

By the School Board of the Town of Lyman for the Year Ending February 15th, 1894.

Each member of the School Board had the entire charge of two schools each, as follows: Seth W. Miner, schools Nos. 3 and 6; Joseph F. Sherman, schools Nos. 4 and 5; John F. Olin, schools Nos. 1. and 2.

No. 1. — PARKER HILL.

A successful summer term of ten weeks was taught by Miss Gertrude Trevena. The fall term of fifteen weeks was taught by Mr. John H. Monsley of Lyme, N. H. Every scholar whose attendance was good felt the inspiration of his thorough discipline, wise counsel, judicious, untiring instruction and made rapid progress in their studies.

No. 2. — Clough Hill.

Miss Laura Clough taught an excellent Summer term of ten weeks. The fall term of eleven weeks was taught by Miss Gertrude Trevena. The scholars showed good advancement. Permit us to urge parents, with all the emphasis possible, to take a deeper interest in the moral, mental and physical welfare of their children.

No. 3. — MOULTON HILL.

Summer term taught by Miss Nell F. Lang of Bath; fall term taught by Miss Minnie Hastings of Bath. Good work was accomplished each term and success attained in a marked degree. Map drawing was a commendable feature.

No. 4. — TINKERVILLE.

The summer term of ten weeks was taught by Miss Florence Bishop. The closing examination showed good improvement. The fall term of fifteen weeks was taught by Miss Jennette Knights, and was a decided success.

No. 5. - Pond.

The summer term of ten weeks was taught by Miss Jennie Whitcher, and the fall term of fifteen weeks was taught by Mrs. Minnie L. Ash. These terms were both very successful.

No. 6. — Under the Mountain.

Summer term was begun by Miss Cora Dearth of Bath, who came here well recommended and might have carried the whole term through successfully if she had devoted proper attention to her school duties, but persisted in neglecting them and was dismissed. Fall and winter terms taught by Miss Gertrude Hastings of Bath. Both terms were highly successful and satisfactory.

The number of children in town between the ages of five and fifteen years, as reported by the selectmen, was: 52 boys, 51 girls; total 103.

The number of scholars over five years of age who have attended our schools not less than two weeks during the year was 107.

Number of visitors for the year, 166.

It is gratifying to report a prosperous school year, to see the steps in advance that have been made, opening the way to higher and grander attainments. In submitting this report I wish to thank you as parents and citizens for the cooperation you have given and the interest you have taken in our schools, especially in those that have been under my care.
