

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Gorham, in the County of Coos, in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in Municipal Hall on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To elect one selectman for three years, and to choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- Art. 2 To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.
- Art. 3 To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for winter roads.
- Art. 4 To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for water and sewer maintenance.
- Art. 5 To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.
- Art. 6 To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for police for the ensuing year.
- Art. 7 To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library .
- Art. 8 To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the District Nursing Association .
- Art. 9 To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the skating rink.
- Art. 10 To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for parks.
- Art. 11 To see what sum the town will vote to appropriate from funds on hand for the retirement of Cascade Water Bonds.
- Art. 12 To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the retirement of Municipal Building Bonds.
- Art. 13 To see if the town will vote to appropriate from funds on hand sufficient money together with what is in the Gorham Savings Bank, to retire ten of the Municipal Water Bonds.
- Art. 14 To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the American Legion.

Art. 15 To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Dumping Ground.

Art. 16 To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for town charges.

Art. 17 To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking the inventory.

Art. 18 To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, when such debts are incurred and expressly made payable therefrom by such vote. And to see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to apply to the Governor and Council for assistance in financing the needs of the town, as provided by Chapter 63 of the laws of 1933, or any amendment made hereto.

Art. 19 To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Cemeteries.

Art. 20 To see if the town will vote to allow a discount of two percent on all property taxes paid to the tax collector before August 1, 1937.

Art. 21 To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of a new piano for the Town Hall.

Art. 22 To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Band Concerts.

Art. 23 To see what sum the town will vote to raise anl appropriate for a skating rink and swimming pool at Cascade.

Art. 24 To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to have available in case any W. P. A. project can be secured for the town, in accordance with the recommendations of the Budget Committee.

Art. 25 To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for advertising purposes, to be divided as follows: Advertising and Recreation; Rest Room and Information Bureau.

Art. 26 To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for an automobile for the use of the Police.

Art. 27 To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate in addition to the \$700 already on hand, for the purpose of building a sidewalk on the overhead bridge at Cascade.

Art. 28 To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to issue not exceeding \$40,000 bonds of the town for the acquisition of land for its water shed, being part of its water supply system.

Art. 29 To see what action the town will take on the petition for a concrete sidewalk on Howland Avenue.

Art. 30 To see if the town will vote to put a sewer on

Cross Street to accommodate three houses.

Art. 31 To see what action the town will take on the request for a sidewalk from the last house on Glen Street to the E. Libby & Sons Company store.

Art. 32. To see of the town will approve the acquisition by the United States Government of approximatey 3,642 acres of land situated in the town, forming an additional purchase unit of the White Mountain National Forest, and described as follows:

Starting at a point in the 1929 proclaimed Forest Boundry on the Gorham-Berlin town line at the height of land between Jericho Brook and Tinker Brook.

Thence easterly along the Gorham-Berlin line to the northeast corner of Lot 150 according to the lots as laid out in the town of Gorham.

Thence following in a southerly direction the east lines of Lots 150, 137, 134, 121, 118, and 105 to the southeast corner of Lot 105:

Thence following a westerly direction the south lines of Lots 195, 196, 197, and 198 to the southwest corner of Lot 198;

Thence northerly along the west lines of Lot 108 to the northeast corner of said Lot;

Thence easterly along the north line of Lot 108 to the southwest corner of Lot 116;

Thence northerly along the west line of Lot 116 to the southeast corner of Lot 124;

Thence westerly along the south lines of Lot 124, 125, and 123 to the northeast corner of Lot 112;

Thence southerly along the east line of Lot 112 to the southeast corner of said Lot;

Thence westerly along the south line of Lot 112 to the southwest corner of sail Lot, which is also a point on the Gorham-Randolph town line;

Thence northerly along the Gorham-Randolph town line to a point in the 1929 proclaimed Forest Boundry which is also a point in the height of land between Moose Brook and Jericho Brook;

Thence following easterly and northerly the proclaimed Forest Boundry to the point of beginning;

(Containing 3,642 acres, more or less

Art. 33. To see what action the voters of the town will take on the following question: Is it expedient to revise the Constitution?

Art. 34. To hear the reports of town officers, agents, committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Art. 35. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

A petition was presented for eight Band Concerts to be held during July and August 1937 and the Budget Committee recommend the sum of \$480 be appropriated and raised for this purpose.

On petition requesting the Town to purchase a new piano for the Municipal Hall, the Budget Committee recommend the sum of \$300 be appropriated and raised for this purpose, and that a Committee of five be appointed by the Moderator to make such purchase.

A petition was presented asking the Town provide a skating rink and swimming pool at Cascade and the Budget Committee recommend the sum of \$300.00 be appropriated and raised for this purpose.

There being an unexpended balance of \$1,493.42 from amount raised last year for Dump and picking up Garbage, we recommend the sum of \$800 be appropriated and raised for care of dump this year.

There are two requests for sidewalks, one on Howland Avenue and one from Glen Street to E. Libby Sons' Store.

The Budget Committee do not care to make any recommendations for sidewalks this year.

It is expected the Town will be able to get some W.P.A. Allotment and we have recommended the amount of \$2,200 be appropriated and raised for projets. We recommend from this amount \$200 be used for Church Street drainage and that \$2,000 be made available for use of the Water and Sewer department and from this amount the Sewer on Cross Street be made and the new pipe be laid to the Island so called on Washington Street.

Last year the Town raised \$700 to build a sidewalk on overhead bridge at Cascade. It appears this amount was not sufficient and we recommend an additional amount of \$500 be appropriated and raised for this purpose. We also recommend that the selectmen take this matter up with the Public Service Commission at an early date.

Under advertising we recommend the sum of \$1,500 be appropriated and raised. This is arrived at as follows: Advertising and Recreation, \$1,000. Rest Room and Information Bureau, \$500.

We recommend the sum of \$4,000 be appropriated from funds on hand to retire Cascade Water Bonds.

We recommend that the amount now in the Gorham Savins Bank be used together with an amount appropriated from cash on hand sufficient to take up ten new Municipal Water Bonds during the ensuing year.

We recommend the amount of \$8,626.74 be appropriated and raised for Town Maintenance and from this amount the following streets be built: Church Street and Mallay Avenue.

Also that suitable catch basins be installed to take care of the water at Fred Leeman's Residence on lower Main St. and John Butcher's Residence at Cascade.

We recommend the sum of \$4,000 be appropriated and raised for Winter Roads, this amount to be held until November 1937.

We understand that it is necessary to have either a new Motorcycle or an automobile for Police duty and we recommend the sum of \$700 be appropriated and raised for the purchase of an automobile.

Following is a list of our Budget for the ensuing year, and if no new projects appear other than recommended below our tax rate should be about \$28 per \$1,000.

During the year 1936, there has been more bed-side work than in the preceding year, and the nurse has, as well, given the usual amount of time to school work.

At the request of the State Boarl of Health, the nurse has visited and secured the history of orthopedic cases among children in the district. Information concerning these children has been sent to the State which is planning to conduct an orthopedic clinic later in this vicinity. It s understood that many of these infirmities will receive treatment at the expense of the state.

The New Hampshire Social Service has asked the cooperation of the nurse in compiling information on all State, County, Red Cross or any other recipients of welfare. The real object of this survey is not known to the nurse.

The usual number of defects have been found through examination of the school children, many of whose eyes and teeth require attention. Such physical defects as tonsils, adenoids, etc. are under the inspection of the school physician. As always,

there are not available the funds necessary to treat all these children. The County, however, has assisted to a much greater extent this year than ever before which accounts for the fact that the call for welfare work from the Association has been less urgent than in previous years.

The nurse is most grateful for the cooperation of people of the community, and feels particularly indebted to those who have contributed clothing and other supplies. The Red Cross has been most generous in its donations to the needy of the town.
