

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Alexandria in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Alexandria on Tuesday, the 9th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the town will raise for the maintenance of highways and bridges, except snow work.
- 4. To see how much money the town will raise for the breaking of roads in the winter.
- 5. To see if town will accept State Aid construction and raise \$753.00 for same, or will accept State Aid, Class 5 construction and raise \$495.59 for this purpose.
- 6. To see how much money town will raise for Blister Rust control.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 to the Lakes Region Association of New Hampshire for the issuance and distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.

- 8. To vote on the following question—"Is it expedient to revise the constitution?"
- 9. To act on the matter of providing water for use in the Town Hall and make any necessary appropriation for same.
- 10. To see if Town desires to reopen the road between John Pitman's and the Doe place.
- 11. To see if town will vote to allow a discount on taxes paid early in the season.
- 12. To see if town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of receipt of taxes.
- 13. To act on any other matters that may legally come before this meeting.
