MIDDLETON TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Middleton, in the county of Strafford, in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said Middleton on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

Article I. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Article II. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation for the same as per budget below :

Town officers	\$265.00
Town officers' expenses	200.00
Election and registration	57.00
Expenses of town hall	10.00
Police department	7.00
Fire department	25.00
Health department	5.00
Vital statistics	2.25
Libraries	15.00
Support of poor (Town)...	300.00
Old age assistance	90.00

Article III. To see if the town will vote to raise \$10.00 for the Old Home Association and make appropriation for the same.

Article IV. To see if the town will vote to raise \$242.88 for street lights and make appropriation for same.

Article V. To see if the town will vote to raise \$1,000.00 for the town roads and make appropriation for same. (Six hundred dollars to be used for summer work, four hundred dollars to be used for winter work.)

Article VI. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$174.00 for state aid construction.

Article VII. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of money necessary for state (\$216.00) and county () taxes and make appropriation for the same.

Article VIII. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$12.00 for the issuance and distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town in cooperation with other towns in the lakes region and make appropriation for the same.

Article IX. To see if the town will vote to give the selectmen the power to sell the Charles Tufts place for taxes and interest.

Article X. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the necessary sum of money to make a payment on a tractor and snowplow.

Article XI. To see if the town will vote to give the selectmen the power to hire money if necessary.

Article XII. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for white pine blister rust control.

Article XIII. To hear reports of agents, auditors and committees and elect the same.

Article XIV. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board of Middleton:

I herewith submit my first annual report as superintendent of schools. It will necessarily be incomplete, since I have served only since September 1, 1937, following the untimely death of Supt. J. E. Wignot. Let me here express my appreciation of his work and worth.

Having attended a small rural school as a boy, I have a deep interest in the Middleton schools and the children who attend them. Some of the finest kind of work may be done by a group of pupils of varying ages taught by a competent teacher.

In addition to the regular class work, some visual education has been introduced. Pictures have been shown on animal life, plant life, fishing industry, paper-making, arid land regions and others. It is said that we learn more through the sense of sight than through any other sense. Two picture entertainments were given to raise money for school welfare.

School property needed improvement and the school board has done much to improve conditions at the Ridge school. Septic toilets were installed and are working well. A state inspector pronounced the installation one of the best he had seen. A white sink has been set so that it can drain into one of the tanks. A partial partition has been built on one side of the schoolroom behind which the pupils hang their wraps, and on the

front of which is a good slate blackboard. A fine circulating heater has been set up in the corner and the room is easily kept comfortable. It is important that evergreen trees near the schoolhouse be cut so that the pupils may have sufficient light. This would help the school work and save using the electric lights so much during the daytime. I congratulate the school board and citizens on so much good and lasting improvement. It is hoped that improvements can be made next year on the Corner school.

The health work is now being looked after by the Red Cross nurse, Mrs. Irene Jones. For two months in the fall Miss Dorothy Bennett served as nurse. Since the work has been broken, no attempt will be made to give a statistical report for the year. Support should be given to any effort made to correct defects. The children should have dental treatments. Defects in eyes, ears and throat should be carefully corrected. Children cannot do the best work when handicapped by weak bodies. Warm noon lunches are being served for the physical welfare of the boys and girls. The teachers are to be commended for such beneficial service.

Last June the schools graduated a class of seven: Robert Lessard, Eric Bullis, Forest Lessard, Priscilla Tufts, Virginia Tufts, Leon Tufts, Clarence Jenness.

Of these the following entered high school last fall: Robert Lessard, Clarence Jenness, Leon Tufts.

A larger percentage should complete high school.

There should be several studying in advanced schools; College, Normal Schools, Business Schools, Hospital Training and Trade Schools.

For the year ending June 30, 1937, we had an average attendance of 31.5, an average membership of 32.6 and a percent of 96.6.
