

1939 TOWN WARRANT STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

STRAFFORD, SS.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Barrington qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are requested to meet at the Town House in Barrington on Thursday, March 14th, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following articles:

ARTICLE 1. To choose by ballot and major vote one Selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes and two Auditors for the ensuing year.

ART. 2. To choose all other necessary Town Officers.

ART. 3. To raise such sums of money as are necessary for the payment of State and County Taxes, Support of the Poor and all other necessary town charges.

ART. 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the maintenance of Town roads and bridges.

ART. 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$783.91 and the State contribute \$3,135.64 same to be expended on T. R. A.

ART. 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$991.50 and the State to contribute \$1,982.00 same to be expended on the Mt. Misery or Strafford road.

ART. 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$250.00 to pay for safe for Town records ordered on condition of Townspeople's approval.

ART. 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$3,500.00 to replace Mack Bridge.

ART. 9. To see if the Town will vote to close the road from junction of Turtle Pond Road and Gonic Road over Mack Bridge to Brewster Bridge Road and Gonic Road, subject to gates and bars. ART. 10. To see if the Town will vote to close New Road, so-called, from Waterhouse Road to Strafford line, subject to gates and bars.

ART. 11. To see if the Town will vote to close road from Isaac Young farm to Strafford line, subject to gates and bars.

ART. 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$750.00 for W. P. A. sewing project.

ART. 13. To see if the Town will vote to close substitute road or Green Hill School Road from junction of old school to junction of Gulf Road, about one mile, subject to gates and bars.

ART. 14. To see what action the Town will take in regard to using the Barrington Grade School for any town purposes subject to approval of School Board.

ART. 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money to be voted upon to match available money from the Federal Government to grade the school yard.

ART. 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$66.00 for Lakes Region Association.

ART. 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$200.00 for blister rust control.

ART. 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$60.00 for Jr. O. U. A. M. for Memorial Day.

ART. 19. To transact any other business that may legally come before the town.

The dedication of the new school building took place July 19, 1939, with Commissioner of Agriculture Andrew L. Felker and Commissioner of Education James N. Pringle as the chief speakers. The exercises also included Prayer, Presentation of the Flag, and remarks by Chairman Roy V. Swain of the Building Committee (who presided), Mrs. Celia F. Wood (Chairman of the School Board), Mr. Paul E. Farnum (Agent of the State Board of Education), and the Superintendent of Schools. There have been many other community gatherings in the school building during the year, including the Operetta presented by the school children, which was very successful.

At the eighth grade graduation held June 23rd, Mr. Lewis F. Foote, Headmaster of Coe-Brown Northwood Academy was the speaker. The following recived eighth grade diplomas:

Many finishing touches have been added in and around the school building. The grading project this vear included the terrace at the front of the building and at the sides and rear out as far as walks and drives. ready for foundation planting, seeding this area, construction of front driveway (including required culvert), rear driveway and parking area, improving approach to the auditorium, and removing of loose rocks, all in accordance with the permanent plan previously laid out by the building committee's engineer. The School Board, acting upon the sentiment prevailing at a citizens' meeting called for the purpose, decided not to commit the District to a W. P. A. project, but to proceed as district funds became available from time to time. Front steps should be constructed on the face of the terrace, shrubs planted around the foundation, walks graded at the sides, and some of the playing area put into condition so that the children will not trip on roots and hummocks. The drives should be tarred to hold the gravel in place. The semi-circular parking area in the rear is well adapted for occasional use as an outdoor stage, with the building as background and rising ground for spectators.

Inside the building, the chief improvement was in filling the cement floors with a seal, adding greatly to their good appearance and ending the tracking of dust. It was found that the wooden skids under the classroom furniture could be dispensed with; and these were used to make an outside walkway, still further protecting the classroom floors from the tracking and grinding of grit. From district appropriations have been purchased a library table and chairs, additional seating units for pupils, waste baskets, and equipment for the janitor, including step-ladder and window platform. Soap dispensers of a sanitary type have been installed in the lavatories. Adjustable map-rails in each classroom make it unnecessary to mar the finish with hooks and nails. The teachers have assisted in furnishing the office and library with a couch, window draperies, and cover for the piano. Other individuals have loaned piano, sewing machine, and hot lunch equipment. The School Board has joined with five other districts of this supervisory union in the purchase of portable dental equipment, including a chair and engine, for use in future dental clinics.

At the dental clinic last year, sponsored by the Red Cross, Woman's Club, Grange, and Mechanics, thirtyseven pupils were treated, all of them receiving complete care, with the rather high average of three operations per child. This clinic also had a very good record on the number paying all or part of the cost. The School Nurse, Miss Margaret Macdonald, also accompanied pupils to other types of clinics elsewhere, besides making the regular examinations, with notification and visits to homes where necessary.

The hot lunch unquestionably exercises a marked effect on the health and growth of many of the children. This project is carried on to a large extent by the pupils themselves, under the direction of Mrs. Brock, using the light and airy basement that was wisely provided in the new building. This year the contributions of parents and friends have been supplemented by Federal Surplus Commodities purchased from farmers by the government with a view to maintaining prices and preventing waste, and distributed free to schools and elsewhere that it may do the most good.

A Parent-Teacher Association has recently been formed at a well-attended meeting at the school building, with Mrs. Roswell Gaunya as president. This association will doubtless affiliate with the National Congress of Parents and Teachers, the objects of which are "(1) To promote the welfare of children and youth in home, school, church, and community; (2) To secure adequate laws for the care and protection of children and youth; (3) To bring into closer relation the home and the school, that parents and teachers may cooperate intelligently in the training of the child; and (4) To develop between educators and the general public such united efforts as will secure for every child the highest advantages in physical, mental, social, and spiritual education."

Mention should be made of the passing of Mrs. Winifred Josephine Bodge, who died August 11, 1939. Mrs. Bodge served on the School Board continuously for many years and had the confidence and esteem of the whole town. Though declining in health, she worked untiringly on the details of the new school building, and lived to see its completion. Her public service as well as her personal character will be gratefully remembered.
