

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Warrant For Town Meeting

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Dummer in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Pontook Schoolhouse in said Dummer on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at Ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
- 3 To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs of highways and bridges.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for snow removal.
- 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for cutting bushes along town roads.
- 6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for State Aid Construction.
- 7. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Town Libraries.
- 8. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for maintenance of cemeteries
- 9. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Town Poor.
 - 10. To see if the town will vote to give discount on Taxes.
- 11. To give the Selectmen the right to hire money in anticipation of Taxes and renew Notes.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the highway abandoned if and when the State Highway Department builds

the road as planned on the Caird and Wentworth lands.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before the Meeting.

Superintendent's Report

To the Dummer School Board and Citizens:

Herewith is submitted for your consideration the annual report on the condition and progress of your schools as seen by the Superintendent together with school statistics for year 1938-39.

For the last complete year, two schools, the West Dummer and Willis, were in operation for a year of 36 weeks.

The average attendance in these two schools was 94.7% for the West Dummer and 97.7% for the Willis; making an average of 96.2% for the two schools, a somewhat better attendance than for the previous year. A good school attendance is an important factor in the accomplishments and progress of pupils.

In June two pupils were graduated from the Eighth Grade at the West Dummer School. There was no graduation at Willis School as no pupils were registered in the Eighth Grade. This present year we have three pupils in the eighth grade at the Willis School and one pupil at West Dummer.

At the present time eight Dummer pupils are in attendance at High School—seven at Berlin and one at Gorham.

During the year, your Superintendent has made a total of 33 visits of inspection and supervision to the two schools. The work of different classes has been examined, standardized tests have been given and an effort made to keep the work of the various grades up to the standard of the State Program for the elementary schools. Progress and discipline on the whole have been satisfactory.

This present school year (1939-40) opened with the same experienced teachers as last year (Miss Ruth Wells at the Willis and Mrs. Lena Rich at West Dummer.)

The required health inspection work is being carried on by Mrs. Nina McCarthy of West Milan.

At the Willis School, hot lunches have been prepared for the noon hour pupils. This is a much worthwhile project and should result in better health for the pupils and consequently an improved quality of school work.

Statistics for last complete school year are as follows:
