# **TOWN WARRANT**

To the inhabitants of the Town of Bartlett in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Bartlett on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid Construction.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,474.50 to be used on the Humphrey Ledge road, for State aid construction.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sums of money called for in the Budget as prepared by the Selectmen.

6. To see if the Town will vote to continue W.P.A. projects.

7. To see if the Town will approve the acquisition by the United States Government of approximately 237 acres of land situated in the town, forming an additional purchase unit of the White Mountain National Forest, and described as follows:

Starting at a point in the proclaimed National forest boundary 400 feet Southerly from State Highway No. 18, and approximately 10 chains East-

terly from the Bartlett-Hart's Location town line; thence Easterly paralleled to and 400 feet from State highway No. 18 to a point in the proclaimed National Forest boundary, which is approximately one chain Southerly from Corner No. 7 of U. S. tract No. 65a, thence Southerly, Westerly and Northerly following the proclaimed Forest boundary to a point of beginning. Containing 237 acres, more or less.

#### A PETITION

8. That the Town arrange to tar that portion of Albany Avenue in Bartlett village, running from Kearsarge street to the Government line, and making appropriation for the same.

#### A PETITION

9. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provision of Chapter 26 of the Public Laws of New Hampshire relating to the election of Town Officers.

#### A PETITION

10. To see what action the Town will take, if any, in regard to dredging Mill Brook, so called; from Saco River to the source of said Mill Brook; and raise and appropriate money for same.

11. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue a certain piece of road on the Jennie Dorsett farm at Razor Brook, where the new bridge takes the place of the old one; a piece of road 400 feet long and now not in use. Meaning the old road.

12. Is it expedient to revise the State Constitution?

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of 500.00 to be used for recreational and | or business inducements. This sum, if raised and appropriated, to be administered by a committee elected by the town.

14. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow a sum of money not to exceed \$8,000.00 in anticipation of uncollected taxes.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

# SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Bartlett:

There were three changes in our teaching staff this year. Miss Jean Smith of the high school resigned and Miss

Catherine McPherson, a graduate of the University of Vermont, was engaged to fill the vacancy. Miss Josephine Leso, who had served us well for a long time as principal of the grammar school, resigned on account of ill health and Raymond E. Morton, a graduate of Gorham Normal school and of the University of Maine, was selected to take her place. Miss Marion Hersey also resigned during the summer and Miss Alice Chandler was engaged to teach in her place. Miss Virginia Allgrove, a graduate of Fitchburg Normal school, is the new teacher at Intervale.

It is gratifying that a number of our teachers are interested in sports and are capable of coaching and directing athletic activities among both boys and girls.

It is necessary to point out that we are near a point of congestion in the schools at Glen and Intervale. We are already transporting about twenty elementary pupils from these schools to the Bartlett granmar school. This number cannot be increased because the upper grades in the granmar school are already filled to capacity. If the number of elementary pupils at Glen and Intervale continues to increase as in the last three years, we shall have to find more school accommodations.

The budget has been figured as accurately as possible for a fiscal year which ends one year from June 30 next, and is nearly the same as last year. An increase is made in the estimate for fuel, and a sufficient sum set aside for high school books and supplies to add to the laboratory equipment, and provide much-needed additions to the text books in English and the library facilities. The amount asked for under article six is \$14,783.96. As always, high school transportation, insurance, and any special repairs or additions to equipment are considered under appropriate articles.

There was a considerable surplus from the insurance settlement last year, and at the last March meeting the school board was instructed to use it, first, for renovating the high school and installing a supplementary heating unit in the basement room used for recitations. If sufficient money were left after this was done, the school board were authorized in their discretion to install shower baths in the grammar school.

A very complete job has been done on the interior of the high school and a heating unit installed which is very satisfactory. There is probably enough money still left to install shower baths with no further appropriation. The school board has secured approval from the state board of education for a plan which is now being worked out, and on which estimates have been asked.

In behalf of the high school we would express officially our thanks to Mr. and Mrs. S. C. Simpson for the gift of cyclopaedia and other reference books last fall.


