TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Middleton, in the county of Strafford, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said Middleton on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article I. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Article II. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation for the same as per budget below:

Town officers' expenses . .	200.00
Election and registration . .	108.00
Expenses of town hall	10.00
Police department	7.00
Fire department	25.00
Health Department	5.00
Vital statistics	2.25
Libraries	31.00
Support of poor (Town) . .	100.00
Old Home Association . . .	10.00
Street lights	242.88

Article III. To see if the town will vote to raise \$1,000.00 for town roads and make appropriation for the same (Six hundred dollars to be used for summer work, four hundred dollars to be used for winter work.)

Article IV. To see if the town will vote to raise and

appropriate the sum of \$174.00 for state aid construction.

Article V. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of money necessary for state (\$350) and county (\$375) taxes and make appropriation for the same.

Article VI. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$12.00 for the issuance, distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town in cooperation with other towns in the lake region and make appropriation for the same.

Article VII. To see if the town will raise and appropriate \$100.00 for White Pine blister rust control.

Article VIII. To see if the town will vote to give selectmen power to hire money if necessary.

Article IX. To see if the town will vote to erect sign boards at the following places: One at Middleton Corner, one at the intersection of New Durham road and Silver Street road, and one at intersection of Farmington and Wolfboro and Hollow road, and raise and appropriate \$10.00 for the same.

Article X. To hear reports of agents, auditors, and committees and elect the same.

Article XI. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Superintendent's Report

To the School Board of Middleton:

The following report covers the first year of my work as superintendent of the schools of Middleton. The year began in March, following the sudden death of your former Superintendent, Mr. Fred W. Dudley, who had served the town so well and faithfully for many years.

The work was well in hand, and no changes were necessary in carrying on the administrative work of the department.

The graduation exercises in June reflected great credit upon both the teachers, Mrs. Blanche Wentworth and Mrs. Gladys S. Whitehouse, as well as upon all the children who contributed to the very fine program presented. The graduates were four in number, John H. DePrizio and Helen Mabel Eastman from the Corner School, and Wendell Moore Farrow and June St. Claire Tufts from the Ridge School. The town has every right to be proud of these two schools and the good work being done in them.

No changes were necessary in the teaching force until in November, when Mrs. Blanche Wentworth was obliged to give up her work for a time, her place being filled by Mrs. Dorothy Cook, a former teacher.

It will be necessary to expend some money on re-

pairs to the Ridge School this year. A new ventilating heater and new wall-board finish inside the school room are the chief items to receive attention.

There are forty pupils now in the Middleton schools, twenty in each building. The attendance is very good considering the fact that the hazards of winter road conditions present some problems to children in rural districts.

Roll of Honor for Perfect Attendance

Annie R. Jenness, Clarence E. Jenness, June St. Clair Tufts, John H. DiPrizio, Alvino C. DiPrizio.

A new departure regarding the Roll of Honor will make it possible for children to retain their places upon the roll if obliged to remain away from school on account of illness, or if they are unable to reach the school in stormy weather or because of other transportation conditions beyond their power to control.

I have found the school board and the citizens of the town to be most helpful in the work, and to all I wish to express my sincere appreciation of the friendly assistance that has been so generously given.
