To the Inhabitants of the Town of Danbury in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Danbury on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of highways.
- 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the George Gamble Library.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to give a discount on taxes.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise on the Trunk Line Construction Bond.
- 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for cemeteries.

- 10. To see if the town will vote to accept Town Road Aid money of \$2,561.17 and raise \$453.00 for same.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid construction money of \$1,000.00 and raise \$453.00, the same to be expended on the North Road so called.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the highway from the junction of the road near the Western schoolhouse to the Wilmot town line.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the highway from the Clark Corner, near the residence of Lawrence Huntoon, easterly to a discontinued road leading to the Chase place, so called.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the Lynch road, so called, from the State road to the Hill town line.
