THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Town of Stewartstown on Tuesday the thirteenth day of March next at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose by ballot and major vote the following Town Officers: :
 - (a) Town Clerk
 - (b) Selectman for the three years ensuing
 - (c) Town Treasurer
 - (d) Five Road Agents
 - (e) One or more Constables
 - (f) One or more Sextons
 - (g) Collector of Diamond Pond Rent
 - (h) Overseer of the Poor
 - (i) Trustee of Trust Funds
 - (j) One Library Trustee for the three years ensuing
- 2. To choose by ballot and major vote all other necessary Town Officers.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget as submitted by the Selectmen.

If not to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray Town charges for the ensuing year as follows:

- (a) Town Officers Salaries
- (b) Town Officers Expenses
- (c) Election and Registration
- (d) Municipal Court
- (e) Town Hall Expenses
- (f) Damages and Legal Expenses

- (g) Health Department
- (h) Vital Statistics
- (i) Interest on Temporary Loans
- (i) Interest on Long Term Notes
- (k) Police Dept. (including the care of tramps)
- (1) Fire Department
- (m) Sewer Maintenance
- (n) Summer Roads, in addition to that required by Law
- (o) Winter Roads
- (p) General Expenses of Department
- (q) Street Lighting
- (r) Town Poor
- (s) Cemeteries
- (t) State Tax
- (u) County Tax
- (v) Libraries
- 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay on Long Term Notes.
 - 5. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts on Temporary loans in anticipation of Taxes of the municipal year and to pay debts out of the tax money when it is received.
- 7. To see whether beer or other lawful alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally as permitted under this act.
- 8. To see what action the Town will take with reference to a controversy existing over the boundary line between property owned by H. C. Coleman and the Town of Stewartstown, and pass any vote carrying its action into effect.
- 9. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the establishing and building a trail to the cabins on Diamond Pond, and to make appropriation for the same.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue a certain portion of the Town highway leading from the Randall Harriman place, now owned by the R. E. Marsh estate and H. N. Marsh, to the intersection of the road leading from the place now owned by Edward Hart to the place now owned by Annie Chamberlain.

- 11. To see what action the Town will vote to take in providing a safe repository for Town records in the West Stewartstown Village Fire Station, and make appropriation for same.
- 12. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to the reduction of interest on long term notes.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through a Tax Collectors Deed.
- 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

SUPERINTENDENTS REPORT

To the School Board of Stewartstown:

I herewith submit the annual report of the superintendent of schools.

ATTENDANCE

The schools have at present a smaller enrollment than they had last year. In fact we have lost 18 pupils this year since September, due to families moving away, mainly in West Stewartstown. This makes the sizes of classes at West Stewartstown much more reasonable, none of the rooms having now over 35 pupils. If the large enrollment of last year had continued it would be necessary to open up the additional room on the second floor. In fact this room should be finished off anyway, because the school could make good use of it as a lunch room and play room.

The South Hill school had the smallest number of tardinesses last year. None of the schools had very many. This is a good record.

SUPERVISORY UNION NO. 7

As a result of legislative action the State Board of Education is compelled to eliminate ten superintendents of schools in two years. Six have already been eliminated. This has made necessary a new grouping of school districts into supervisory unions. Union No. 7 now consists of Clarksville, Colebrook Special, Colebrook Town, Columbia, Pittsburg, and Stewartstown. The following statistics give an idea of the size of the union.

The former Colebrook union (Colebrook, Columbia, Errol, Wentworth Location) had last year 15 schools, 635 pupils, and 31 teachers.

The Pittsburg union had 10 schools, 361 pupils and 17 teachers. The Colebrook superintendent, who now serves the new union, had, therefore, nearly a 50% increase in number of pupils and teachers to supervise and 66 2-3% increase in number of schools to be visited. The union extends from South Columbia to Connecticut Lake, a distance of about 35 miles. Twenty-one of the schools are rural schools, a fact which means many miles of travel. Some of them are on back roads which are not open to an automobile in the winter. Therefore travel consumes much time.

The above facts indicate clearly that the superintendent can not visit any one school as frequently as could be done under former conditions. The state has saved some money by reducing the number of superintendents, but supervisions in the individual school districts has been very much diluted. Moreover several towns have lost a resident superintendent.

A superintendent can not visit schools every day because administrative duties must also be performed. He must attend to correspondence, reports, bills, pay-rolls, repairs, supplies, transportation, etc. There are teachers' meetings, conferences, school board meetings, and interviews with parents, salesmen, and others. Under these circumstances a reasonable schedule would allow a visit to each school in the revised union about every three weeks. Unfavorable travelling conditions in winter, or an unusual increase in administrative duties (as making out annual reports) will make such a schedule impossible. It is an open question whether economy is more important than service. But the situation is here and we shall do the best we can to attend to all the many duties as quickly as possible. A clerk in the office to perform all the routine tasks will free the superintendent for visits to the schools. A clerk has been employed this winter, under the C. W. A., for 24-30 hours a week. This has been a very great help.

SCHOOL SUBJECTS

As we emerge from the depression and look down the road which opens before us we see many changes in our social and economic life. These changes can not help affecting the schools.

The most striking fact is the lack of work, resulting in widespread and appalling unemployment. Machines have made unnecessary the employment of many people. Manufacturing and business enterprises have cut down production because people can not buy the articles produced. All employers (including units of government) have reduced their working forces in the interest of economy. The federal government has courageously tackled this gigantic problem and has set thousands to work in C. C. C. camps, on public works, and on various projects under the C. W. A. But even these workers are limited in the number of hours of labor. Therefore folks have an abundance of leisure time. What will they do with it?

This sudden increase in leisure time constitutes one of our big problems. People will not sit idle or sleep all the time they are not working. They will do something, either good or bad. Now it is a fact that many do not know what to do with spare time. Isn't this an opportunity—even a responsibility—for our schools? For years we have, through our practical arts courses, trained pupils to work. Now we find that there is not as much work to be done. What there is usually requires very little training. It is said that most jobs in commercial plants can be learned in three days. Therefore the schools must change the emphasis and prepare pupils really to live, not merely earn a living. In other words we must prepare children to use happily and profitably their leisure hours. How can we do this?

In the first place men and women will not seek to amuse themselves translating Cicero's Orations, solving algebraic equations, or discussing current topics in French or German. But probably they will take some interest in topics like the following:

- 1. Reading. Once we have mastered the art of getting ideas from a printed page most of us will spend considerable time reading something. Probably it will not be Shakespeare, Browning, or even our beloved poet Longfellow. We turn mostly to current magazines and papers. There is certainly no lack of them! Which shall we choose? Those current magazines should appear in school along with the so-called Classics. Then we can train the pupils to read with discrimination and judgment the very articles they will meet in their daily lives, thus forming habits that will be useful in later life. The pupils will, moreover, get some insight into concurrent problems.
- 2. Economics and sociology. We used to let the bankers handle our economic questions and the professors the problems of our larger social relations. The depression has violently removed the laurel wreaths from the brows of the bankers and a new administration has elevated the professors to the seats of the mighty. The result is that economic questions have escaped from the barred windows of the banks

and sociology has burst out of the cloisters of the colleges. Both are right on the front page of our daily newspapers. You and I have read them with frowns, sighs, and despair. Our children must be better prepared in these subjects. This preparation constitutes a second task for our modernized curriculum.

3. Music and art. People have always found joy and solace in music and art. We are fast becoming a musical nation. The radio has been the largest factor in this development, because it is constantly pouring music into our ears. Hundreds of orchestras and choruses have been organized throughout the land. It seems to be a natural impulse to sing, play some instrument, or even to whistle. Why shouldn't we take hold of this impulse and develop it to the advantage of the individual and the community?

There are two aspects of instruction in music—production and appreciation. Children should be taught to sing and play some instrument. They can then pleasurably occupy leisure hours and also help out in the activities of church, Grange, or other community organizations. Many schools furnish instruments for an orchestra or help pupils to secure them. But whether we produce music in any way or not, we all listen to it. What a thrill of genuine interest we feel when we recognize a selection which we hear and can tell who composed it! It is like meeting an old friend. We can all be taught a real appreciation of music. All this should ideally be accomplished under the direction of a music supervisor, but even without one, much can be acquired by means of the victrola and modern books.

Ability to express one's ideas by sketching or painting is a highly-prized talent, for it helps pass away many pleasant moments and brings great satisfaction, if not, indeed, added income. How many of us would be happier if we had acquired this talent in painting which we see? That, too, requires training, which can readily be given with the aid of inexpensive prints of famous works of art and a manual in the hands of the teacher.

I hear some object that music and art are mere fads and frills. Is your automobile a fad? or your fishing-rod? or your gun? Perhaps, but you live with them and enjoy them. Music and art affect people right on the level where they live and are therefore of the utmost importance, regardless of our past mis-conceptions, especially in the new leisure that is already upon us.

- 4. Science. The many mechanical appliances which we use daily make it necessary for us to know some science. Therefore at least a general course in science should be given to every pupil. This is already being done in the Academy.
- 5. Recreation. It is well known that play and entertainment are as necessary for our well-being as food, clothing, and shelter. Without proper relaxation we go "stale" or become nervous wrecks. Pupils who are used to engaging in cooperative sports will easily continue to do so. Then there are hobbies which ought to be introduced and developed so that idle hours can be well employed.

I submit that these five fields of instruction are of fundamental importance to our daily lives. Already the schools are giving attention to them and will give more in the future if they are really going to prepare children for life.

REPAIRS

Some of the rural schools need redecorating inside. This would not only make them more attractive but would increase the light. The Bear Rock, South Hill, and Hollow schools ought to have additional windows cut on the left so that most of the light would come from the pupil's left. I recommend that two schools be renovated this year and the others left until other years.

BOOKS

One of the greatest needs is books. I find that the supply is quite meagre and that some of those we do have are old editions and worn out. Books have been borrowed, I understand, in past years from other towns. This is a neighborly proceeding but each town really ought to stand on its own feet. In 1932-33 only \$74.06 was spent for textbooks. According to the average amount spent per pupil in New Hampshire last year Stewartstown should have spent twice as much. Pupils can not make satisfactory progress without the tools of learning. Therefore it is suggested that \$200.00 be allotted to the purchase of books next year.

NOTES ON THE BUDGET

The prices of school supplies have advanced thirty per cent on an average, so more money has been allotted to this item.

Expenses of administration include postage, telephone, printing, and office supplies, travel outside the district, treasurer's bond, and clerical help in the superintendent's office. As explained elsewhere in this report the enlarged union imposes more duties, both of supervision and administration, upon the superintendent. In order that he may visit schools as frequently as possible he should be relieved of clerical work, such as writing letters, making out checks in payment of bills, keeping records, and attending to the many details of office work. A part-time clerk could do the type of work for all the districts in the union, each district paying its proportionate share of the expense.

"Other expenses of instruction" include standard tests for pupils, record-books and plan books for teachers, magazines and reference books, and graduation expenses.

An increase in the number of pupils who will probably attend high school next year makes the amount for tuition larger. The tuition rate at Colebrook Academy dropped this year from \$100.00 to \$82.42, the actual cost for the year 1932-33. Next year it will be \$82.50.

Last year, on account of lack of money, the school board paid on the tuition of those pupils who attended Colebrook Academy only \$89.79 per pupil. This was the average per pupil cost of instruction in New Hampshire high schools for the preceding year and is all any school board could legally pay unless a contract to pay more was made by the district. No such contract had been made, although it has always been the custom to pay the full tuition charged by Colebrook (last year \$100.00). This left a balance of \$10.21 for each pupil to pay. Since the district has uniformly paid the entire tuition of pupils, it would be unfair to make an exception of last year's pupils. Therefore the sum of \$102.10 should be raised to pay the balance due on the tuition of the Stewartstown pupils who attended Colebrook Academy last year.

HEALTH WORK

The schools are fortunate this year in having the services of a nurse, Miss Frances J. Varney. She is a graduate of Peter Bent Brigham Hospital, Boston, and took a course in public health nursing at Simmons College. She was a public health nurse in the Maine State Department of Health and has served as school nurse also. She visits the schools regularly, examining the pupils and giving health talks. When defects are found she makes home visits to discuss the matter

with parents and advise about correcting the trouble, frequently assisting in any needed treatment. This procedure is much better than an annual inspection, with merely a card notice of defects found. Dental clinics are held once a week in Colebrook at which children may have their teeth treated at reduced cost. Tonsil clinics will be held at the county hospital later. Therefore the health of the children—a matter of highest importance—is being very well cared for this year. This service costs the school district nothing. Since the nurse serves parts of two supervisory unions (including Errol), the state pays the entire cost in state-aided districts. Stewartstown has the largest share of the nurse's time.

I wish to express my appreciation of the cordial cooperation of the School Board and teachers.
