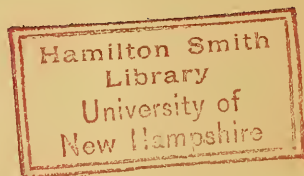

# TOWN WARRANT

---

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Goshen in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Goshen on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

Article 3. To hear the reports of the Selectmen and other Town Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 4. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for repairs of Highways and Bridges.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to apply for State Aid or Class Five Assistance, for Permanent Improvement of Highways and raise and appropriate the necessary money therefor.

Article 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Library.

Article 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Support of Poor.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to buy more Snow Fence and raise and appropriate the necessary money therefor.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to sand roads and raise and appropriate the money therefor.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to build a wood shed for Town Hall.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Control of Pine Blister Rust.

Article 13. Is it expedient to revise the Constitution?

Article 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

## REPORT OF THE LIBRARY TRUSTEES

---

During the summer and fall a good start has been made toward reorganization of our charging system, under the advice and active supervision of Miss Pratt, of the State Library office. The resulting card-system is very up-to-date, simple and satisfactory. Valuable help in this undertaking has been rendered by the trustees, the Goshen Corners Ladies' Auxiliary and others.

About three hundred volumes have been added during the year by purchase and gifts from the following friends: About 70 books were given by the late Arthur M. Hobbs of Haverhill, Mass., who lived on the present George Ayotte farm forty years ago, and who married Miss Edith V. Farr while residing in Goshen. Mrs. Frank Stockwell has donated nearly 150 volumes and 20 have been given by the State Library Commission.

Mrs. H. H. Halladay of Brookline, Mass., presented the library with two fine, framed photographs, one of her husband, who had always had our welfare upon his heart, and the other of Mr. Halladay's mother, Mrs. Sarah Horton Halladay, the founder of the library here.

Children's Book Week was observed in November with a special exhibit of new juveniles. Many tattered volumes have been removed from the shelves and the few duplicates have been sorted and will be on sale at 15c each. We have sent out collections of books for the schools whenever requested and are glad to render this service.

# REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

---

To the School Board of Goshen:

I herewith submit the annual report of the Superintendent of Schools.

## Enrollment

The enrollment in the Goshen Schools is now larger than it has been for several years. There are 20 pupils in each school. Each of the school rooms is fairly small and this number fills the available seating space. We are fortunate in having two excellent teachers to take charge of our pupils. Real progress is being made in the school work. There is a very good spirit in both schools, which is shown in the outside activities of the pupils, such as: entertainments, clubs, school paper, etc.

## Buildings

The Village School was remodelled last summer by putting in new windows on the south side of the building. This provides very much better light than we had before. All but one of the windows on the north side were removed and the space inside was filled with blackboard. The window on the west side was closed up because the west end is now the front of the room. The window shades, which were in No. 5 school, were installed on the new windows. The building was painted inside and outside. This school is now in very good condition, except that the toilets should be rebuilt as soon as money is available and septic tanks installed, if possible.

The Corner School has been painted outside. The woodshed and entry should be repainted. It would be very desirable to enlarge the school room by including the entry in the main room. With the present enrollment, the space is really too limited.

## Finances

The outstanding fact in our financial situation is the decrease in State Aid due to the increase in the valuation of the school district. The loss in aid will amount to about \$336.00.

The estimated expenditures for 1937-38, are a little less than the budget for the present school year, but the appropriation called for is unfortunately much larger than that made last year. There are two reasons, mainly, for this: (1) the decrease in State Aid, and (2) the fact that there will be no balance to be carried over next June. Last year there was a balance of \$593.72. Several times, however, in the past few years the appropriation has been nearly as large as that suggested for 1937-38.

I wish to express my appreciation of the fine spirit in which all concerned have cooperated in the work of the schools.

# REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

January 1936 - January 1937

---

The annual physical examination of school children in Goshen is made in October. Although this cannot, of course, be as complete as an examination by a regular physician, it covers the outstanding defects from which a child may be suffering. The nurse calls at the houses to talk things over, for correction of defects is more important than many parents realize.

Three pupils were accompanied to the clinic for a chest examination by Dr. Kerr. One pupil was accompanied to the orthopedic clinic at Keene for examination by Dr. Lee. Plans are under way for a school dental clinic for all school children.
