## REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

---

The schools in town have been in session on an average of nearly 27 weeks each; the longest terms we have had for years; thanks for the extra money we got from the state. The schools, as a whole, have had very competent teachers and good progress has been made.

The registers in some of the districts show too many absent and other marks. This condition of things can be prevented by the parents taking a deeper interest in our schools.

The scholar's school days are rapidly passing away and parents should instill into the minds of their children a love for their school so that their children will not have to look back with regret to the many days misspent in the school room.

Educators everywhere are trying to solve the one great problem in regard to the "rural school." They realize that the rural school is not what it used to be, and are trying to find the remedy for such a condition of things. This falling off of interest in the scholar and, it seems to us in the parent as well, is a bad omen for all thoughtful persons to consider.

We have in our town bright and active minds which if they could be aroused in the right direction, would make their mark in the world.

The roll of perfect attendance is better than last year in some of our schools.
