

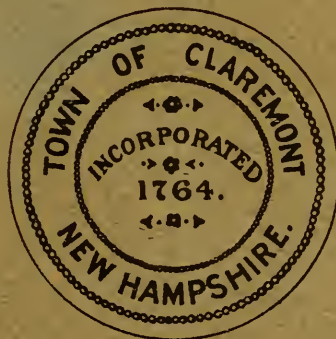

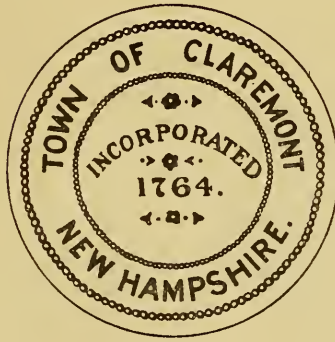

Town Warrant

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(SEAL) To the inhabitants of the Town of Claremont, in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the lower assembly room and the room above said assembly room, both in the Town Hall, in said Town, on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at eight o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
2. To elect one Selectman who shall serve for three years.
3. To elect one Assessor who shall serve for three years.
4. To choose one member of the board of three trustees who have the custody of all the trust funds of the town, to serve three years.
5. To elect one Sewer Commissioner who shall serve for three years.
6. To elect one Water Commissioner who shall serve for three years.
7. To choose a Committee for Stevens High School for the ensuing year.
8. To choose three members of the Board of Trustees of Fiske Free Library to serve for a term of three years.
9. To see if the Town will choose or appoint a committee of citizens to act as a Committee of Finance, whose duty it shall be to investigate all proposed appropriations, previous to the next town meeting, and report their recommendations at said meeting.
10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay Town Officers for the fiscal year ending January 31, 1928.
11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Incidental Expenses of the Town for the fiscal year ending January 31, 1928.
12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the salary and expenses of the Police Department for the fiscal year ending January 31, 1928.
13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of Highways and Bridges including State Aid Maintenance and Trunk Line Construction and Maintenance.
14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3000 for the purpose of building new sidewalks and repairing those now in use.
15. To see if the Town will vote to extend the permanent Highway on Washington Street to the State Aid Road near the Junction of Moody avenue, raise and appropriate \$10,000 therefore, or borrow the same on the credit of the town.
16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500 to construct a cement road on Pine Street from Broad Street to Pleasant Street.

17. To see if the Town will vote to build a permanent road on Washington Street from Moody Avenue easterly about two miles and raise and appropriate the sum of \$35,000, or borrow the same on the credit of the town to add to \$55,000 which is available from the State and Federal Government, making a joint fund of \$90,000 for the purpose.

18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate in aid of the Claremont General Hospital.

19. To see if the Town will vote to build a permanent cement Highway on Hanover Street from the end of the present cement Highway now on Hanover Street to the new entrance to the Hospital grounds known as Dunning Street and raise and appropriate money therefore or borrow same on the credit of the Town.

20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Sprinkling, Oiling and Cleaning Streets and Highways of the Town for the year ending January 31, 1928.

21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Fire Department for the year ending January 31, 1928.

22. To see if the Town will vote to increase the pay of the Call Men of the Fire Department and raise and appropriate money therefor.

23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of Hydrants for the fiscal year ending January 31, 1928.

24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Street Lighting for the year ending January 31, 1928, and pass any vote relating thereto.

25. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell the installation of the ornamental street lighting system to the Vermont Hydro Electric Corporation.

26. To see if the Town will vote to extend the Water System beginning at a point near the Dunsmore Farm on Washington Street to the Charron Farm, then across Sugar River by the fordway and out to the Bergeron Farm in the Puckershire District, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$16,000 to pay for laying the same and installing hydrants.

27. To see if the Town will vote to extend the Water Main to Sullivan Street Plat.

28. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay the Debts of the Town, including bonds of School District maturing during the fiscal year, and interest on same.

29. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of Stevens High School for the fiscal year.

30. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,500 for the support of Fiske Free Library agreeably to the contract with Andrew Carnegie and Samuel P. Fiske and \$200 for the use of the Historical Department of the Library.

31. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000 to make the burials; take care of, and beautify the cemeteries of the town.

32. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Town Poor for the fiscal year ending January 31, 1928.

33. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 to help carry on the work of the Red Cross Public Health Nurse.

34. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate sufficient money to provide suitable quarters for the Public Town Nurses.

35. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 for the maintenance and development of Moody Park.

36. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,500 for the support of the Monadnock Park and Barnes Playground.

37. To see if the Town will vote to purchase from F. E. S. Barnes land adjoining the Barnes Playground for an addition to the Barnes Playground and raise and appropriate money therefor.

38. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for painting and general repairs of the Town Building, and the sum of \$700 for replacing the footlights and border lights on the Opera House stage and renew the necessary wiring.

39. To see if the Town will vote to appoint a committee to investigate City Planning for Claremont, said committee to be appointed by the chairman and to report at a future meeting.

40. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for Milk Inspection.

41. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400 to be expended in cooperation with the State Department of Forestry in continuing the White Pine Blister Rust Eradication Work.

42. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the collection of garbage and refuse and raise and appropriate money therefor.

43. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Band Concerts by the American Band for the ensuing year.

44. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250 for Memorial Day.

45. To see if the Town will vote to extend the street lights on the Charlestown Road to the Charlestown line.

46. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to lay out a proper highway connecting Park avenue with Woodland Street, or take any action relative thereto and raise and appropriate money therefor.

47. To see if the Town will vote to increase the pay of the Highway Agent from \$5 per day to \$7 per day.

48. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a new road roller for the Highway Department and raise and appropriate money therefore.

49. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to widen Spofford Street near the Junction of Wall Street.

50. To see if the Town will vote to add a Motorcycle Policeman to the Claremont Police Force to assist in enforcing motor vehicle laws.

51. To see if the Town will vote to accept a new road which is laid out to avoid a grade on the East Mountain Road over land of George W. Chandler and discontinue the old route it replaces.

52. To see if the Town will vote to increase the salaries of the Auditors and Tax Collector.

53. To see what action the Town will take to provide suitable accommodations for the Municipal Court.

54. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue all that part of Tyler Street lying between Sullivan and Mulberry Streets, not included in the new layout of said street between bounds above stated by the Selectmen October 14, 1926.

55. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the participation in the Centennial Celebration of Sullivan County, authorize the Selectmen to pay the same to the Treasurer of the County Committee, and pass any vote in relation thereto.

56. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell a triangle piece of land lying easterly of Grandview Street, also land adjoining and lying north of North Street at the foot of Piggery Hill.

57. To determine the rate of discount the Town will allow persons paying their taxes within such period as the Town may designate.

58. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Since the acceptance by the town ten years ago of the gift from the late W. H. H. Moody, of land fronting on Maple Avenue known as Moody Park, development work has been done which has resulted in a steady increase in the use of the park by our townspeople.

The following outline of policy has been followed from the first by the committee.

1. A well built road to the highest point of the tract near its south east corner.

2. Selective trimming and clearing of brush and small trees with special reference to opening up the extended views of the Connecticut Valley and Ascutney Mountain which now delight the many visitors who drive to the summit.

3. Providing a sheltered and shaded summer picnic ground with suitable tables, seats, small building for shelter, etc.

4. Preservation of the forest cover, mostly young growth and confining it within its present limits.

We believe the large and increasing use made of this attractive park by the public justifies a continuance of reasonable appropriations for its maintenance and development.

A shelter at the summit of the drive, a small tool house, and a second picnic place are desirable improvements, which the Commission hope to add if funds are provided.

To the Citizens of Claremont, N. H.

The usual activities at Barnes and Monadnock Park were continued in operation during the past year; but in order to do so, it became necessary to raise money by public subscription. This applied particularly to the tennis courts and shower baths.

It was imperative that the new football field be completed this year, and in time for the opening game in the Fall because the rough field had already covered such an area on the old ball-field that it could not be used for football as in former years. To make the new field it was necessary to cover and raise about three acres to an average depth of two and a half feet. This level will ultimately be maintained over the area of the old baseball field as fast as filling material is available.

House ashes and refuse of this nature will be appreciated.

The toboggan chute which was a gift to the Park Commission from the Outing Club, has been kept in operation afternoons and evenings, weather permitting. This is constructed in sections so that it may be taken down in the Spring, and re-assembled in the Fall. Tobogganing bids fair to become a popular activity on the park.

The children's playground at Barnes Park was under the supervision of Miss Gladys Humphreys from June 28th, to Sept. 4th with 3600 children taking part in the daily programs, while 8,987 children took advantage of the opportunity for outdoor play at Monadnock Park under the supervision of Miss Margaret Keefe.

At the close of the season Sept. 4th, 200 children from both playgrounds joined in a pageant named "The Dearest Wish" given in an excellent manner, and showed much painstaking study on the part of the children, as well as careful training by the playground directors.

Monadnock Park has now been under operation and development for ten years, while the children's playground at Barnes Park has been in use for four years.

It can hardly be doubted that these years have proved the worth of recreation centers for Claremont's growing population.

HYDRANTS

During the past year three new hydrants have been installed in one of the increasing residential sections of the town. The hydrants have been installed on Washington street at the intersections of First, Second and Third streets.

FIRE ALARM SYSTEM

At the present time the system is in fairly good working condition and three additional fire alarm boxes have been installed during the past year, Box 41, West Pleasant and Mulberry streets, Box 61 Forest and Grant streets and Box 63 Myrtle street near Grove. Box 62 has replaced Box 41 at Myrtle street near Summit road, Bluff.

RECOMMENDATIONS

In the near future the entire fire alarm system will need a general and thorough overhauling and this year I recommend that one circuit, Line No. 1, which includes the West Claremont district should be rebuilt. This line is equipped with iron wire which has been in service for the past 25 years and which has become rusty and worn out to a great extent. The line will require seven miles of new insulated wire.

REMARKS

The new combination motor driven truck equipped with a 750 gallon pumper which was purchased during the past year is a valuable addition to the department's equipment and will prove an invaluable asset in case of an emergency.

The members of the department have, during the past year, kept up their high standard of efficiency and in minimizing the annual fire losses and I am very deeply appreciative of their splendid cooperation together with that of the citizens of the town.

Report of Health Officer

To the Board of Selectmen :

I herewith submit the following report of the health department of the Town of Claremont for the year ending January 31, 1927.

The number of cases of contagious diseases during the year has been comparatively small and every effort has been made so far as possible to trace the origin of each case reported, and to maintain an effective quarantine wherever necessary. Much preventive work has been done through the agencies of the public health nurse, infant welfare nurse, tuberculosis association nurse, school nurse, and medical inspection in schools.

SANITARY INSPECTION

Inspection of food products offered for sale and sanitary conditions of stores, markets, bakeries, restaurants, hotels, has been made several times during the year in company with the State Inspector. Conditions in most cases have been found satisfactory and in compliance with the requirements of the Pure Food Laws.

Samples of water from the Tyler and Grannis systems have been submitted to the State Laboratory of Hygiene for analysis at various times during the year.

Report of Milk Inspector

During the past year only one reactor has been taken out of the cattle supplying milk to Claremont and she showed a very small lesion. This record has not been equalled in any town in New England to my knowledge.

No contagious disease has been transmitted through milk. One producer has just fixed up a new dairy and is equipped to sterilize bottles by live steam under pressure.

Barns have been inspected and samples of milk taken and sent to the State Laboratory and with few exceptions reports have been good. Those that were not have been corrected.

Some milk has been dumped in the gutter due to improper handling.

Very few complaints have been made about sour milk due in a great measure to proper cooling.

Milk supplied to schools has been supplied this year from another source and we have had no trouble so far.

The Milk Inspector again wishes to thank the dairymen and dealers for their hearty cooperation and again urges the consumers to notify him of any trouble they may have with the milk delivered to them.

Report of Building Inspector

For Year Ending Dec. 31, 1926

The year 1926 was a very prosperous one in building projects and improvements in Claremont. Over \$500,000, being expended in building activities. Not as many new single houses as in 1925. Counting in new three and four room apartments there has been quite an increase in number of living apartments. Approximately 10,000 square feet of floor space has been added to new modern stores. 12,500 square feet to show rooms and garages combined, with several 1 to 18 car private garages.

New storage for building material 4,500 square feet. New tire plant with capacity of 622 square feet.

Among the larger improvements are the J. P. Goddard Block, Elks' Home, Colonial, Louis Heller Block, Claremont Furniture Co., Winner Hotel Cafe with seating capacity for 40 people, McCusker Brothers, Welch & Riley, Gonyea, Ideal Laundry, Claremont Steam Laundry, Sullivan Machinery Co. Foundry, Comfort Station. Improvements have been made in several stores adding new show windows etc.

The New Hampshire Forestry Department desires to call your attention to the importance of inserting an article in the next town warrant calling for an appropriation of at least \$400.00, for the purpose of continuing the control of the White Pine Blister Rust in your town. The Department will increase Town Blister Rust appropriations 25 per cent, so that for every

\$400.00 voted by a Town the State will add \$100.00. In addition to this aid, the State will also pay the cost of supervision of the town work.

Control work conducted in your town, in cooperation with the Forestry Department has brought about the removal on 17,992 acres of 135,404 wild currant and gooseberry bushes.

There are forty-two (42) New Hampshire towns and cities which have pursued continuously the control of Blister Rust until the entire pine areas have been protected by the removal of wild and cultivated currant and gooseberry bushes. There are many more towns where this work has been continuous so consistently that it is now very nearly completed.

Your careful consideration of this very important matter is earnestly requested. Funds appropriated for this purpose at the next town meeting should be made "available until spent in cooperation with the State Forestry Department."
