

SEAL To the inhabitants of the Town of Shelburne, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Shelburne on Tuesday the twelfth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To hear the reports of town officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 3. To hear the report of the budget committee and act thereon.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of town highways and bridges.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid construction of highways.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the library.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.
- 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for relief of town poor.
- 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the cost of fire equipment.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$57., based on a 1-100 of 1% of the assessed valuation, for the town's share of cooperative participation in the White Mountains Region Association.

- 12. To see if the town will vote to petition the state tax commission to have an audit made by the municipal accounting division and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such an audit.
- 13. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking inventory.
- 14. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collectors' deeds.
- 15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

At the present time your school has 26 pupils enrolled with all grades from the first to the eighth represented.

Last June, 1939, four pupils were graduated from the Eighth Grade with appropriate exercises conducted at the Grange Hall in the evening of the last day of school. Of these four pupils, three are now continuing their school work at Gorham High School and one is at Gould Academy. At the present time four-teen Shelburne pupils are registered in high school.

We have one pupil who will probably graduate from high school this June and five who are now completing their work in the local school—thus making our next year's high school tuition pupils approximately eighteen.

The school year has been 36 weeks and the percentage of attendance for the year ending June 30, 1939, was 95.

The discipline and accomplishments of the school have been good as seen from various visits of inspection and supervision and a standard amount of work has been completed in the different grades.

The required Health Supervision has been conducted by a registered nurse, Mrs. Mary Spaulding of Whitefield.
