#### To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Castle in said County, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said town of New Castle, on the second Tuesday in March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

1. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers heretofore chosen, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

2. To choose all necessary Town Officers and Agents for the year ensuing.

3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the year ensuing for the schools, etc.

4. To see what some of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the poor for the year ensuing.

5. To see what some of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of highways and bridges for the year ensuing, and to pass any vote relating to said highways and bridges.

6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for contingent expenses for the year ensuing.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the money necessary to pay the interest on the town bonds for the year ensuing.

8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay the commission of the collector of taxes for the year ensuing.

9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the ensuing year to be applied on the sinking fund.

10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money on the credit of the town at a rate not exceeding six per cent.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and II. appropriate for the support of the public library for the year ensuing.

To see if the town will allow a discount on taxes paid with-12. in a limited time.

To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate ten 13. dollars for decorating the graves of soldiers.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and 14. appropriate for the maintenance of street lights for the year ensuing.

To see if the town will vote to accept aid from the State of 15. New Hampshire for repairs upon the highways or any part thereof.

To see what action the town will take regarding the pur-16. chase of the Town Wharf Property, so called, and to raise any appropriation therefor.

To transact any other business that may legally come be-17. fore said meeting.

#### Selectmen's Report.

#### To the Citizens of the Town of New Castle:

The Selectmen herewith submit the annual report for the year ending February 15, 1909.

During the past year the town has made improvements in its highways and schools, which are pleasing and of great benefit. The repairs of highways with the aid of help from the state of New Hampshire and under the direction of the state engineer has resulted in making that section of Main street, extending from River street to Atkinson street, a strip of road which has never been equalled in this town. A sidewalk has been built the entire length of this strip and necessary culverts have also been put in.

Through the kindness of the Hon. Samuel Barrett, one of our citizens, the town was presented with a donation of \$500 to be further applied in the repairs of highways. With this amount a section of Oliver street was graded and repaired and a large section of the highway on Wentworth avenue. The work in each case was done creditably and satisfactorily to the town, and the Selectmen in behalf of the townspeople take this method of expressing the appreciation of Mr. Barrett's kindness.

Modern desks have been installed in the Grammar school, and other necessary improvements have been made under the supervision of the Board of Education. The amount necessary for these expenditures exceeded the amount of the school appropriation, and it was necessary to take it from the contingent fund.

The suit at law against the town in respect to the Mary E. Martin property, so called, is still pending. The town has every reason to believe that the trial should terminate in its favor.

Two of the town bonds have been taken up reducing the bonded debt to \$15,000.

Your Selectmen recommend further improvements of highways the coming year under the direction of state aid with the necessary culverts and sidewalks; the repairs of town railings wherever needed and the installation of three more street lights, as we believe that the latter in view of the increased traffic in the summer time by automobiles and carriages, are demanded as well as by the necessities of pedestrians.

#### Report of the School Board.

In accordance with the usual custom, the School Board submits its report for the fiscal year ending Feb. 15, 1909.

We are pleased to say that all differences arising in the past have been satisfactorily settled.

Mr. Andrew Horning, who was elected a member of the board at the annual meeting, resigned, and the board appointed Frank A. Brown to fill the vacancy.

On account of the failure of the district to elect a treasurer, we were under the necessity of appointing one. Mr. Oliver B. Marvin consented to serve, and under our present system of keeping accounts everything has worked smoothly. Our money is drawn from the town treasurer and placed in the National Mechanics & Traders Bank, and can only be drawn by the treasurer on order from the majority of the School Board, thus conforming with the law.

We have purchased and placed in the grammar school twenty modern folding seats, also other articles of furniture which it badly needed. This schoolroom is now in good condition.

The primary schoolroom is totally unsuited for the purpose, and we would recommend that the district take measures to quarter this school elsewhere.
