# THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

To the inhabitants of the Town of East Kingston in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said East Kingston on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$75.00 for Memorial Day purposes.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for library.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 (for shovels, fire-rakes, etc.) for forest fire equipment; the state to match by equal amount.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$146.68 against the State appropriation of

\$536.72 for Class V roads assistance. No town may receive both Class V and State Aid in same year.

- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$487.50 against the State appropriation of \$1,000.00 for State Aid construction; this sum to be expended on the East Road.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money extra for Town roads for the purpose of preparing for and tarring new sections of roads.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to take from the Town Maintenance appropriation, money for seal coat of tar on roads tarred last year, with the exception of Lombard Hill.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the old road from the new house of Philip Warren to the residence of Mrs. Nellie Clements.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen in behalf of the town to request, and co-operate with the State of New Hampshire and its appropriate agencies, to construct, control and repair the Trickling Falls Dam at East Kingston on the Powwow river, in order to restore Trickling Falls lake, so-called, in the towns of East Kingston and Kingston, thereby conserving, protecting, developing and enhancing the present as well as the potential, natural and recreational resources of the said Town and State and also thereby otherwise promoting the benefits and welfare of this State.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of improving the general conditions of the Old Cemetery.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to replace the present light fixtures in the Town Hall with dome lights in the ceiling.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

# Record of Town Meeting

### ANNUAL MEETING

East Kingston, N. H., March 14, 1939.

The annual meeting was called to order at 10 A. M. by the Moderator, John C. Hilliard, the warrant was read and voters ordered to bring in ballots for Town Officers.

Art. I. Town officers elected as per list in front of this report.

- Art. II. Started on Art. II at 7.15. Motion by Harvey Marsh and seconded pass over Art. II. Not a vote. Motion by Philip Tilton and seconded that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 to defray town charges for the ensuing year. Voted.
- Art. III. Motion by Robert Baldwin and seconded that the Selectmen be authorized to hire money in anticipation of taxes. Voted.
- Art. IV. Motion by Alfred Blake and seconded that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$75 for Memorial Day purposes. Unanimous vote.
- Art. V. Motion by Robert Baldwin and seconded that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for the Library. Voted.
- Art. VI. Motion by Philip Tilton and seconded that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$150 for seal coat of tar on Lombard Hill. Voted.
- Art. VII. Motion by Edville Roys and seconded that Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$25 for shovels, fire-rakes, etc., for forest fire equipment, the State to match by equal amount. Voted.
- Art. VIII. Motion by Eben Bowley and seconded town raise \$489 against the State's appropriation of \$1,000 for State Aid construction; this sum to be expended on the East Road. Not a vote. Motion by Philip Tilton and seconded pass over Art. VIII. Voted.
- Art. IX. Motion by Robert Baldwin and seconded town raise and appropriate the sum of \$147.31 against the State's appropriation of \$589.22 for Class V Road assistance. Voted.
- Art. X. Motion by Robert Baldwin and seconded town raise and appropriate \$500 to gravel and tar Willow Road as far as it will go. Voted.

Motion by Philip Tilton and seconded town raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 to prepare for tar and tar the following hills: Greeley Hill, Hoyt Hill and Hill by Mrs. Mills. Amended—Provided it does not conflict with State specifications for Class V Roads. Voted.

Art. XI. Motion by Harvey Marsh and seconded we pass over Art. XI. Not a vote. Motion by Mrs. Roger Holmes and seconded that the town raise and appropriate the sum of \$50 to buy an adding machine for the Town Officers. Voted.
