Warrant for Annual Town Meeting Year 1927

To the inhabitants of the town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs;

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town of Colebrook, on Tuesday the 8th day of March next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose by ballot and major vote a Town Clerk for the year next ensuing.
- 2. To choose by ballot and major vote one Selectman for the three years next ensuing.
- 3. To choose by ballot and major vote one Trustee of the Trust Funds for the three years next ensuing.
- 4. To choose by ballot and major vote one Library Trustee for the three years next ensuing.
- 5. To choose by ballot and major vote three Highway Agents for the year next ensuing.
- 6. To choose by ballot and major vote all other necessary town officers for the year next ensuing.
- 7. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the poor.
- 8, To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the building and repairs of highways and bridges.
- 9. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Town Library.
- 10. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for town charges.
- 11. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for police service.
- 12. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for observance of Memorial Day.
- 13. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for care of Cemeteries.

- 14. To see if the town will vote to buy the land lying at the corner of Main and Colby streets, now owned by Est. of Sarah C. Knight and to raise money for that purpose,
- 15. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs and building of sidewalks.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to accept the provisions of chapter 87, Section 1, of the Revised Statutes, on a section of the Daniel Webster road, so-called and appropriate, or set aside from the amount raised for highway work the sum of \$150.00 for this purpose.
- 17 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the purchase of a snow plow and tractor, and elect a committee of three to purchase the same.
- 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to apply in payment of the town indebtedness.
- 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote to buy and erect snow fence.
- 20. To see what action the Town will take in regard to "Battle Bridge" so called, and raise money for that purpose.
- 21. To transact any other business which may legally come before the meeting.
- 22. To hear the report of Agents, Auditors, Committees and Officers heretofore chosen and to pass any motion relating thereto.
