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APPROVAL OF TRUMP ON THE RISE IN NH; RESIDENTS SUPPORT MUELLER INVESTIGATION

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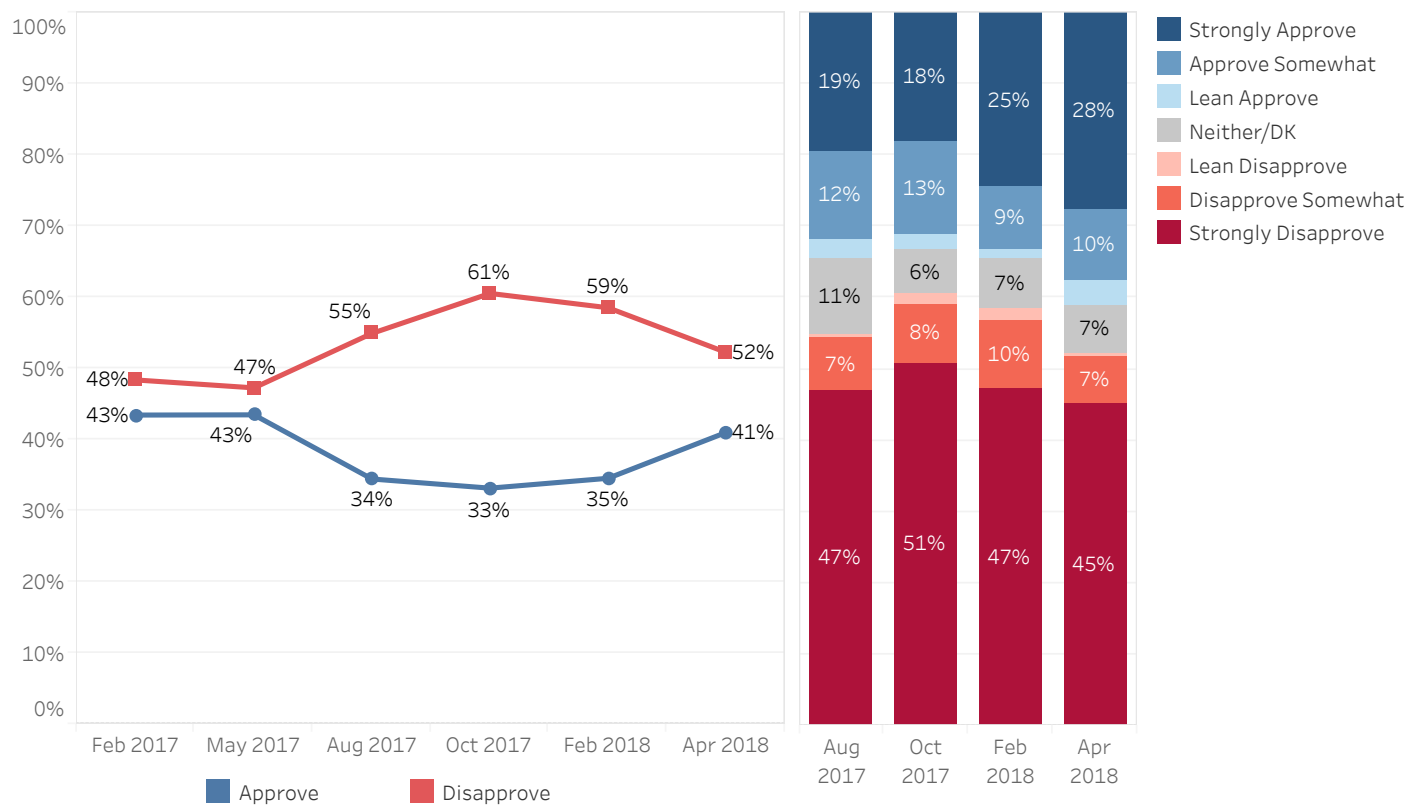
DURHAM, NH – New Hampshire residents have become somewhat more positive in their assessment of Donald Trump's performance as president. Approval of his overall job performance, handling of the economy and foreign affairs, and his personal favorability have all increased since February, with the largest gains among Independents. More than half of Granite Staters say the Mueller investigation is a serious matter that should be fully investigated and few support President Trump firing Robert Mueller.

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and forty-eight (548) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between April 13 and April 22, 2018. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.2 percent.

Presidential Approval

Granite Staters are more positive in their assessment of Donald Trump's performance as president and his approval now nearly equals the levels of support he enjoyed early in his tenure; 41% approve of Trump's performance as president, 52% disapprove, and 7% don't know or are unsure.

Presidential Approval - Donald Trump

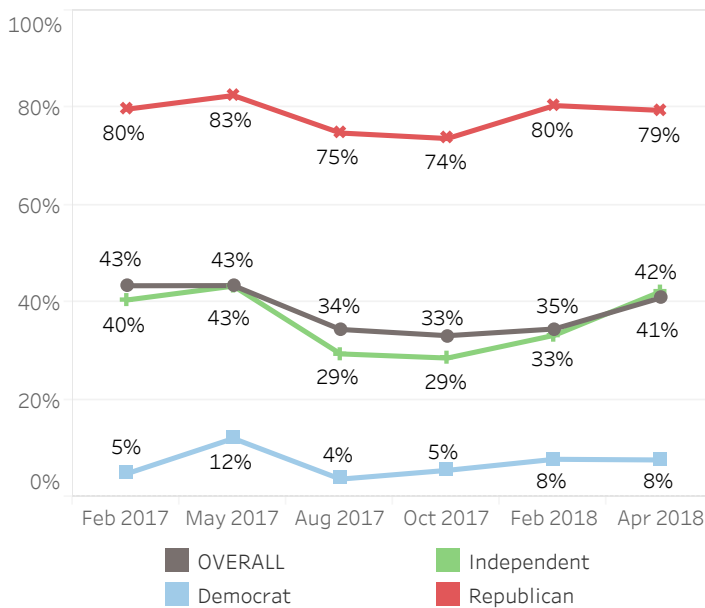

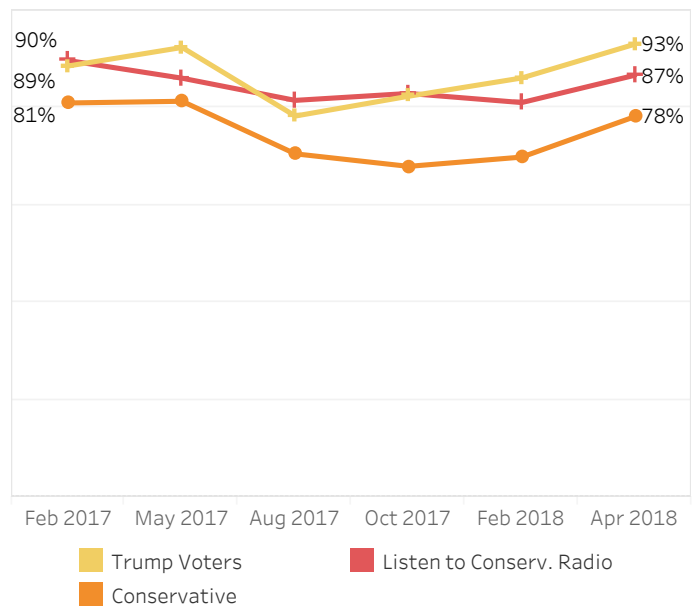
Approval of President Trump continues to be closely tied to partisanship. Seventy-nine percent of Republicans approve of Trump's job performance, unchanged since February 2018 (80%); 42% of Independents approve, up from 33% in February, while 8% of Democrats approve of Trump's performance as president, unchanged since February.

Those who voted for Trump in 2016, conservative talk radio listeners, self-identified Republicans, self-described conservatives, *Union Leader* readers, and those who attend religious services once or twice a month are most likely to approve of Trump's performance. Those who voted for Hillary Clinton or did not vote in 2016, self-described liberals, self-identified Democrats, NHPR listeners, Connecticut Valley and Seacoast residents, *Boston Globe* readers, those who have completed postgraduate work, and those aged 18 to 34 are least likely to approve of Trump's performance.

Job Approval - President Donald Trump - By Party Identification

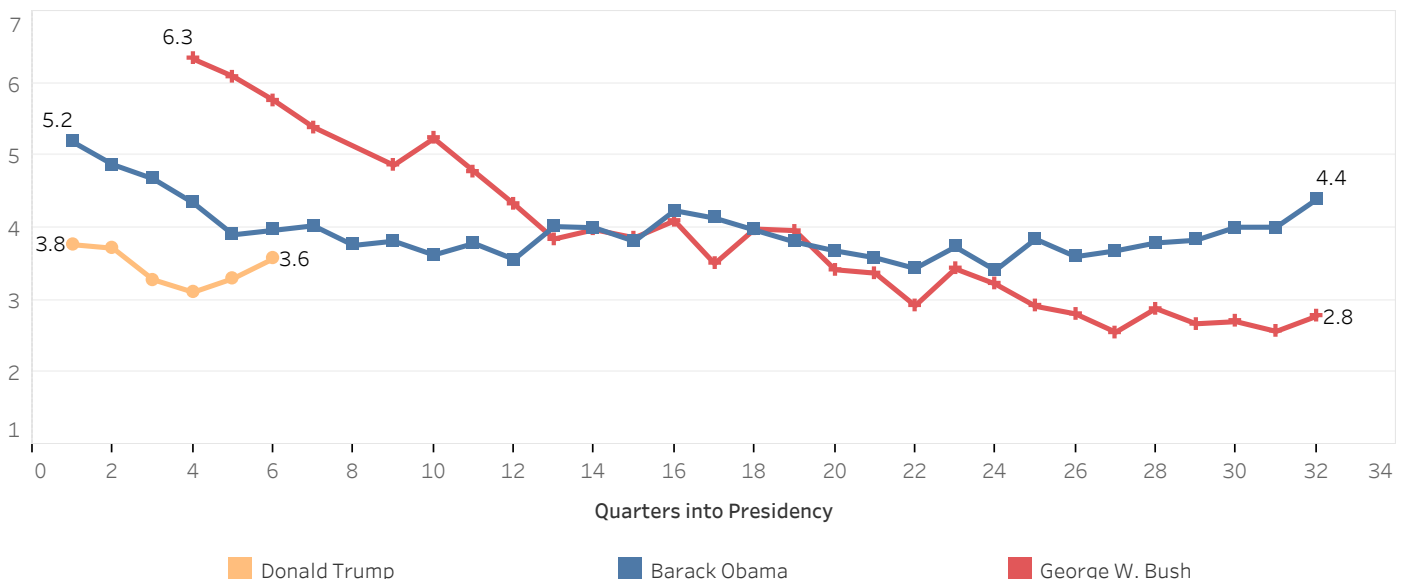


Job Approval - President Donald Trump - By Strongest Supporters



On a scale where "strongly approve" equals 7 and "strongly disapprove" equals 1, Trump's average approval rating (3.6) has increased since the previous quarter (3.3) but remains below his predecessor, Barack Obama (4.0), in the sixth quarter of his presidency.

(7=Strongly Approve, 1= Strongly Disapprove)

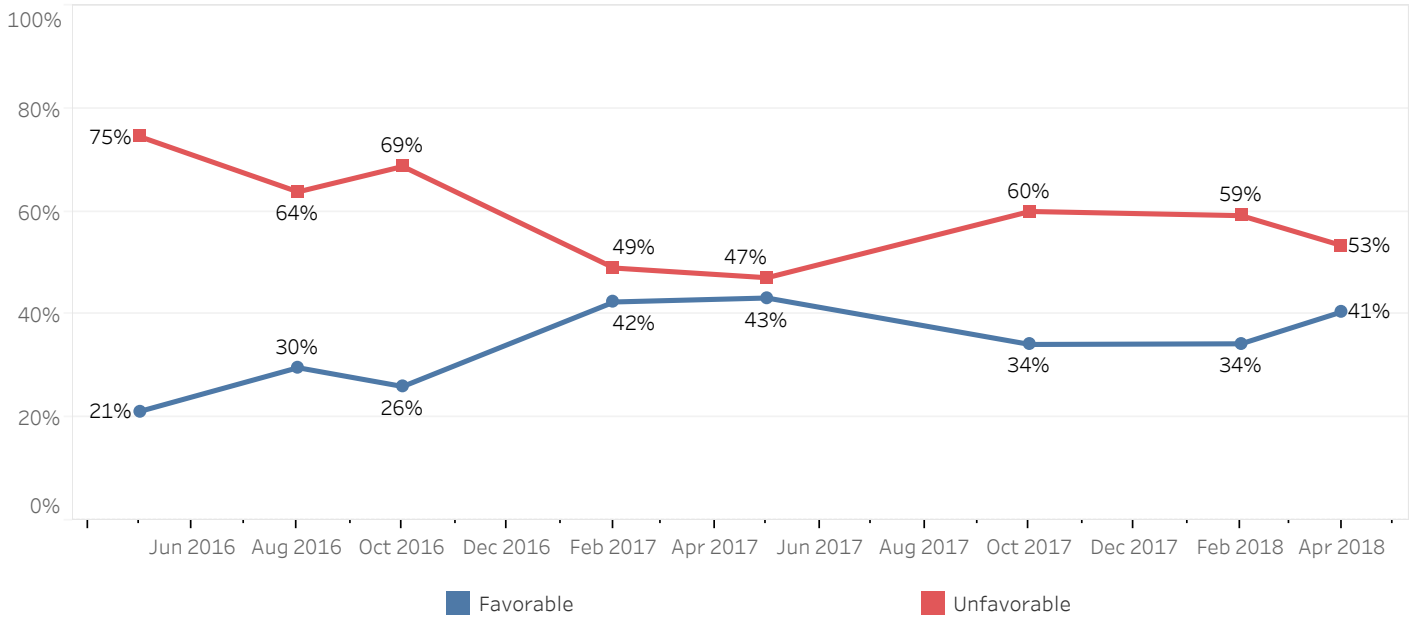


Favorability Ratings - President Donald Trump

Trump's personal favorability rating among New Hampshire adults has somewhat increased since February 2018. Trump is currently viewed favorably by 41% of Granite Staters, 53% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 6% are neutral or don't know enough to say.

Those who voted for Trump in 2016, conservative radio listeners, self-identified Republicans, self-described conservatives, *Union Leader* readers, and gun owners are most likely to have a favorable opinion of Trump. Those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016, self-described liberals, self-identified Democrats, NHPR listeners, Connecticut Valley residents, those who have completed postgraduate work, *Boston Globe* readers, and those 18 to 34 are least likely to have a favorable opinion of Trump.

Favorability - Donald Trump

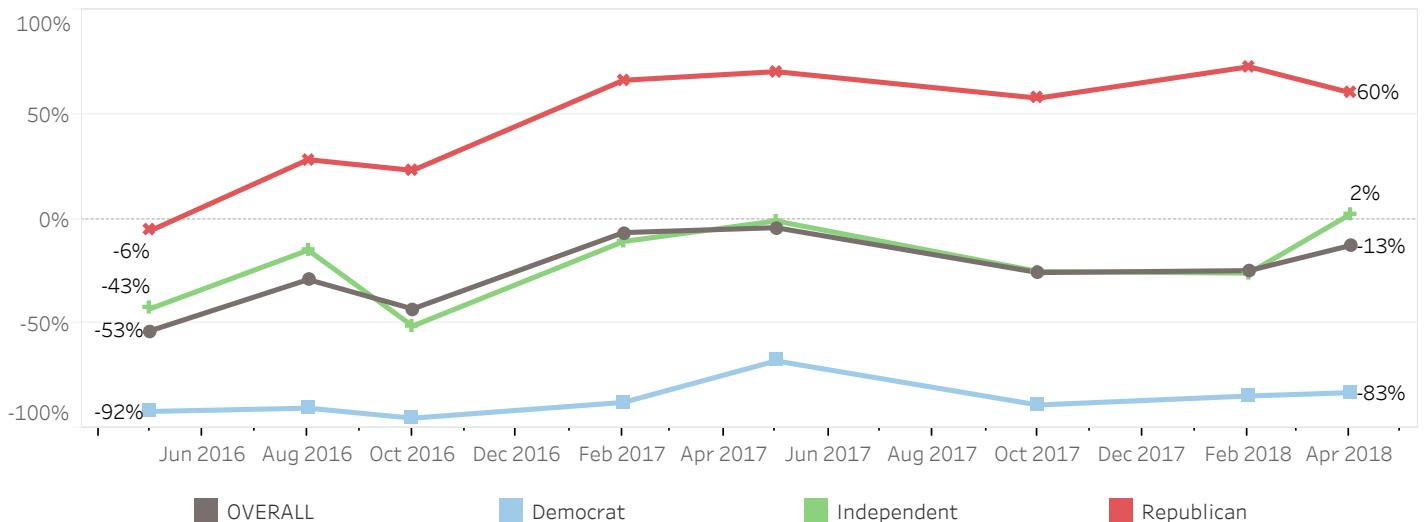


Net Favorability Rating - President Donald Trump

Trump's net favorability rating, the percentage of people who have a favorable opinion minus the percentage who have an unfavorable opinion, is -13%, up since February 2018 (-25%). Trump's popularity among Republicans (+60%) has slightly declined since February (+73%) but his popularity among Independents (+2%) has increased considerably since February (-26%), representing the first time that Independents have had a net positive opinion of Trump. Trump remains very unpopular among Democrats (-83%).

Net Favorability Rating - Donald Trump

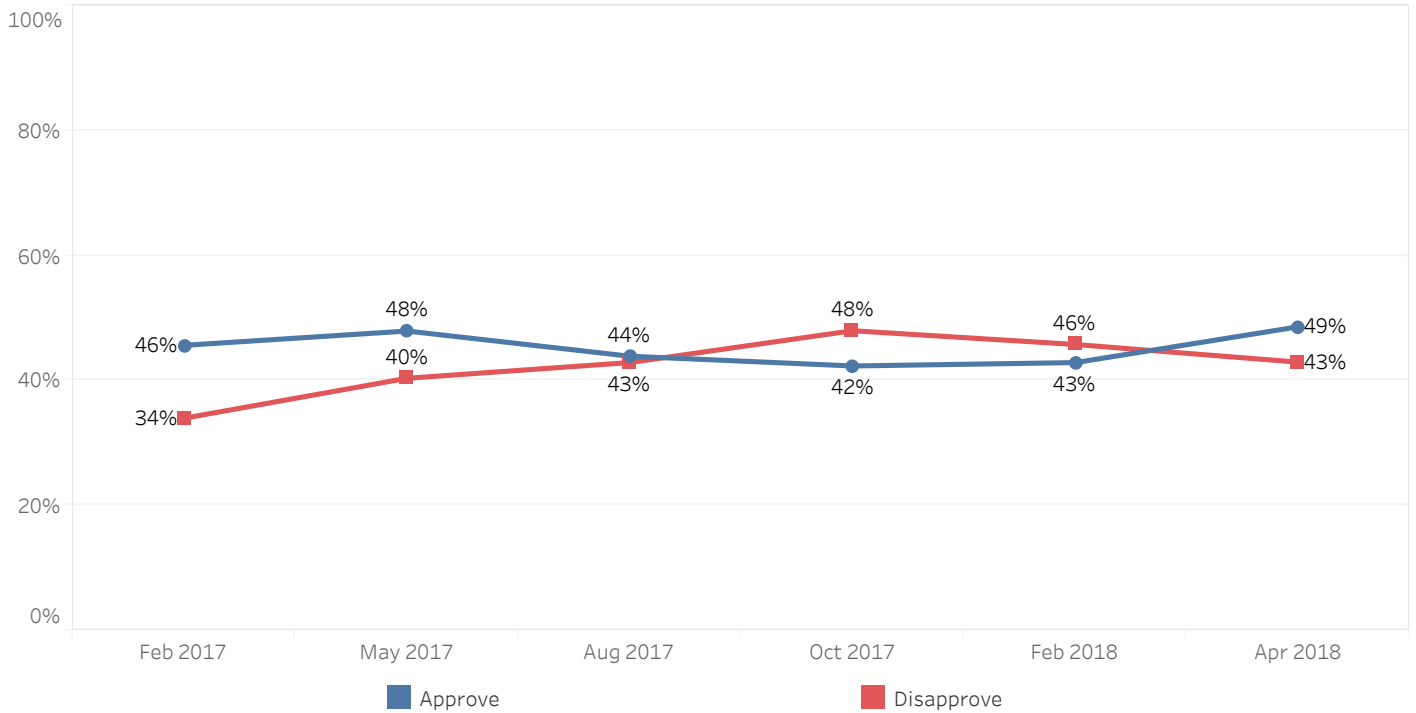
Net Favorability = (% Favorable - % Unfavorable)



Economic Approval

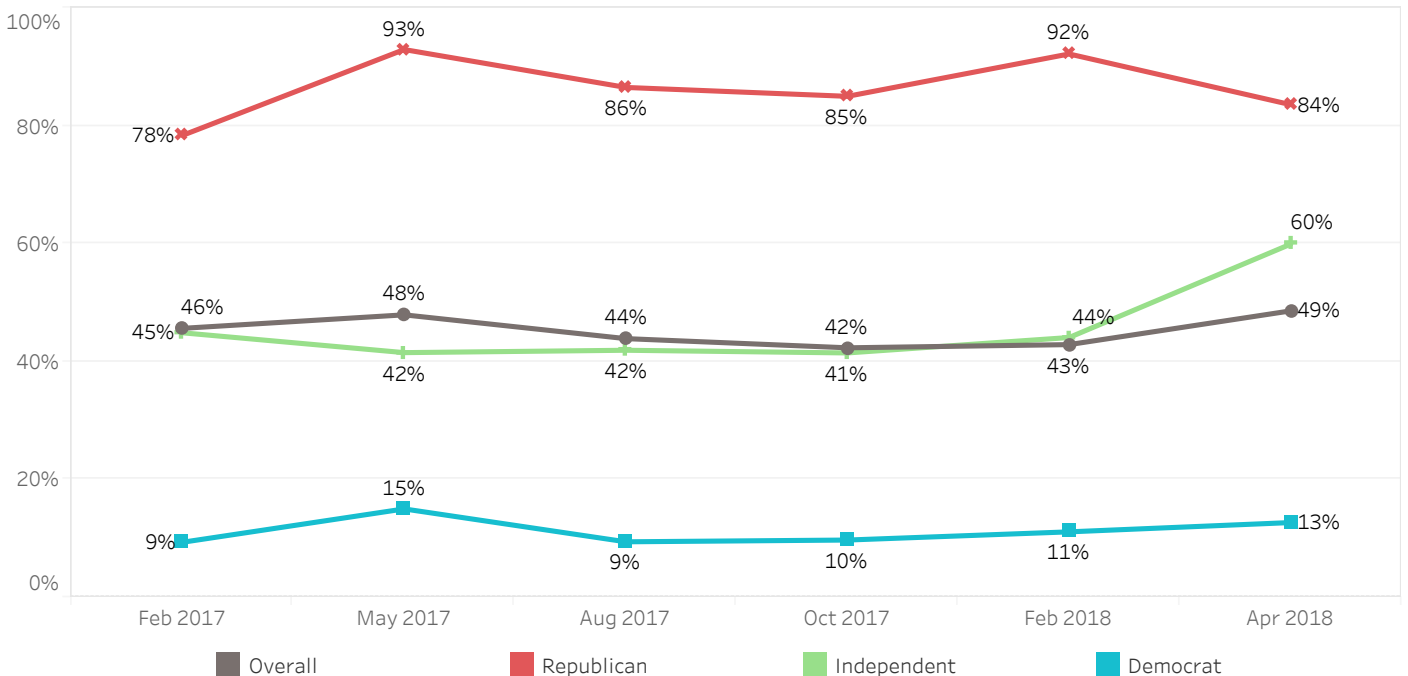
Approval of President Trump's handling of the economy among New Hampshire residents has increased somewhat since February: 49% of respondents currently approve, 43% disapprove, and 8% neither approve nor disapprove or don't know. Approval of Trump's handling of the economy is higher than at any previous point in his presidency.

The vast majority of Republicans approve of Trump's handling of the economy (84%). Six in ten Independents (60%) approve of Trump's handling of the economy, a considerable increase since February (44%), while Democrats (13%) remain much less likely to approve.

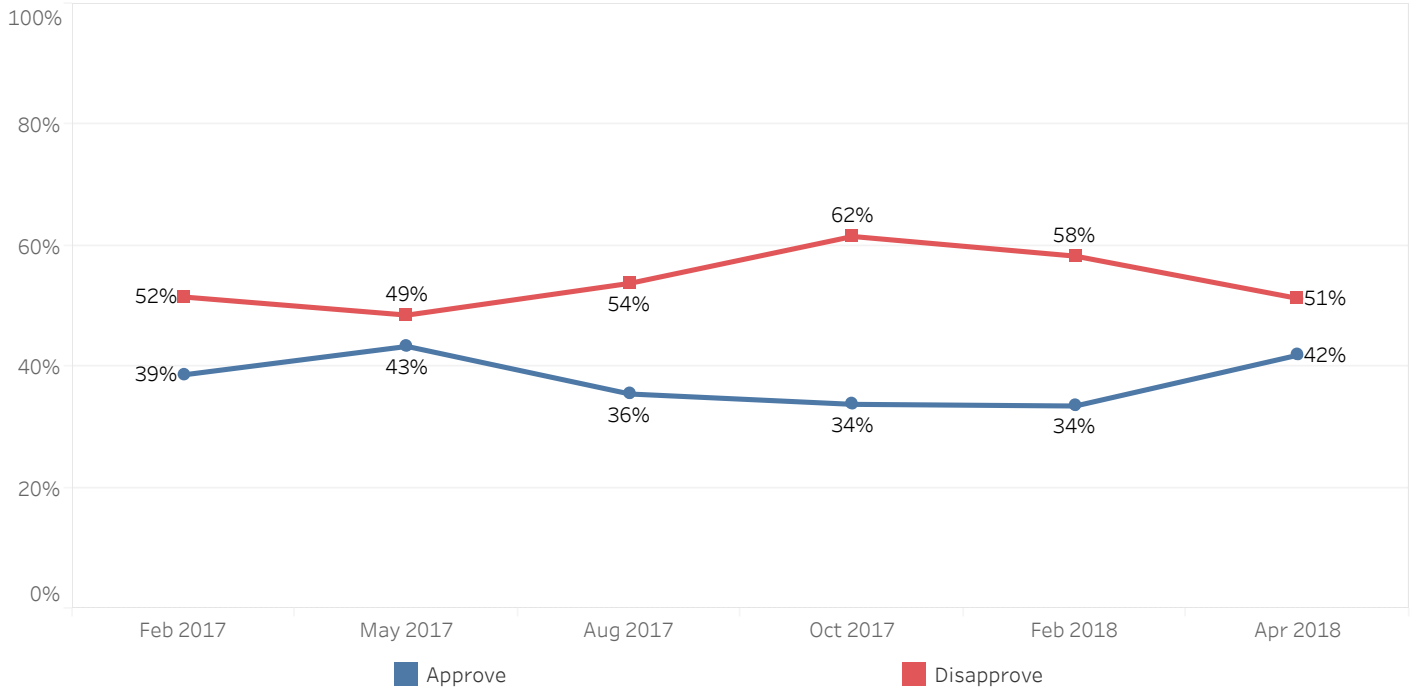
Economic Approval - by Party ID



Foreign Affairs Approval

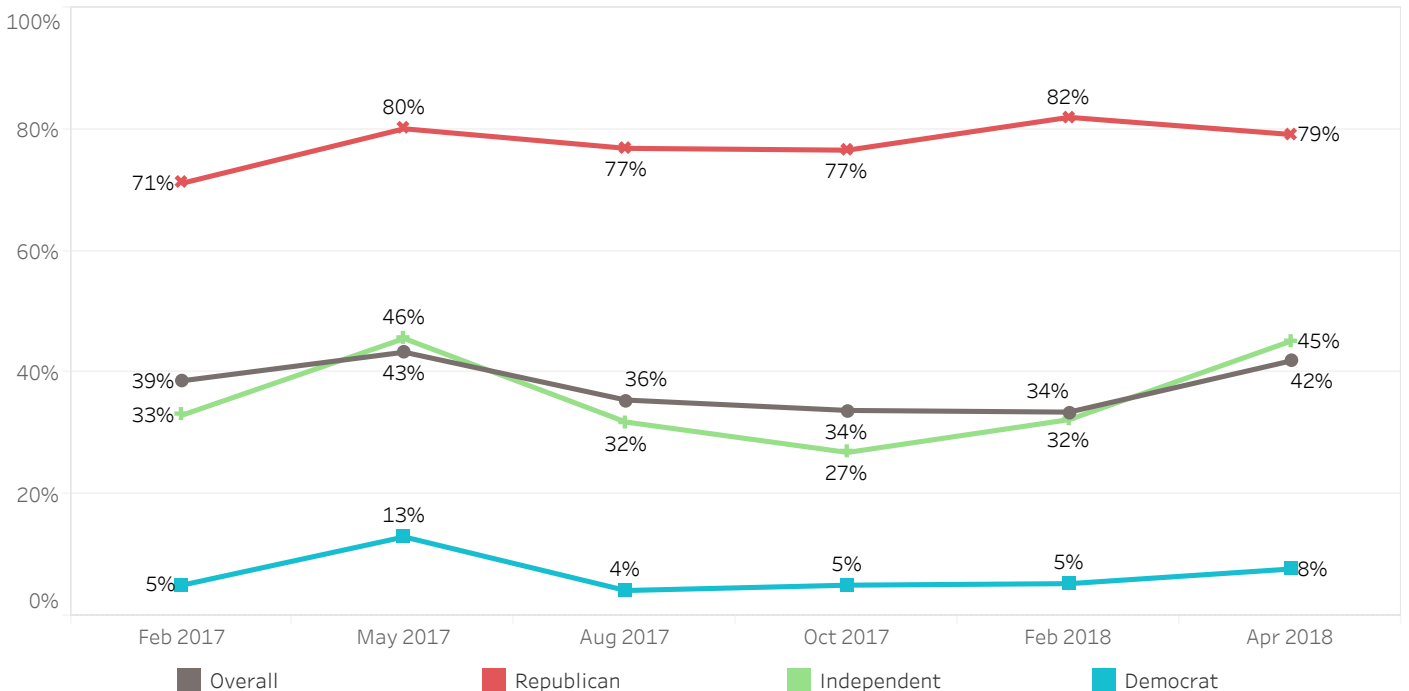
Granite Staters opinion of Trump's handling of foreign affairs has also increased somewhat since February but New Hampshire residents continue to have a lower opinion of Trump's handling of foreign affairs than his handling of the economy. Currently, 42% of New Hampshire adults approve of how Trump is handling foreign affairs, 51% disapprove, and 7% neither approve nor disapprove or don't know.

Seventy-nine percent of Republicans approve of Trump's performance in foreign affairs, while 45% of Independents agree, up from 32% in February 2018. Approval of Trump's handling of foreign affairs among Democrats remains very low (8%).

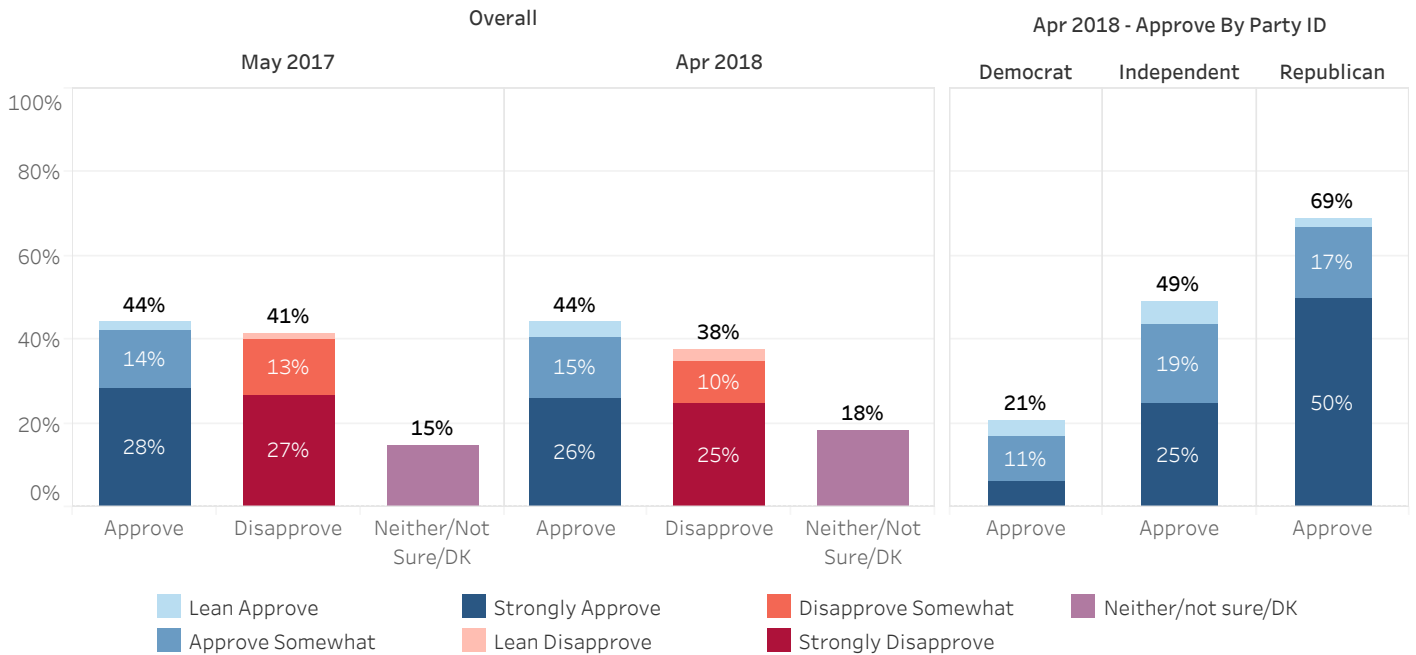
Foreign Affairs Approval - by Party ID



Syria

Granite Staters remain divided in their opinion of how President Trump is handling the situation in Syria. A slight plurality (44%) approve of Trump's handling of Syria, 38% disapprove, and 18% are neutral, not sure, or don't know. Support for Trump's handling of Syria is virtually unchanged from New Hampshire residents' opinion on the issue in May 2017 (44% approve, 41% disapprove). Republicans (69%) are far more likely than Independents (49%) or Democrats (21%) to approve of Trump's handling of the situation in Syria.

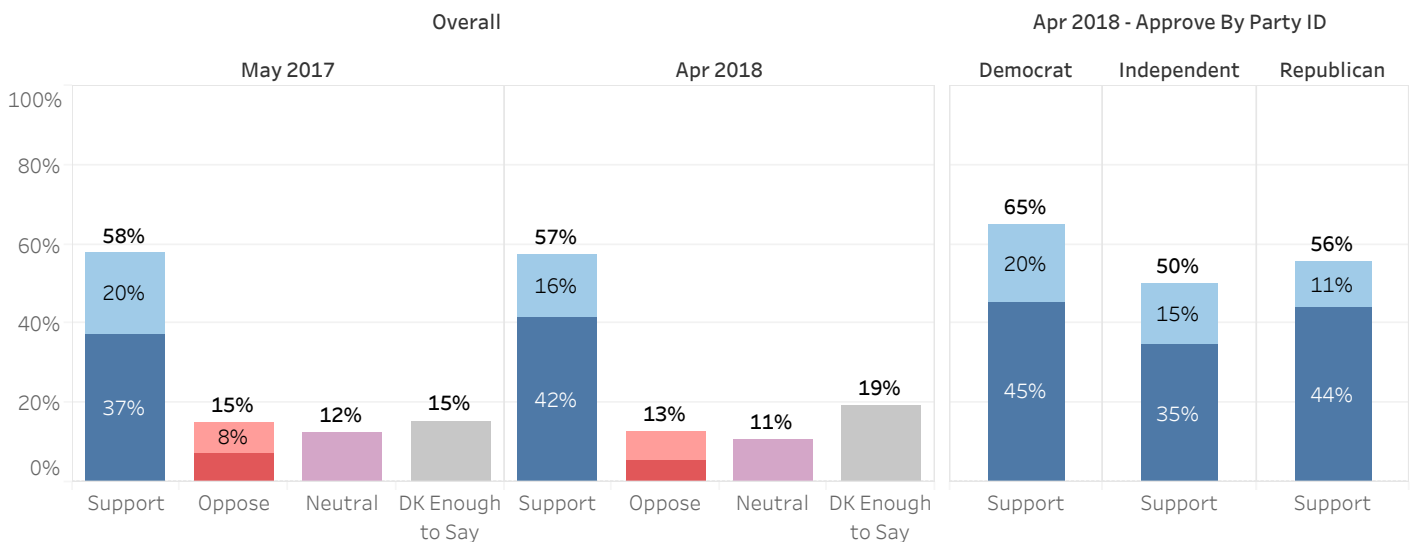
Approval of Trump Handling



Just over half of New Hampshire residents (57%) support the removal of Syrian President Bashar al-Assad, 13% oppose Assad's removal from power, and 30% are neutral or don't know enough to say. Opinion about removing Assad from power is unchanged since May 2017 (58% support removal, 15% oppose).

Unlike most current issues, opinion on removing Syrian President Assad is not closely tied to partisanship: 65% of Democrats, 56% of Republicans, and 50% of Independents support Assad's removal. However, support for the removal of Assad has slightly increased over the last year among Democrats (58% in May 2017, 65% in April 2018) but has slightly declined among Republicans (64% in May 2017, 56% in April 2018).

Support/Oppose Removal of Syrian President Bashar al-Assad

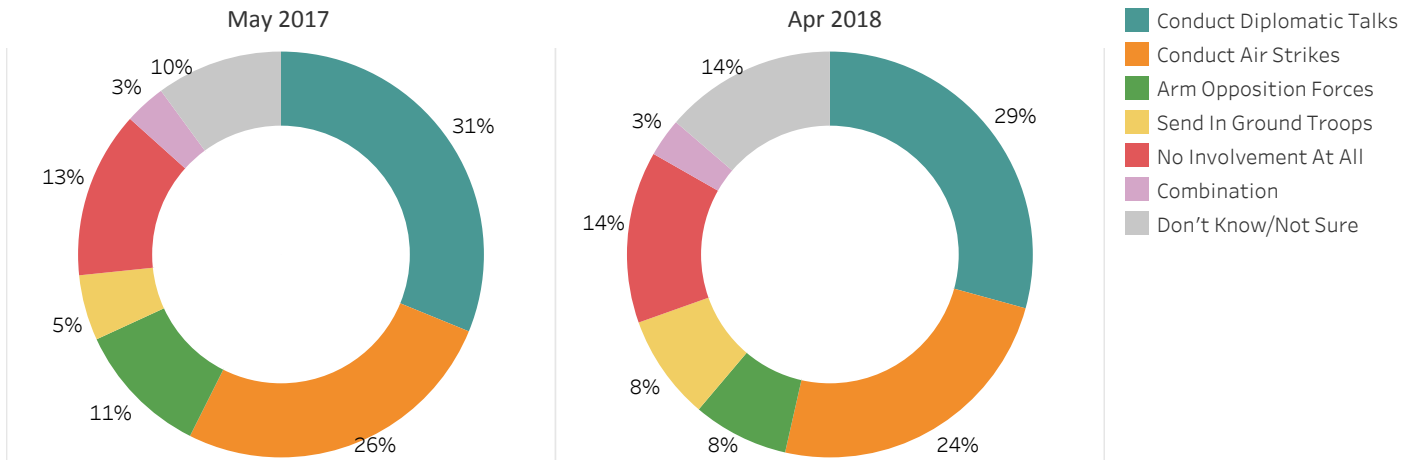


What US Should Do in Syria

Although a majority of New Hampshire residents (57%) support the removal of Syrian President Bashar al-Assad from power, Granite Staters are divided on what specifically the US should do in Syria. When asked which comes closest to their opinion on what should be done in Syria, 29% would like the U.S. to conduct diplomatic talks, 24% want the US to conduct air strikes, and 8% each would like to arm opposition forces or send in ground troops. Fourteen percent would like no US involvement at all, 3% say they would like a combination of these strategies, and 14% don't know or are unsure. Opinion on what the US should do is largely unchanged since May 2017.

Self-identified Republicans and self-described conservatives are more likely than others to prefer the US conduct air strikes, while self-identified Democrats and self-described liberals are more likely to prefer the US conduct diplomatic talks.

Preferred US Option in Syria

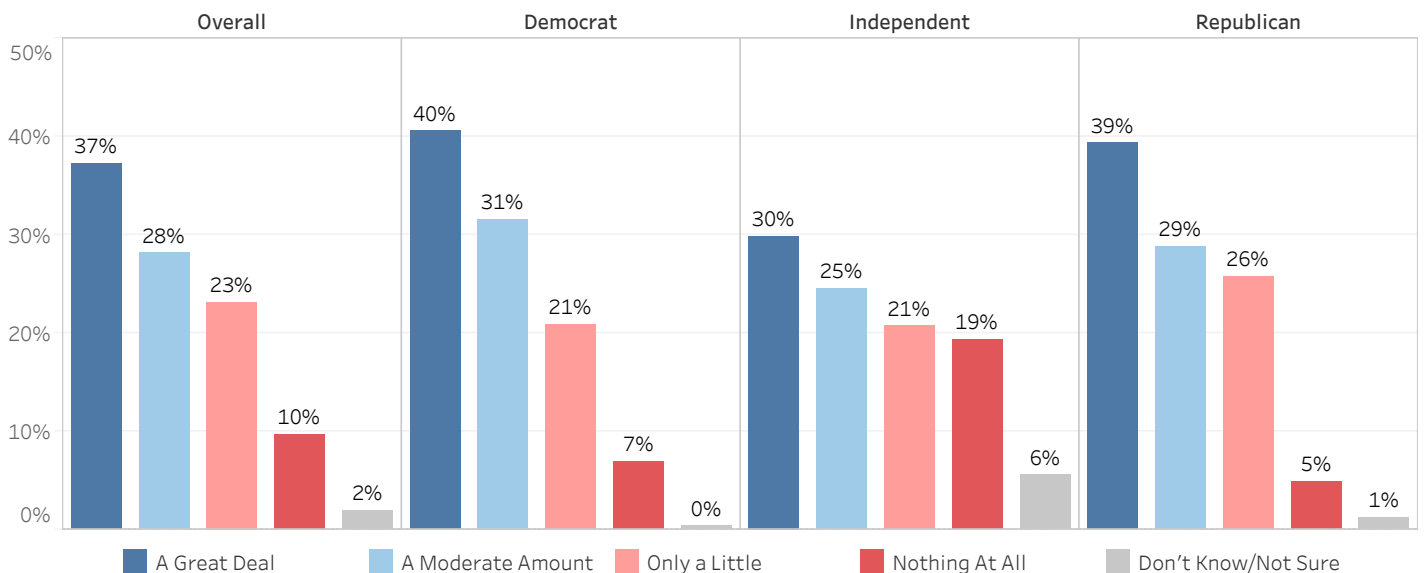


Mueller Investigation

Nearly two-thirds of New Hampshire residents (65%) say they have heard a great deal (37%) or a moderate amount (28%) about the investigation led by Robert Mueller to examine Russian efforts to influence the 2016 US presidential election. Twenty-three percent say they have heard only a little about this, 10% have seen nothing at all, and 2% don't know or are unsure.

Democrats (72%) and Republicans (68%) are equally likely to say they have heard a great deal or a moderate amount about the Mueller investigation, while fewer Independents (54%) say they have heard this much about it.

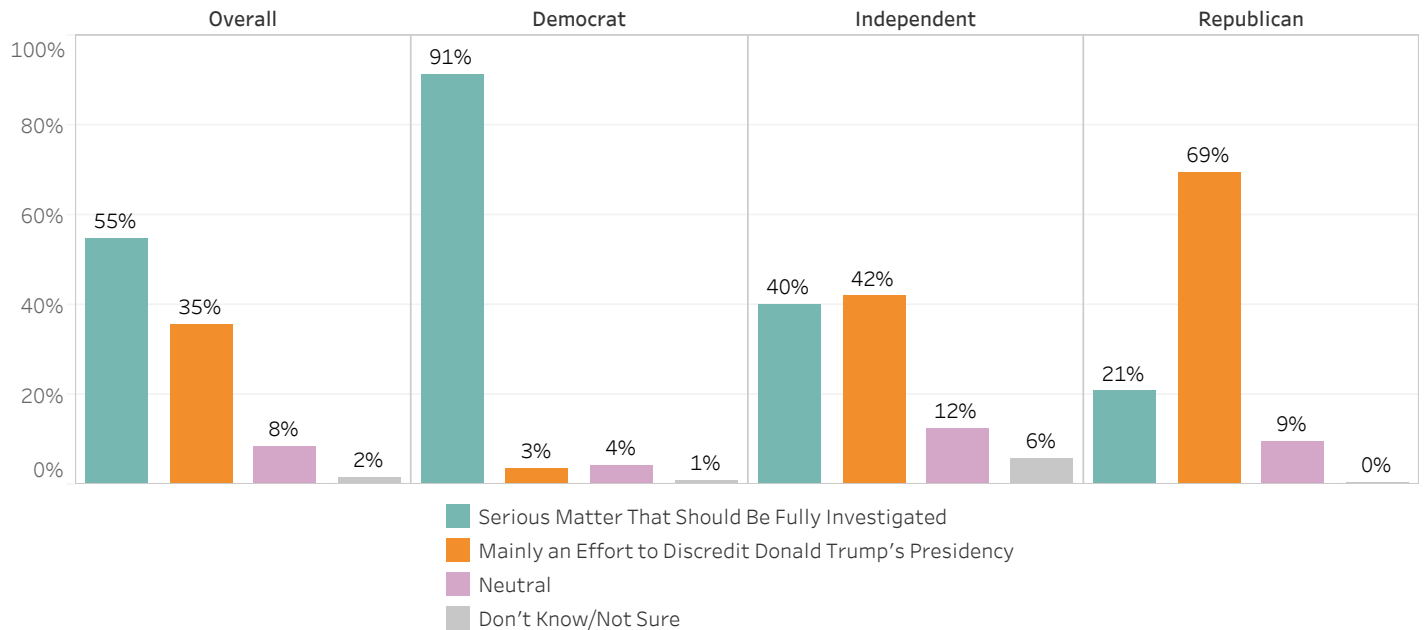
How Much Heard or Seen About Mueller Investigation



Among those who have heard at least a little about the Mueller investigation (N=483), just over half (55%) say it is a serious matter that should be fully investigated, 35% say the investigation is mainly an effort to discredit Donald Trump's presidency, 8% are neutral, and 2% don't know or are unsure.

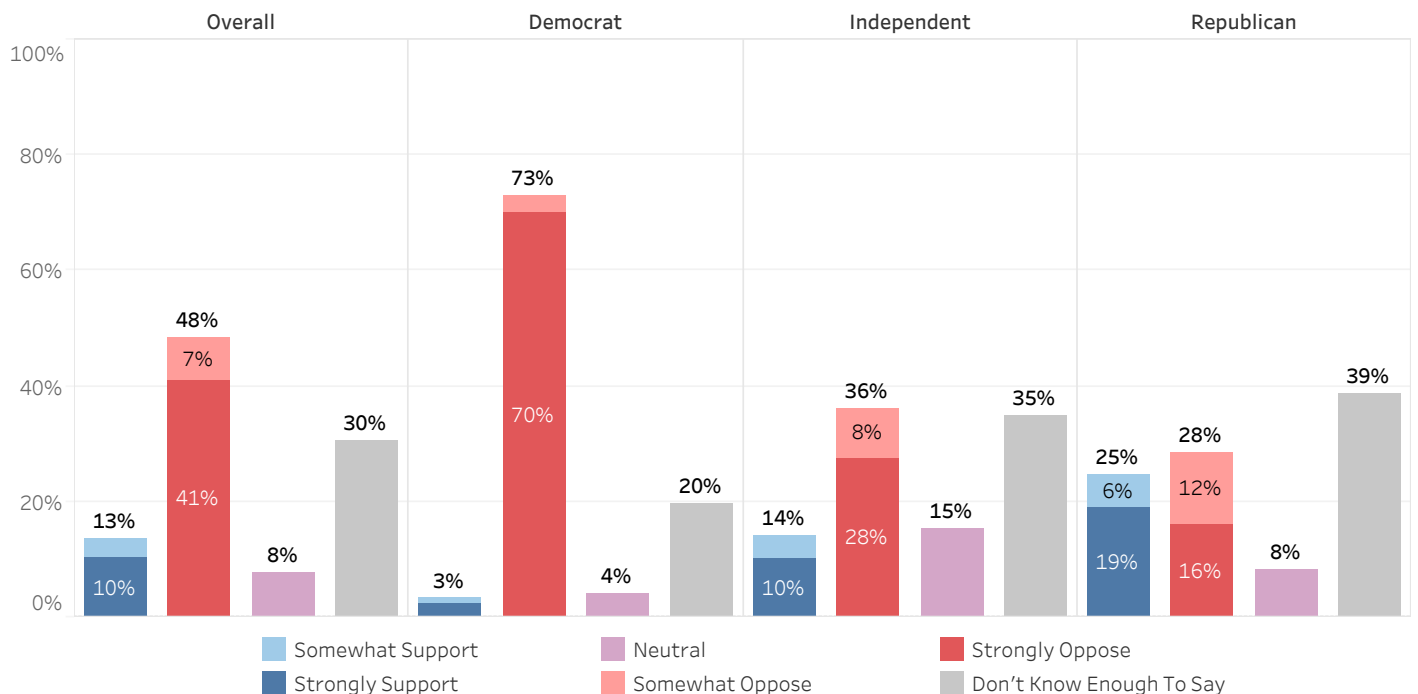
Nearly all Democrats (91%) believe the Mueller investigation is a serious matter that should be fully investigated, while just over two-thirds of Republicans (69%) say it is mainly an effort to discredit Donald Trump's presidency. Independents are divided: 40% say it is a serious matter that should be fully investigated and 42% say it is mainly an effort to discredit Donald Trump's presidency.

Assessment of Mueller Investigation



Among those who have heard at least a little about the Mueller investigation (N=483), only 13% say they would strongly (10%) or somewhat (3%) support President Trump firing Robert Mueller while nearly half (48%) would strongly (41%) or somewhat (7%) oppose his firing. Eight percent of respondents are neutral on the issue while 30% don't know enough to say.

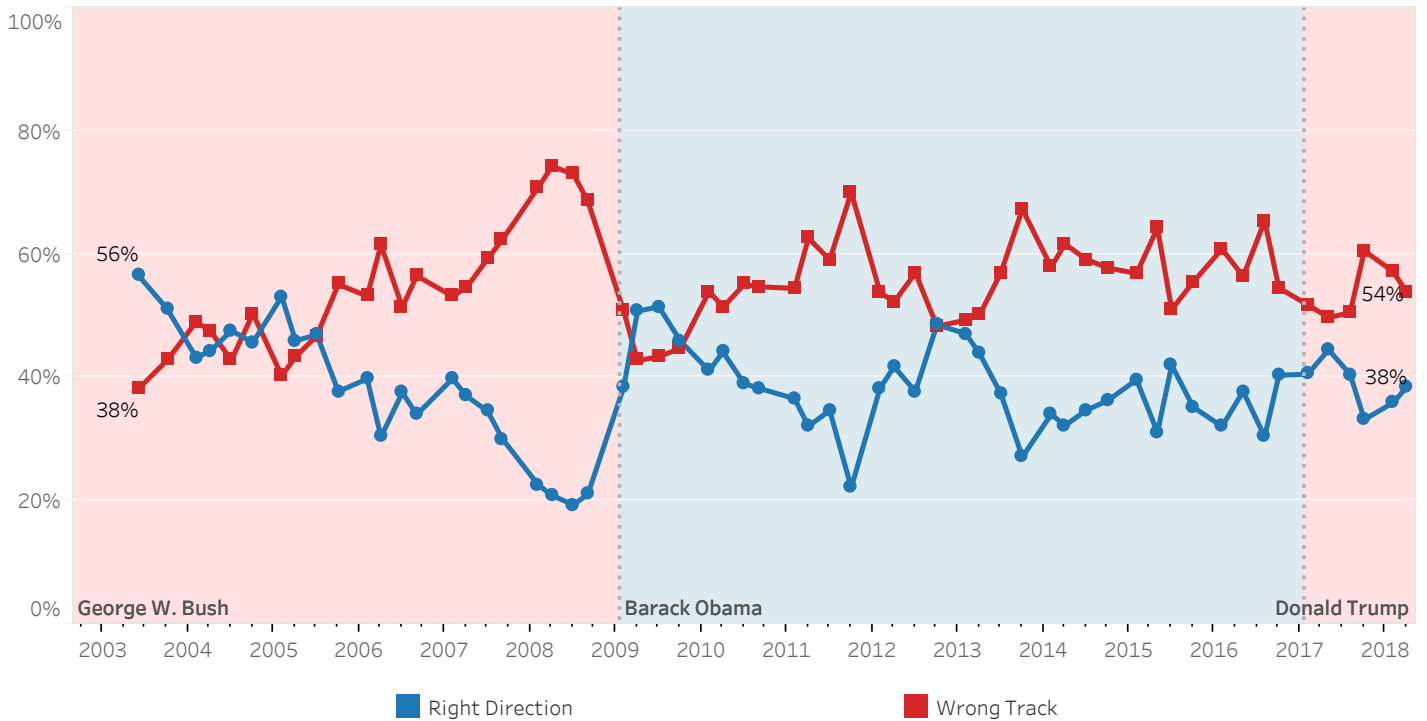
Support/Oppose Trump Firing Mueller



US Heading in Right Direction or On Wrong Track

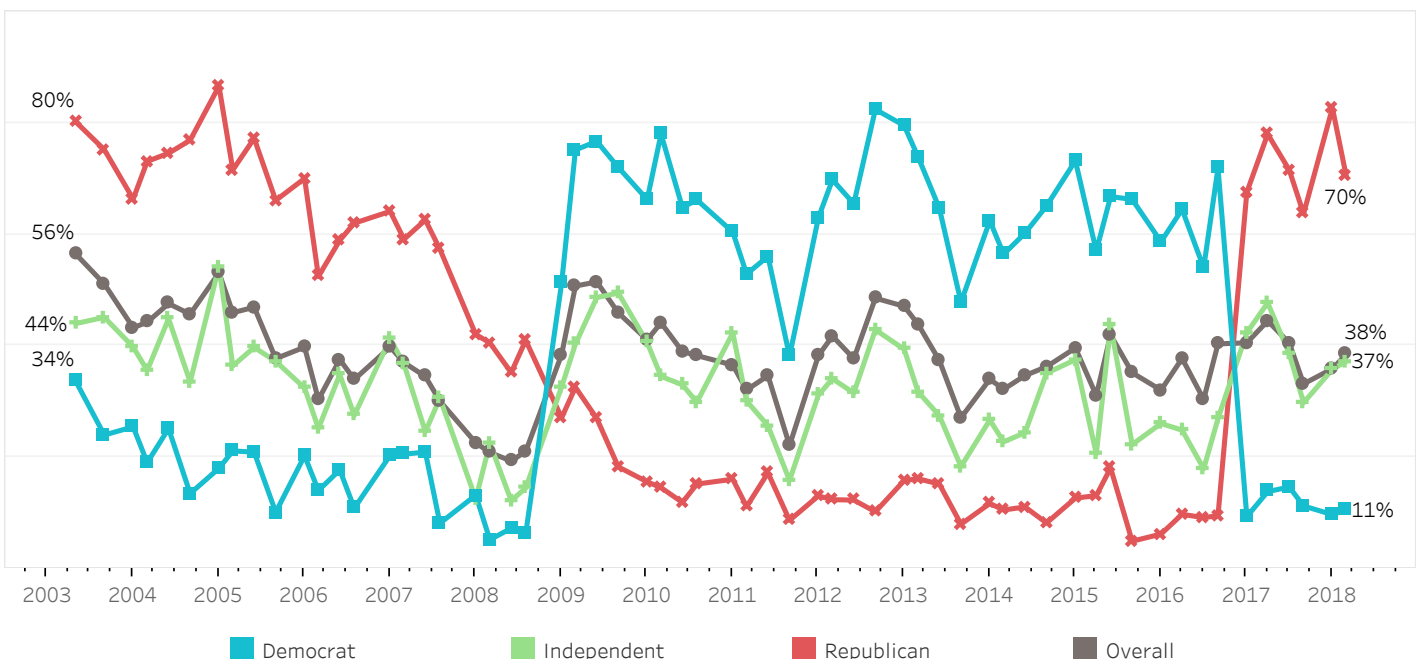
Overall, New Hampshire residents continue to be pessimistic about the direction of the country but are slightly more optimistic than in late 2017. Thirty-eight percent of New Hampshire residents think things in the country are going in the right direction while 54% say things are seriously off on the wrong track and 8% don't know or are unsure.

Opinion about the direction of the country remains closely tied to partisanship. Seventy percent of Republicans believe the country is headed in the right direction but only 37% of Independents and 11% of Democrats agree. Belief among New Hampshire Independents that the country is headed in the right direction (37%) remains higher than in October 2017 (30%).

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and forty-eight (548) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between April 13 and April 22, 2018. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.2 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 1.2%.

The random sample used in the Granite State Poll was purchased from Marketing Systems Group (MSG), Horsham, PA. MSG screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers. When a landline number is reached, the interviewer randomly selects a member of the household by asking to speak with the adult currently living in the household who has had the most recent birthday. This selection process ensures that every adult (18 years of age or older) in the household has an equal chance of being included in the survey.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households. Additionally, data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
