



Librarian's Report.

To the Board of Trustees of the Jackson Public Library:

I beg to present herein a report of the work done by the Library, and a statement of its condition for the year ending February 15, 1911.

The Library building has been open 116 days, from July 1 to October 1. The hours were from 10 a. m. to 1 p. m., daily; and for the remaining months from 2 to 4 p. m. every Saturday. In this time the total number of books given out was 3,779, a monthly average of 315 volumes, a weekly average of 63 volumes. The largest daily circulation was 69 volumes on March 19, 1910.

There have been added to the Library by gift 75 volumes and by purchase 42 volumes, making the total number of volumes in the Library, 3,150. In addition to this we have on file the following magazines and papers: The Century, Harpers, Scribners, McClures, Munsey, World's Work, St. Nicholas, National Geographic, The Woman's Journal, Advocate of Peace, Scientific American, Musical America, Ladies Home Journal, Outlook, Outing, Saturday Evening Post and Little Folks.

We are indebted to many friends for gifts of books and money, and especially for the following donations: From Mrs. BradburyBedell, a bronze tablet framed in antique oak, presented to the Library in memory of Katherine Prescott Wormeley; also from Mrs. Bedell, Balzac Novels, 31 volumes; from Jackson Thimble club, 18 volumes, 12 volumes being a set of Shakespeare's the large Temple Classic Edition; from Mrs. F. H. Shapleigh, 14 volumes and \$10; from Mrs. J. Blair Scribner, subscriptions for 3 magazines.
