TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Chatham, N. H., in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affiairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Chatham on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute blank inventories at the time they appraise property to be taxed.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to have the road agent plow the dooryards.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid Construction on North Chatham road and raise and appropriate \$259.50 for said purpose to match \$1,000.00 from State.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5.00 to make up the deficit of Miss LeVecque's budget, as per letter.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$19.00 for Town's share of cooperative participation in the White Mountains Region Association.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the Town road from the National Forest Camp grounds to the Carlton Place.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the portion of old road bed at Charles Brook bridge outside of new road limits.

10. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

To the School Board and Citizens of Chatham:

Mrs. Lena L. Chambers who taught at Green Hill last year resigned during the summer and Esther P. Baker of Colebrook was chosen to fill the vacancy. Mrs. Baker is a graduate of Plymouth Normal school and has had successful experience. Miss Charles and Miss Chandler continue at the Eastman and Center schools. All three schools are well organized and well taught.

The state aid item for next year is tentatively \$2,187. The amount of the per capita tax is \$74. The amount of the \$5 tax on the new equalized valuation \$966.40 but the district will raise more than that amount in order to balance the budget for the elementary schools. The exact amount necessary will be known definitely before the annual school meeting on March 14.
