SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Errol School Board:

I hereby submit for your consideration my ninth annual report of the Errol schools.

Teachers

At the close of the year, June 1942, we lost two of our teachers. Theodore Lylis, headmaster, planned to enter the U.S. Army and Louise Pulsifer, Home Economics teacher, went to a similar position in the Plymouth High School which is not far from her home and from which she graduated before going to college. The vacancies were filled as follows: Charles T. Cummings as headmaster from East Longmeadow, Mass., and Daphne Hurlbert, a graduate of the University of New Hampshire as high school assistant and teacher of Home Economics. Headmaster Cummings resigned during the fall term, to take effect at the close of the term, December 18, 1942. Irving C. Lewis, Eliot, Maine, was secured to fill the vacancy. Mr. Lewis has had considerable experience and the work is starting off very well under his guidance.

Enrollment

The registration, this year, is as follows: Grade 1—13; Grade II—5; Grade III—7; Grade IV—5; Grade V—8; Grade VI—6; Grade VII—5; Grade VIII—3; Grade IX—10; and Grade X—3. The total is 65. This number includes 15 from Wentworth's Location and 8 from Millsfield.

Perfect Attendance

The following children were not absent or tardy during the year: viz., Jacqueline Bean, Richard Leach, Jean Lizotte, Arthur Muise, Raymond Muise, Muriel Turner and Janice Warger.

Graduates

The following children completed the work of the tenth grade on June 11, 1942: viz., Harriette Louise Turner, Janice Arlene Warger, Murry David McNeal, and Harvey Berl Raymond.

Transportation

The eight Millsfield children and 12 Errol children are transported by James Jordan and the 15 from Wentworth's Location by Clayton Turner. Dennis Ferren transports his own children from Upton Hill road.

Supplies and Equipment

The supplies for the schools are purchased in connection with those of the other districts in the union. By so doing, we get a better price on most of the material as well as a saving on the transportation. The liquid duplicator purchased last year is proving a valuable piece of equipment.

Health

The medical examination required of all school children was made by Miss Nellie E. Stone, R. N., school nurse, Colebrook. I am unable to give a result of the examination because she has not made a report to me.

School Census

The return of the school census taken September 1942 showed 25 boys and 19 girls in town between the ages of 5 and 16. Two between 5 and 8, were reported not in school. The total number of resident children accounted for in school was 42. This is seven more than last year.

Statistics

Data gleaned from last year's registers are as follows: The schools were in session 36.4 weeks net;

total registration 66, of this number 26 were non resident pupils—9 from Millsfield and 17 from Wentworth's Location; the per cent of attendance was 96.43; 7 pupils had a perfect record of attendance for the year; 25 tardy marks were recorded, which is two more than the previous year; 8 visits were made to the schools by the school board members; 350 visits by citizens; 148 teacher visits were credited to the superintendent; and three school board meetings were held during the year.

Home Economics and Manual Arts

Some good work has been done by the Home Economics girls. The Manual Arts program has been rather meager owing to the difficulty in finding a teacher who has had the training. However, some work has been attempted.

Conclusion

The extra curricula activities, that have been so much enjoyed by the student body, have been curtailed to some extent owing to war conditions.

Special help periods are maintained with an endeavor to keep all pupils up to a reasonable standard of efficiency. The pupils, for the most part, appreciate the fact that a time in the program is arranged so that they may get the needed assistance.

Noon lunches are carried on as in previous years.
