THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Springfield in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Springfield on Tuesday, the eighth day of March at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To elect one Delegate to the Constitutional Convention.
- 2. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 3. To see if the Town will accept the Selectmen's estimate of expenditures for the year ensuing and act thereon.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations of the same.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the maintenance of highways and bridges and make appropriations for the same.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 for State Aid Construction, provided the State furnishes the sum of \$2,800.00, or see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$578.65 for T. R. A., provided the State furnishes the sum of \$2,314.62.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the special sum of \$200.00 for winter sanding.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the necessary money needed for oiling of the road in Springfield village.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the necessary money needed for purchase of a wing for truck plow.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Library purposes, in addition to the amount prescribed by law.
- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for hydrant service at Twin Lake Villa.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the salary of a District Nurse.

- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$75.00 for cemetery work, (\$50.00 for mowing and \$25.00 special work).
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the necessary sum of money needed for the buying and laying of a new floor in Town Hall and make necessary repairs to belfry.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the building of a section of a new wall along the roadside by old Cemetery.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$42.79 for support of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Regional Association.
- 18. To see what action the Town will take in regard to real estate taken over by the Town for the non-payment of taxes.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to grant a discount on taxes paid in full before October 1.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to borrow money on the notes of the Town in anticipation of taxes.
- 21. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

I herewith submit the annual report of the Superintenden't of Schools.

The enrollment has dropped this year. There are now 42 pupils in our schools as compared with 55 last year. The graduating class of 1937 was rather large (14 pupils in both schools). This year there is only one eighth grade pupil (Center School). It is encouraging to note that most of last year's graduates continued their education. Ten entered Newport High School, one Sunapee High School, and one Enfield High School.

The pupils of Springfield are fortunate in having excellent

teachers and well-equipped buildings. The Center School is specially noteworthy for its piano, library, attractive stoves, orchestra equipment, playground apparatus, chemical toilet (for girls), and movable parition between the two rooms.

At the Maxfield School I would recommend that new toilet facilities be provided, with access directly from the school building. The best equipment consists of a septic tank with modern accessories.

The fall tests in reading and arithmetic showed that most of the pupils are up to grade. In the case of the few who are below grade we have rather definite information about the needs and can adapt the work accordingly.

The teachers are to be commended for the excellent work being done in music.

I am specially impressed by the strong community spirit which contributes so much to the successful operation of the schools. It has been a pleasure to be connected with such a progressive school system.
