TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Greenland in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Greenland on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at 10 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for repairs of highways and bridges.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid for construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate the sum of \$94.29 for said purpose.
- 5. To see what sum the town will raise and appropriate for the support of the Weeks Public Library.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the care of cemeteries.

- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 for the care of parks.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the issuance and distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town, in cooperation with other towns coordinated in the Seacoast Regional Development Association the sum of \$50.00.
- 9. To see if the voters of the town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money on short term notes in anticipation of taxes.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Memorial Day exercises.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to accept the Building Ordinance as submitted by the Town Planning Board, and on file with the Town Clerk.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to renew the lease of the Town Hall to the Greenland Veteran's Improvement Association.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to sell the town tractor and snow plow.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to accept the road which connects the New Cemetery with the Post Road.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 toward the expense of publishing an inventory of the town records of Greenland compiled by the Historical Records Survey.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for the maintenance of the town dump.

- 17. To see if the town will vote to accept as town road the right of way running from the Post Road easterly by the land of Walter E. Dockum and Albert W. Hodges on the North and Ira Stopford, Jr. and Ralph LaRose on the South, said road to be 431 feet long, known as Rolston Ave. (Inserted upon petition of Albert W. Hodges and 11 others.)
- 18. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of Greenland, New Hampshire:

It gives me pleasure to submit to you my annual report as Superintendent of Schools, the twelfth in the series.

At this time last year I reported that the enrollment as of January 1, 1940, in our elementary grades was thirty percent larger than that of the previous year. As you will see in Table I, that enrollment has now grown seventeen percent more to a total, as of January 1, 1941, of 124. We see from Table III that that is the largest enrollment in the last ten years. It is to be expected that we shall have still more pupils by the end of the present school year, for Greenland is an attractive town for homes and the increasing activity of the Navy Yard in this time of preparing for national defense is bringing here more and more families with their children. Much of this year's increase in number has come in the lower grades but it is seen likewise in all of the others. Your quick response in September to the need of providing additional seats, textbooks and materials for all grades, and teaching help in grades one and two, has resulted in uninterrupted sessions of the whole school and in the absorption of the extra load by the teachers, apparently without too great effort.

Since our seating capacity is, however, practically at its limit in three rooms, it is not too early to consider provisional plans for seating and teaching the added number of pupils which the next years may bring us. The enrollment in the high school grades is smaller by only one than last year at this time. Apparently there will not be much change in this condition for a few years, unless business as a whole becomes much better and laws are changed so that youth may go to work sooner. With reference to the greatly increased enrollment in all the grades and to the added cost of maintaining efficient schooling for those who are in these grades, it may, perhaps, be rightly said that the meeting of this cost is one of Greenland's contributions to

the great movement of defense. There can be no doubt that the right kind of education for children of all ages will so condition mind and spirit that children will become good citizens ready to assume adult burdens, thus providing a most important means of defense.

I am glad to report that the general progress which our pupils make both in the Central School and in the Portsmouth High School and Junior High School is good. Our entire program of studies meets all the requirements of the New Hampshire State Board of Education and also fits cur pupils adequately and satisfactorily for entrance into the Portsmouth High School. The usual achievement tests at the end of the last school year in the Central School showed only a very small number who should actually repeat their grades, while the several reports from the Portsmouth schools were evidence that only a small fraction of one percent of the subjects taken by Greenland pupils failed the passing grade. It must ever be the case that new and better ways and more nearly ideal results lie ahead in every human enterprise, schools included. No one knows better than the teacher that perfection of method and approach has never been achieved in the case of every individual pupil. The teachers of the Greenland School work in this spirit and with the zeal of those who continually strive to improve and to do better work. There is, also, in Greenland a particularly fine cooperative spirit between home and school which can result only in the better education of the pupils. I commend both the regular and special teachers and the school nurse to your attention as being worthy of trust and as efficient trainers of youth for life and good citizenship.

Our increased enrollment adds to the problems of adequate care of our building and proper sanitary conditions. It is fortunate for Greenland that the school building with its attractive auditorium is available for community and club purposes, but the many various uses to which it is put make the problem of keeping it clean and sanitary a

large one. We have no difficulty in keeping a warm building but coal fires and ashes demand much time which might well be spent in making all parts of our building—schoolrooms, toilets, kitchen, auditorium—cleaner for our pupils and for all who use the building. This time would be made available for such purposes if oil were used in place of coal. Those who visit the school rarely can hardly realize the blessing we have in our abundant supply of excellent water. If now, it could be so piped to the boys' end of the building as to avoid the boiler room and so arrive at the faucet in a cooler condition, and if a drinking fountain could be provided for the playground, our supply of drinking water would be entirely satisfactory.

I would call your attention to the Statistical Tables, for these present much information about the schools in a concise form. Tables III, IV, and V offer some comparative statistics concerning local schools and those of the districts with which you join in school administration.

The next few years ahead call for the closest cooperation of all agencies in preparing our children for democratic citizenship. We who are immediately charged with this preparation have had the fullest cooperation on the part of all others concerned. We look forward, confident of its continuation and thankful that we have it. We pledge our best efforts in our common enterprise.
