

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown, in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Stewartstown on Tuesday the fourteenth day of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose by ballot and major vote the following Town Officers:
 - (a) Town Clerk
 - (b) Selectman for the three years ensuing.
 - (c) Treasurer
 - (d) Five Road Agents.
 - (e) One or more Constables.
 - (f) One or more Sextons.
 - (g) Collector of Diamond Pond Rent.
 - (h) Overseer of the Poor.
 - (i) Trustee of the Trust Funds.
 - (j) One Library Trustee for the three years ensuing.
- 2. To choose by ballot and major vote all other necessary Town Officers.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget as submitted by the Selectmen.

If not to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year as follows:

- (a) Town Officers Salaries
- (b) Town Officers Expenses
- (c) Election and Registration
- (d) Municipal Court
- (e) Town Hall Expenses
- (f) Damages and Legal Expenses
- (g) Health Department
- (h) Vital Statistics
- (i) Interest on Temporary Loans
- (j) Interest on Long Term Loans

- (k) County Tax
- (1) State Tax.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Poor.
- 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Libraries.
- 6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the care of Cemeteries.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise seven hundred thirty-five (\$735.00) dollars for Street Lighting.
- 8. To see what sum of money, if any, the Town will vote to raise, in addition to that required by law for Town Road maintenance.
- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Winter Roads.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the following Departments.
 - (a) Police Department
 - (b) Fire Department
 - (c) Sewer Maintenance
- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay on Long Term Notes.
 - 12. To see if the Town will vote to accept Highway State Aid.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of the municipal year and to pay debts out of the tax money when it is received.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to discontinue certain portions of the town highway known as the Daniel Webster Extension of trunk line, between Stewartstown and Clarksville, the use of such portions of highway being no longer required by reason of the relocation of said highway in the course of the reconstruction of same: and to authorize the Selectmen to petition the Superior Court for its consent to such discontinuance if such procedure is necessary, and to do all other things necessary in connection therewith.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to exempt from taxation for a term of five years any Industry that will locate in the Town of Stewartstown, that will employ at least twenty-five hands.

- 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to use one hundred fifty (\$150.00) dollars for Publicity and advertising the Town.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue a certain section of Town Highway, known as School House Hill, leading from the Daniel Webster Highway on Washington Street to the intersection of the present Highway on High Street in West Stewartstown Village.
- 18. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collectors Deeds.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to close, subject to gates and bars, a certain section of the Town Highway known as the Hard-Scrabble Road, from Harry Ladd's on Piper Hill to the place where Eddie Aldrich now lives.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to close, subject to gates and bars, a certain section of the Town Highway known as the Deadwater turn to the Thayer Holden place, so called.
- 21. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to the reduction of interest on long term notes.
- 22. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

PLANS

Our purposes have been to visit the schools as often as possible when weather permits, to carry necessary materials and books to the schools, to avoid waste and extravagence, to inspect, test, and maintain a personal interest in each pupil's progress so far as possible, to confer with teachers upon the courses and outlines of study furnished by the state.

We try to exercise good judgment in the selection of all text books and in their assignment to particular classes and schools. We also aim especially to make it possible for the seventh and eighth grade pupils to pursue those studies that have most direct values for living both now and after the completion of their school life, and for preparation to enter high school, well trained in fundamentals and good habits of health and study, in order that they shall not fail there but meet with success if possible from the very beginning.

We have felt just pride in the good reports of high school work well done, especially by pupils from the So. Hill and W. Stewartstown grammar schools,

We also commend those schools that have attained marked improvement in per cent of attendance over that of last year. I would mention especially the Bear Rock school which advanced from 91.72 last year to 96.17 this year. The No. Hill school also showed marked improvement in attendance rising from 92.9 last year to 95.62 this year. The Hollow school enjoys the distinction of leading all in per cent of attendance.

These figures are encouraging this year when in most communities there has been an unusual number of cases of illness.

There were fourteen graduates last year and it seems likely that there will be an equal number this year. Many graduates go on to high school and some eventually to normal schools and colleges.

The obstacles that boys and girls discover and overcome in the course of their education are designed to fit them for strong men and women, who will be needed later in life to fill important positions and to do hard jobs that no one else can be found to do. Those who acquire the habit of persistancy, who will not admit defeat in any worthy project, help to make our state and country not only stronger but better.

Those who allow the habit of weakness and of complaining to overcome them should take heart early and try hard to succeed in little things which will train them to do greater tasks yet to come.

We feel that the teachers have had good cooperation this year by both parents and pupils. We appreciate such an attitude and trust that the townspeople will not forget the importance of education in the growth of their youngsters and that they will visit our schools, talk with teachers and superintendent, and try to vigorously support the cause of public education.

We wish to thank the school board for their vigorous support and activity and all who have contributed for the support and encouragement of public education.
