

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of East Kingston in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said East Kingston on Tuesday, the 11th day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$75.00 for Memorial Day purposes.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the library.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for forest fire equipment; the State to match by equal amount.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$155.23 against the State appropriation of

\$620.92 for Class V road assistance. No Town may receive both Class V and State Aid in same year.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$490.50 against the State appropriation of \$1,000.00 for State Aid construction; this sum to be expended on the East Road.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to purchase a piece of land from Mrs. Bessie B. Monahan for the purpose of straightening the East Road.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate an extra sum of money than stated in Article 8, against the State appropriation, if the State wishes to complete construction on East Road.

11. To see if the Town will vote to take from the Town maintenance appropriation, money for seal coat of tar on roads tarred last year.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money extra for the purpose of seal coat of tar on roads tarred last year.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for equipment (not uniform) for the Chief of Police.

14. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of placing screens on the doors and windows of Town Hall.

16. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
