

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Pittsburg in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Pittsburg on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget and raise money for the same.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- 3. To raise and appropriate to the White Mountains Region Association, for its program of advertising, etc., as a part of the cooperative investment by regional towns, an amount equal to 10c per \$1000. of the assessed valuation of the town for 1943.
- 4. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.
- 5. To choose all necessary Town Officers.

Superintendent's Report

To the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of the Pittsburg School District:

FOREWORD

The heaviest burdens of war are carried by youth. They fights its battles. In the long years after, they pay much of its cost. Even the younger children of wartime are often children of neglect. We must keep constantly before us the fact that children cannot delay the growing-up process. What they will be, they are now becoming.

What ever may happen to grown-ups, our children must be kept safe, strong and assured. Even during war times when parents are hard pressed with new responsibilities, they should realize that there is no care so good as that given by devoted parents in the home. When parents do a good job by their own children they are doing a vital war job for our Nation. Children depend on so many for their chance to grow in safety, strength and security.

May our post-war horizon be brighter because of a thoughtful well-guided program of education and training for youth, started in the home and continually strengthened by their experiences in the home, the church and the school.

Will you as American parents do your part to see that the foundations of morality, religion and culture are not weakened by a rising tide of juvenile delinquency?

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Teachers

There have been several teacher changes in the district. In the High School, Florence McConnell from Boston University was elected to fill the Commercial vacancy and Eunice Washburn, Plymouth Normal, was selected to teach English and French.

In the Elementary Schools, Ruth Robie was employed for grades 4-5-6 and Junie Aldrich grades 1-2-3 at the Danforth. Velma Gray was transferred from the Danforth to the Village Primary Room. At Christmas time Ruth Robie resigned and Hope Danielson filled the position at Danforth Intermediate.

Buildings and Equipment

Very few repairs have been made to the buildings during the past two years. Since the last report a new furnace has been installed at the Danforth School. The building there as a whole is not in the best of condition and repairs are difficult because the building is so much out of shape.

The village school needs to be re-decorated inside, the outside woodwork painted and the back side fixed so as to eliminate the birds. The metal roof of the woodshed should be painted to prevent continued rusting.

Enrollment and Attendance

The total enrollment for the district is 126 as compared with 142 last year. Three years ago the enrollment was 177. This represents a drop of 51 within the three-year period.

There are 5 in the High School from Clarksville and 1 from Stewartstown. We have 6 from Pittsburg attending school at West Stewartstown.

Precentages of attendance were with the exception of the Danforth Primary, quite good. The average for the grades 95.49% and for the High School 95.58%. There were 45 cases of tardiness in the High School and 88 in grades 1-6. The best record in Pittsburg Intermediate with but 4.

Notes on the Budget

The School Board's total budget for 1944-45 is \$24,225.75 as compared with \$22,837.00 for last year. The estimate income is \$500.00 so that the requested appropriation is \$23,725.75. In March 1943, \$23,337.00 was appropriated. The increase is accounted for by higher costs for supplies, fuel and salaries.

Conclusion

Since Pearl Harbor, many students have been leaving the classroom, sacrificing their education to take part in the war effort. Many parents have been greatly troubled because their boy wanted to quit school and secure employment. The parents, teachers, industrialists and authorities for the armed forces all know that the best thing for the youngster and the country is that he continue his education. Youth should prepare now for life. Knowledge is no handicap either in war or in peace.

I take this opportunity to express my appreciation to the members of the school board, parents, teachers and citizens for their support in our common effort to maintain good schools.
