THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Alexandria in the
County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote
in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall
in said Alexandria on Tuesday, the 8th day of March
next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon
the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the
year ensuing, also a delegate to the Constitutional Con-
vention.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be neces-
sary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and
make appropriations of the same.
3. To see how much money the town will raise for
the maintenance of highways and bridges, except snow
work.
4. To see how much money the town will raise
for the breaking of roads in the winter.
5. To see if the town will accept State Aid Con-
struction and raise \$768.00 for same, or will accept Town
Road Assistance (Class 5) and raise \$495.98 for same.
6. To see if town will vote to shingle the Town
Hall and raise money for same.
7. To see if town will vote to raise and appropriate
the sum of \$50.00 to the Lakes Region Association of
New Hampshire for the issuance and distribution of
printed matter calling attention to the resources and
natural advantages of the town in cooperation with other
towns in the Lakes Region.

8. To see how much money the town will raise for Blister Rust control.

9. To change the restrictions now governing the use of the \$300.00 raised in 1935 for use on E. R. A. project.

10. To make any desired change in the membership of the town budget committee.

11. To see what action the town will take in regard to real estate taken over by the town for non-payment of taxes.

12. To see if town will vote to allow a discount on taxes paid early in the season.

13. To see if town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of receipt of taxes.

14. To see how much money town will raise for repairs in Riverside cemetery.

15. To act on any other matters that may legally come before this meeting.

I respectfully submit the following report as School Nurse from Jan. 1, 1937 to Jan. 1, 1938:

Inspection in Alexandria showed the following defects:

- 73 pupils were examined
- 9 pupils were 10% underweight
- 4 pupils showed defective vision, uncorrected
- 3 pupils showed a slight degree of anaemia
- 23 pupils were in need of dental care
- 9 pupils had enlarged or diseased tonsils
- 3 pupils had defective breathing
- 1 pupil was in a nervous condition
- 48 visits were made in schools
- 20 visits were made in homes.

Two pupils of the Village School had their glasses changed during the school year.

Eye defect at No II school corrected privately.

Boy at No. II school taken to Dr. Dunbar's office, Lebanon, for eye examination and fitted with glasses. Funds were received from the Bristol Rotary Club.

Girl from Riverside school taken to Dr. Dunbar's office, Lebanon, for eye examination and fitted with glasses.

Girl from Village School taken to Cripple Children's clinic at Memorial Hospital. X-ray was taken of affected leg and an examination. Taken to Elliot Hospital in Manchester in May for operation. Funds were received from Cripple Children's Society of Manchester.

A Dental Clinic was held at Dr. Sargent's office in Bristol. Funds were received from an school entertainment. Twenty-five pupils attended the clinic, 17 received free care.

I wish to express my appreciation to the Members of the School Board, Mr. Freese, Grange and to thank the parents and teachers for their daily cooperation in making possible the health program.
