all other necessary town officers.

2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for—

- a. Town officers' salaries.
- b. Town officers' expenses.
- c. Election expenses.
- d. Municipal Court expenses.
- e. Care and repair of town buildings.
- f. Police Department.
- g. Health Department and Vital Statistics.
- h. Sewer maintenance.
- i. Highways and bridges.
 1. Snow removal.
 2. Town maintenance.
 3. Street lighting.
 4. General expense highway dept.
- j. Public library.
- k. Town poor.
- l. Old age assistance.
- m. Memorial Day.
- n. Memorial field.
- o. Soldiers' aid.
- p. Band concerts.
- q. Cemeteries.

- r. Interest.
 - 1. Temporary loans.
 - 2. Town debt.
- s. Sidewalk maintenance.
- t. Payment on principal of town debt.

3. To see if the town will vote to grant to the Woman's Study Club, American Legion and Morrison Hospital Auxiliary, for public purposes, the free use of the town hall.

4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money by temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the town will accept State Aid construction of Class V roads, commonly known as town roads, raise and appropriate for the purpose the sum of \$445.16, and receive from the state \$1,780.65.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for advertising, the same to be expended through the Board of Trade.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate not to exceed the sum of \$1,000 to be paid to the Whitefield Village Fire District for hydrant service for the coming year, for services of the fire company and apparatus in fighting fires outside of said District, but within the limits of the town.

8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to make reasonable contributions in the form of supervision, materials and/or equipment on projects which require the expenditure of Federal funds by Works Progress Administration or any other public body.

9. To see if the town will authorize the Board of Selectmen to purchase a new road machine and appropriate money for same.

10. To see if the town will raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$205, based on 1/100 of 1% of assessed valuation, to be paid as its share of the expense of carrying on an advertising and other beneficial program for the section of the state known as the White Mountains Region, of which this town is a part, in cooperation with the State of New Hampshire and other towns in said region, to be paid by the Board of Selectmen to the treasurer of the White Mountains Region.

11. To see what action the town will take with reference to selling and conveying to several tenant-owners thereof Lot 10 Range 24, known as the Schoolhouse Lot in East Whitefield, or take any other action that seems advisable with reference thereto.

12. To vote for election of delegates at large, alternate delegates at large, and delegates and alternate delegates to the national conventions of the various political parties to be held to nominate party candidates for President and Vice President, of the United States.

13. To see if the town will authorize the Board of Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds, or otherwise.

14. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before the meeting.

Given under our hands and the seal of the town this twenty-sixth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty, and of the Independence of the United States of America the one hundred and sixty-fourth.
