Town Meeting Warrant (As Known February 20th)

Article 1. To hear reports of committees and agents and act on same and to choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the year ensuing and to make appropriations for the same.

Article 3. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate for the Abbie Greenleaf Library, for the salary of the librarian, for the maintenance of highways and bridges and for lighting our streets for the year ensuing.

Article 4. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate for Memorial Day and to choose an agent to expend same.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to apply for State Aid for our highways for the ensuing year and to raise and appropriate money for same.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to allow a discount for early payment of taxes.

Article 7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate money to pay note on Lafayette Brook Bridge due January 1st, 1937.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money to pay note on fire-pumper due July 23rd, 1936.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money to eradicate the Pine Blister Rust. Article 10. To see what action, if any, the Town will take in regard to an aviation field.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$500. for advertising and promoting winter sports.

Article 12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate money to repair the gymnasium.

Article 13. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to complete the bridge over Glover Brook on the Wells Road.

Article 14. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's Deeds.

Article 15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the budget act.

Article 17. To see if the 'Town will vote to extend lights from Forest Hills to Professor J. H. Beals'.

Article 18. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to dispose of the gravel pit near the Lisbon Line.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue that portion of the so-called Hart-Bodwell Road that extends northeasterly from an iron stake at the corner of the land known as the Nelson Farm.

Article 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Superintendent's Report

To the School Board and Citizens of Franconia.

The enrollment in your schools last year was 152, the average membership 134.75 and the per cent of attendance 94.17. This year the enrollment is 135 distributed as follows: senior high school 43, junior high school 17, grades 5 and 6, 24; grades 3 and 4, 31; and grades 1 and 2, 20. There are 11 tuition pupils in high school and 13 in the grades.

Miss Catherine Reuell resigned her position last spring because of ill health and Miss Elizabeth Massie of Penacook succeeded her as teacher of English and history. Miss Massie is a graduate of Middlebury College and has had three years of successful experience in the high school at Twin Mountain.

The school district voted last March to add another teacher for the elementary grades. As a result of that decision we have made the extra room on the second floor of the Academy building into a class room which is being used by the high school. The room formerly used as a recitation room by the high school is now being used as a class room for grades three and four. Miss Florence Blanchard of Meredith is teaching these grades. Miss Blanchard is a graduate of the three year elementary course at Keene Normal School and has had two years of experience in a rural school at Easton. Increasing the number of teachers in the first six grades has greatly improved the efficiency of your schools and is well worth the extra cost. Miss Blanchard is also teaching music in both the other elementary rooms. I feel that she has been very successful in this work and that her pupils are making real progress in both the knowledge and appreciation of music.

Very extensive repairs were made on the Academy building during the summer. The building was painted on the outside and the basements on the inside. New ceilings were placed on two rooms down stairs and a new set of grates was placed in the boiler. New electric lighting fixtures were installed in all the grooms of the building. You have now one of the best lighted school buildings of the state. The only needed major improvement in your building next year is more heat in the science laboratory.

The ladies of the Greenleaf Civics Club have again made it possible this winter to have hot dishes for those pupils who must remain at school for lunch.

Milk is still being given to those pupils who are more than ten per cent under weight.

Through the generosity of Mr. Joel Coffin assisted by Mr. Roland Peabody it has been possible to equip about forty pupils with ski equipment at a cost of only five dollars for each pupil. The School Board through the Franconia Ski School has provided lessons for all pupils who had equipment.

Mr. Poole again this year made a very generous contribution to the Academy Athletic Association. This made it possible to buy new basketball suits for both boys and girls. Athletics cost money and the proceeds from games do not provide sufficient funds to carry on your present program. The School Board has made provision in their budget to assist in meeting this expense.

We expect to close the school year without a deficit for the first time in several years. This is being done in spite of the fact that we had to pay for two large unforeseen expenditures, the new grates and the new ceilings.

I wish to thank the members of the School Board tor their support and the teachers for their cooperation.
