FOREST FIRE WARDEN'S REPORT

PREVENTION IS YOUR BUSINESS

Carlessness, Human Carelessness, causes 9 out of 10 forest fires. Each year 200,000 fires burn over 30 million acres in the United States. This represents 5 percent of our nation's woodlands being wasted each year. Every fire takes its toll. Floods follow; stream flow is affected; timber, buildings, grazing and wild-life are destroyed — all because MANY are CARELESS with fire in and near woodland. This can be remedied. YOU can put an end to this shameful waste! PREVENTION is YOUR business!

YOU, whether YOU be a farmer, homemaker, business or professional man or woman, municipal, state or federal official, clerk or woodsman, you can play an important part in the continuing and vital prevention program.

First—by setting a good example YOURSELF—being sensible and complying with the necessary laws and regulations governing the use of fire in and near woodlands.

Second—by using YOUR individual influence in your community and valued council with others in insisting and encouraging them to do likewise.

The following simple rules may be used as a guide both for YOU and for them.

1. Before burning, secure a permit from your local forest fire warden—the law requires it.
2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning—don't leave it.

4. Don't throw down lighted matches, cigars and cigarettes or from moving vehicles—make sure they are out—use your ash tray.
5. Don't burn at home—use your town dump and save yourself much possible difficulty, both personal and financial.

March 1959 — March 1960

The Page Hill Ski Slope again was the location of the Junior ski instruction program for the grammar school children, with about 45 participating. The Slope was much enjoyed by all together too few skiers as we don't seem able to compete in publicity with larger areas.

At the end of the annual Jr. Fishing Derby, all those who had entered fish were taken to the Powder Mill fish hatchery in Melvin Village to watch salmon stripping — the method by which eggs are procured for hatching more salmon. Two of the Derby winners were guests on radio station WBNC on April 20.

As usual the square dances at the Huckins Barn were very popular, but it would be nice to see more of the grown-ups who used to dance there. Square dances are for everyone.

The TOC Annual Meeting, held in August, was poorly attended though this is where people interested in recreation can make known what they would like to see done in Tamworth. Also there was an excellent color film of the 1958 World Series.

The Outing Club voted to support the Town Baseball and Basketball teams with \$25. each.

During the last week of August the Tennis Tournament was ably run by several of our interested summer residents, and the prizes were donated by Mrs. Alfred Tozzer. There were 21 entrants in three classes.

In the fall our trap shoot on Great Hill above the

Huckins Barn and the rifle shoot at Emery Roberts gravel pit on Route 16 were quite successful. There were several old time muzzle loaders competing beside the modern weapons. The introduction of a moving target in a tire rolled across the range from a steep bank proved irresistible.

Also in the fall we have the annual job of preparing the ski facilities for the winter. This year we put cement block foundation posts under half of our fine warming hut, and replaced some second-hand steel roofing with new sheets. Unfortunately the mowing of bushes on the slope was not finished because of a shortage of volunteers for other chores. We hope that more of our neighbors will help with this worthwhile work in the future.

A fine, lighted Christmas tree brightened the four corners in Tamworth for the holiday season.

A new recreational facility was added this year in the form of a permanently maintained, 15 mile dog sled practice and racing course in Wonalancet. The New England Sled Dog Club, whose racing committee includes one of our members, requested this course and the drivers pay for its maintenance. The TOC also contributes. This obviously brings the drivers, their families and friends into Tamworth more often than formerly. The first race of the 1961 season was held on this course on Dec. 31 and Jan. 1, and both drivers and spectators were enthusiastic. In the Junior Races there was a much larger field than formerly, with marked improvement in ability and training.

Perhaps we can attract more recreation business in other ways .

This year as usual the Outing Club spent about \$100 on ski equipment for our school children, and

with the help of the Foundation is giving weekly lessons to about 50 of them.

A new activity this year is occasional evening attractions which we hope large numbers will enjoy.

appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

9. To see if the district will vote to authorize the School Board to make application for and accept in the name of the school district for educational purposes such funds or grants-in-aid as may be obtainable from the State or Federal Government or any department or agency thereof, or any other sources.

10. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Tamworth:

During the school year 1959-60 the teachers in the Tamworth School were:

Mr. Ronald Corkum, Principal	Grade 7

Mrs. Eva Young	Grade 4
Miss Margaret King	Grade 3

Mrs. Janet Johnston	Grade 1

At the opening of school in September, 1960, Mrs. Johnston was succeeded by Miss Cynthia Thompson. Miss Thompson is a graduate of Keene Teachers College, has done graduate work at the University of Maine, and has taught in New Hampshire and California. Mrs. Brady was succeeded by Mr. Jerry Posnak who is a graduate of Fairleigh Dickinson University and has travelled extensively in Europe. Mr. Moore was succeeded by Mrs. Helen Davison who is a graduate of the University of New Hampshire and has had several years of teaching experience. All other members of the staff returned to their respective positions in September. A staff of competent, responsible teachers is a school's most important asset. Tamworth has such a teaching staff.

During the year 1959-60 the Tamworth School had a total enrollment of 191 pupils with an average membership of 177.5. In September of the current year the school opened with an enrollment of 184.

There were 64 Tamworth pupils enrolled at Kennett High School and eight enrolled at the Quimby School. The tuition rate at Kennett High School was \$355.00, and at the Quimby School \$350.00. At the beginning of the current year there were 63 pupils enrolled at Kennett High School with the tuition rate \$370.00. At the Quimby School there were seven pupils enrolled with the tuition rate \$350.00. Tuition rates announced for 1961-62 are \$395.00 at Kennett High School, and \$375.00 at the Quimby School.

The school health program continues under the competent supervision of the community nurse, Mrs. Thelma Roberts, R. N., with the annual physical examinations by Dr. Remick.

Under the sponsorship of the P.T.A. the school lunch service continues to provide attractive, nourishing meals at the very low cost of fifteen cents per meal. Few schools can serve meals for this amount, and those responsible for the management and operation of the program deserve commendation.

During the past two years the district has been participating in a ten-district cooperative school study concerned with a junior high school and a senior high school to be located at Conway. The committee has made its report and an article will, presumably, be included in the school warrant for a vote of the districts at the annual meeting.

It has been my privilege to serve as your super-

intendent of schools during the past fifteen years. My association with members of the school board, teachers, citizens, and pupils has been very pleasant, and the cooperation of all concerned is most earnestly appreciated.
