SUMMARY OF ACTION TAKEN ON ARTICLES IN

1975 TOWN WARRANT

The 1975 Town Meeting was opened by Moderator Robert Johnson at 10 A.M. on March 8, 1975.

1. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

Motion made and seconded to decrease Municipal District Court Expenses from \$1,000. to \$250. and to transfer Public Employment Plan into Town Officers Expenses. Article adopted as moved for a total sum of \$63,859.99 by affirmative voice vote.

2. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for interest on same.

Adopted by affirmative voice vote.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,492.00 for the Northwood Public Libraries.

Adopted by affirmative voice vote.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for Recreation, Parks and Playgrounds.

Adopted by affirmative voice vote.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$830.00 for the care of cemeteries.

Adopted by affirmative voice vote.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Highways.

The sum of \$32,457.50 was voted by affirmative voice vote.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,100.00 for the purpose of Street Lighting.

Robert Bailey moved to amend to read \$2,600.00. Voted by hand vote: Yes, 68 - No, 53.

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8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$688.02 for the purpose of Town Road Aid, the State's share to be \$4,586.82.

Adopted by affirmative voice vote.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$505.00 for the Concord Hospital.

Adopted by affirmative voice vote.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for Ambulance Service, to be paid to the Center Barnstead Fire Department.

Adopted by affirmative voice vote.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,980.00 for the Town's per capita share of Rural District Health Council.

Adopted by affirmative voice vote.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,450.00 for the purpose of supporting the Northwood Community Action Program. (Submitted without recommendation of Budget Committee).

Jean Lane amended to reduce sum to \$1,500. Hand vote: Yes, 62 - No, 45. Adopted. Motion to reconsider original article and amendment proposed was made at afternoon session. Yes and No Ballot: Yes, 65 - No, 59 passed article as amended after motion to reconsider did not prevail.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the purpose of increasing the Highway Equipment Capital Reserve Fund.

Adopted by affirmative voice vote.

14. To see if the Town will vote to borrow the sum of \$70,000.00 for the purchase of an incinerator to be used to burn rubbish at the dump, together with the erection of a 40' x 60' building, including the concrete necessary for the erection and placement of the incinerator and building. The sum of \$70,000.00 to be repaid over a ten year period. The first payment to be in 1976.

Article amended ... As the State Legislature has given a year's leeway on the matter, this article to be sent back to Committee, with the recommendation that the Committee look into going into the matter with surrounding towns on a share-and-pay basis, and further, that this article shall be placed on the agenda for next year's Town Meeting. Adopted as amended by affirmative voice vote to postpone. 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,100.00 for maintenance of the Town Dump and Incineration program.

Amendment to raise sum to \$6,600. was defeated. Adopted by affirmative voice vote for sum of \$6,100.00.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$81.00 as requested by the State Forestry Department for the support of the Pine Blister Rust Program.

Adopted by affirmative voice vote.

17. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a vehicle to be used as a police cruiser at the cost of \$5,500.00, the Town to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,300.00, and the State to contribute the sum of \$2,200.00 from their Crime Prevention Program.

Defeated by Yes and No Ballot: Yes, 78 - No, 98. Motion to reconsider did not prevail by Yes and No Ballot: Yes, 93 - No, 129, Blank, 1.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,900.00 for the Northwood Rescue Squad.

Adopted by affirmative voice vote.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$220.00 to replace the same amount expended from the Cancer Fund in 1974.

True Chesley stated the State Tax Commission Office advised that a fund for Cancer was illegal, so the suggestion was made to transfer this sum to Town Poor under Article #1. Robert Low made a motion to reconsider Article #1 and add \$220.00. Adopted by affirmative voice vote.

20. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to have the N. H. Revenue Department reappraise the property in the Town of Northwood, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30,000.00 for this purpose.

Herbert Sherman moved to amend the Article and appropriate \$15,000. and have the Selectmen do the assessing. Amendment prevailed with Yes and No Ballot: Yes, 80 - No, 78. Motion to vote Article 20 as amended to read \$15,000. and have Selectmen do assessing lost by Yes and No Ballot: Yes, 77 -No, 77.

The Town Meeting was adjourned at 6 P.M. to reconvene on Saturday, March 15, 1975 at 1 P.M. to take up Article 20 where Town left off. The Town Meeting was opened at 1 P.M. on March 15, 1975 by Moderator Robert Johnson.

Motion made to reconsider the vote to have the Selectmen do the assessing for the sum of \$15,000. under Article 20. Yes and No Ballot: Yes, 69 No, 171 - Blank, 1. Motion to consider Article 20 as written was made. Adopted by affirmative voice vote.

21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to be used to pay the salary and expense of a Supervisor of the Summer Youth Work Program.

Adopted by affirmative voice vote.

22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$21,750.00 to complete the purchase of the Fire Truck as ordered by vote of March 9, 1974 Town Meeting.

Robert Bailey asked that the sum be amended to read \$22,498.64, which sum included interest. Amended article adopted by affirmative voice vote.

23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to be used by a volunteer committee of the Northwood Historical Society in the cataloging and preservation of Town Records.

Adopted by affirmative voice vote.

24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase from Annie Giles for the sum of \$3,000.00 the remaining land owned by Annie Giles, bounded Easterly by the Northwood Post Office and Robert Seaver, Southerly by Route 4, and Northwesterly and Northerly by the Old Canterbury Road, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 in 1975, \$1,000.00 in 1976, and \$1,000.00 in 1977, together with interest on the unpaid balance.

Amendment made and adopted by show of hands to raise the \$3,000. this year, pay \$1,000. this year and put remaining \$2,000. in the bank in a trust fund and pay out \$1,000. each year for two years, plus interest. Yes and No Ballot: Yes, 136 - No, 3. Amended Article adopted by affirmative voice vote.

25. To see if the Town will vote to provide Social Security Coverage for its employees.

Adopted by affirmative voice vote.

26. To see if the Town will vote to increase the wages paid by the Town to a maximum of \$3.00 per hour, except in cases of Foremen and Machine Operators, and then State rates shall apply.

Adopted by show of hands: Yes, 110 - No, 5.

27. To see if the Town will vote to allow the use of alcoholic beverages in the Town Hall at private parties when properly supervised.

Adopted by affirmative voice vote.

28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to carry out the recommendations of the American Revolutionary Bicentennial Committee, as appointed by authorization of the March 1974 Town Meeting.

Amended to authorize Selectmen to accept any available funds from State grants, should there be any forthcoming. Amendment and amended article adopted by affirmative voice vote.

29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$175.00 to heat and light the Community Hall at Northwood Narrows.

Adopted by affirmative voice vote.

30. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to total all insurance now paid by the Town in one package and to ask for bids on the single package, the lowest bidder to be awarded the insurance of all Town risks.

Motion made and seconded and then amended to read ... "that Selectmen be authorized to consider bids and to take lowest bid as long as coverage is good." Amendment and amended article adopted by affirmative voice vote.

31. To see if the Town will vote to rescind its vote of March 1974 whereby the Tax Collector fees were lowered to 3/4 of 1% of Property Taxes collected, and instead will vote to see if the Town will vote to change the compensation of the Tax Collector from the present rate to a new rate of 1% of the taxes collected. (Entered by petition of fourteen legal voters of the Town of Northwood.)

Motion made and seconded. Warren Guptill moved to amend article as written and proposed that the yearly pay be cut to \$3000.00, payable in two \$1,500.00 payments. Yes and No Ballot: Yes, 120 - No, 42. Show of hands vote called for on amended article: Yes, 102 - No, 30. Article adopted as amended.

32. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the sale of cemetery grave sites in Pine Grove Cemetery at the following prices. Perpetual care to be mandatory.

Motion made and seconded. Donald Post proposed amending the article to change the lot fees to read:

Amendment adopted by affirmative voice vote. Donald Post made a second amendment to the Article to read as follows: "All income from the sale of cemetery lots be placed in a trust fund, the income from which to be used for the purpose of improving the cemetery for use (excluding care of individual lots). At such time as the cemetery shall be fully sold, the trust fund and all unused accrued interest shall be used to defray the cost of additional land for cemetery purposes, the foregoing procedure to be applied thereon.

This amendment adopted by affirmative voice vote. Motion made and seconded to adopt Article 32 as twice amended. Adopted by affirmative voice vote.

33. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property of the Town acquired by Tax Collector's Deeds as a result of Tax Sale.

Adopted by affirmative voice vote.

34. To transact any other business that legally may come before said meeting.

Perry Richardson made the suggestion that party cards should be used to charge for heat, lights and other expenses, so that Town could receive a little bit of income for the use of the Town Hall.

Robert Bailey stated it would not be fair to people as many had made donations, also given time and labor. They should have the right to use the room specified for this purpose, and they should clean up afterwards, leaving it in the condition it was found.

True Chesley said it was fuilt for the Townspeople, and it was intended as such. This next week the Dental Clinic for children would be there.

The suggestion was made that the Library Trustees should look into the parking situation at the Narrows Library.

Motion was made and seconded to have meeting adjourned. Meeting was adjourned at 6 P.M.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000.00 to pay for the reappraisal of Real Estate in the Town of Northwood.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to pay the salary and expense of the supervisor of the Summer Program for Economically Disadvantaged Youths (S.P.E.D.Y.).

21. To see if the Town will vote to receive and spend up to \$6,000.00 from Rockingham/Strafford Manpower Administration for the S.P.E.D.Y. Program.

22. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the town the benefits of title 11 of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age, Survivors, Disability and Health Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes Annotated amended by Chapter 302 and 332 of the Laws of 1955 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,340.00 to defray the town's share of the cost thereof.

23. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions the compensation for which is on a fee basis. 24. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the plan service in any class or classes of positions of election officials or election workers for a calendar quarter in which the remuneration paid for such service is less than \$50.00.

25. If a plan for Social Security coverage is adopted, to see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to execute on behalf of the Town the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the Town will designate the Chairman of the Board of Selectmen as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.

26. To see if the Town will vote to accept the bequest under the Will of Edward A. Tesker, late of Northwood, wherein the bequest is as follows: "SEVENTH: I give and bequeath to the Town of Northwood the sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars to be used in the maintenance and improvements to the Chesley Memorial Library in said Northwood."

27. To see if the Town will vote to allow the \$1,000.00 American Revolutionary Bicentennial Fund raised in 1975, to be used as recommended by the new committee.

28. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$10,000.00 to complete the payment on the Town Hall Addition and authorize the withdrawal of \$10,000.00 for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.

29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,500.00 to provide legal use of the Town owned beaches namely: Lucas Pond, Mary Waldron Park, and A. M. Morse Beach. (Submitted without recommendation of the Budget Committee.)

30. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00 for the purpose of acquiring a useable right-of-way from the Gulch Mountain Area to the Winding Hill Road.

31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the purpose of treating the Berry Elm for Dutch Elm Disease and perform necessary tree surgery and authorize the Selectmen to sign a "Hold Harmless Agreement" with the contractor performing the necessary work.

32. To see if the Town will vote to accept the recommendation of the 1973 Bicentennial Committee to transfer any commemorative items in their possession as of March 1976 Town Meeting to The Northwood Historical Society.

33. To see if the Town will vote to accept and maintain the main trunk road, known as Harvey Road, located in the Harvey Lake Estates Development. (By Petition) 34. We the undersigned Legal Registered Voters of the Town of Northwood, N. H. petition the Town to provide more humane treatment for stray animals than is presently administered. This would include a covered, dry warm shelter. Also, a better location in Northwood other than the Town Dump. We also petition the town to provide us with viable alternatives. (By Petition)

35. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enter into any contracts as may be necessary with the U.N.H. and other cooperating towns to participate in a refuse recovery system.

36. To see if the Town will vote to establish a voluntary rubbish separation program wherein glass, newspaper and cans will be placed in separate containers for delivery to a refuse collection point.

37. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property of the Town acquired by Tax Collector's Deeds as a result of Tax Sale.

38. To transact any other business that legally may come before said meeting.

If the above articles have not been completely acted upon by 5 P.M. on March 13, 1976, the meeting will be adjourned to March 20, 1976.

1975 ANNUAL REPORT

RURAL DISTRICT HEALTH COUNCIL, INC.

The past year has seen an increase in the services provided by the Rural District Health Council coupled with an increase in the requests for service. As the federal government studies the cost of health care there is increased interest in home care and preventive medicine as methods of reducing costs and improving health services. The Rural District Health Council continues to qualify as a certified home health agency, implementing procedures to continue to provide quality care.

In January 1975, Mrs. Marie Dexter, R.N. joined the staff in a dual role as Referral Coordinator at the Frisbie Memorial Hospital where she is a member of the Utilization Review Committee, and also as staff nurse for the agency, providing skilled care for the towns of Barrington and Strafford. The addition of a Health Aide, Mrs. Joan Menez, has enabled the Council to better utilize the professional staff while continuing to provide quality care.

Along with the regular skilled nursing services provided in the home, members of the agency staff conduct adult screening clinics monthly in Northwood and Farmington which was requested by senior citizen groups in those towns. They also participate in the aftercare program in cooperation with the Strafford County Guidance Center and the Seacoast Counseling Center, assist local groups with area screening programs, participate in health planning and, by contract, supervise health aides in the Strafford County Homemaker - Home Health Aide Program. The Maternal and Child Health Program is very active, providing regular physical examinations, immunizations and dental care for children 0-6 years enrolled in the Well Child Clinic. The agency staff also does home visiting to the patients participating in the Strafford County Prenatal and Family Planning Program and the Exeter Area Family Planning Program.

The strength of the Council lies in the efficiency and dedication of its staff. In addition to the two persons mentioned above, members of the professional staff are Mrs. Ardala Houle, R.N. Agency Supervisor; Miss Arlene Thorne, R.N., Maternal and Child Health nurse; Mrs. Barbara Drew, R.N.; Mrs. Myrtle Walsh, R.N.; Mrs. Lucy Myers, R.N.B.S.; Mrs. Bernadette Cameron, R.N.; and Mrs. Kathleen Hansen, RPT. The office duties are ably handled by Mrs. Norma Davis and Mrs. Eleanor Eaton.

The Rural District Health Council has been requesting \$1.00 per capita from member towns since 1969. As a result of the recent inflationary times and increase in services provided, it has been necessary, therefore, to increase the per capita request from each town by 10ϕ to enable the Council to continue to provide these services. During the past year the Council has made 634 home visits and 179 well child visits, making a grand total of 813 visits for the Town of Northwood.

NORTHWOOD COMMUNITY ACTION PROGRAM REPORT

The 1975 Community Action Program ran from June 23 through July 18. We found that the new times 9 A.M. to 1:30 P.M. were best, so the children did not become fatigued, or over-tired of group run activities. Our average daily attendance the first two weeks was 63, and the second two weeks was 33. The drastic falling off of the latter two weeks was due to the Red Cross Swimming Program at Northwood Lake being run at the same time as CAP. I strongly recommend that these two programs join together next year, or at least run at separate times so the children can enjoy both.

This year special thanks go to David Hinman who came each morning, Monday through Thursday, to work with the children in special sports areas. He developed basketball and soccer skills with the different age groups. Other sports were also enjoyed by the children, such as softball, kickball, badminton, and tumbling. Croquet was an added feature to this year's program.

Arts and Crafts were participated in almost daily. The younger children made things like spool animals, flibber trees, crayon rubbings, rock creatures, crayon resist paintings, and more. The older children enjoyed making collages, distorted pictures, and string designs on tag board and wood.

Some special activities were enjoyed; a scavenger hunt, a treasure hunt, and hikes. We also had visitors from the Cooperative Extension Service 4-H office who taught the children bread flower making, weaving and bike safety.

Our first trip this year was to Pawtuckaway State Park, where we enjoyed a picnic, games, swimming, and a greased watermelon game which ended in watermelon for everyone. Many parents donated their time to drive for this trip.

Our second week ended in the fourth of July, so we planned a small swimming trip to Bennett's Bridge on Bow Lake for Thursday afternoon, July 3. Parents drove for this activity also.

Our third trip almost didn't happen because enough drivers couldn't be found. A Concord Coach Lines Bus was hired at the last minute with supplies money, and we all enjoyed a fun day at York Beach and the Animal Park in Maine.

The final trip was one we will always remember. A bus again took us, this time to Lake Sunapee where we rode on the boat Mt. Sunapee II for a two hour lake tour. We ate our lunches on the boat, and both children and adults were allowed to steer this big boat!

Due to the shortness of our program this year, we were unable to get any Man Power workers until our last week. We were in desperate need of office help, and I want to thank Diane Allen for coming to our rescue and doing this for the whole program.

I especially wish to thank all the mothers and fathers who made this program possible by donating their time and their cars when we needed them.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN

AND DISTRICT CHIEF

Upon the recommendation of town selectmen and city councils, the Division of Forests and Lands appoints a forest fire warden and several deputy forest fire wardens in each town and city every three years. The town or city warden is responsible for maintaining a force of men and adequate equipment to suppress any wildfire that occurs in his town or city during his term of appointment. The fire warden must authorize all open burning when the ground is not covered with snow. No open fires can be authorized between 9 A.M. and 5 P.M., unless it is raining, without the additional permission of the state district fire chief.

Any person wishing to kindle an open fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain a written permission slip from the forest fire warden. Camp and cooking fires also require the warden's permission.

The Division of Forests and Lands, through its Forest Fire Service, assists all cities and towns in meeting these requirements by training the warden and deputy forces in wildfire suppression tactics, making hand tool suppression equipment available at fifty percent of cost, supplying pieces of Federal excess property for use as fire attack vehicles and sharing up to fifty percent of the cost of wildfire suppression costs.

Wildfire prevention is also a joint state, city or town program. Smokey Bear is available from the Forest Fire Service for local fire prevention programs. Posters and Junior Ranger kits are available for distribution by local fire departments upon request to the Forest Fire Service. Each forest fire warden is expected to carry on a continuous wildfire prevention program within his town or city.

Burning permits for Northwood residents are available from Warden Carroll L. Bassett or Arlene Bassett (942-7725), or Deputy Leon Seward (942-5498). Please do not use the Fire Emergency number (942-8822) when information or permits are needed. Use this number <u>only</u> for reporting a fire.

The Department noted an alarming increase in the number of calls where the person reporting the fire did not know the proper telephone number for the Fire Department. Time is of extreme importance in extinguishing fire and saving lives and property. All citizens should know the telephone number to report a fire. In Northwood this number is 942-8822. This number should be used only for fire emergencies. The Department's business number for non-emergency calls is 942-5498.

The Department has been working for the last two years to raise the fire protection rating in Northwood and thereby lower the fire insurance premiums. This was accomplished in the Spring of 1975 when the Insurance Services Office of New Hampshire raised the fire protection rating from F to E-3. The amount saved by each property owner will vary according to the type of policy and coverage. However, a homeowner's policy carrying \$25,000 in fire damage coverage would notice a decrease from approximately \$181.00 in premiums under the F rating to a premium of \$146.00 under the E-3 rating. This is a savings of \$35.00 each year. A policy with fire insurance only for \$20,000. would notice a decrease from \$152.00 to \$102.00 or a savings of \$50.00 each year. The insurance companies writing fire and homeowner's insurance in New Hampshire were granted an increase in premiums of approximately $12\frac{1}{2}\%$ throughout the entire state during 1975 so a true reduction in insurance bills will not be seen. If the fire protection rating had not been raised, there would have been a large increase in insurance premiums. It is very difficult to tell exactly how much will be saved by the Town of Northwood as a whole each year since insurance coverage and premium figures are not available. A very rough estimate would be between \$25,000 and \$35,000 each year.

RECLAMATION, RECYCLING AND DISPOSAL COMMITTEE REPORT

Reclamation sales money is turned into the Selectmen's Office once a month. Items sold are ones that often times have been disposed of, found by me and placed in the reclamation area. The rest of the items are placed in the reclamation area by the public. Public support has been a source of great pride. A grand total of \$1,709.84 has been turned in by your Supervisor of Reclamation, Recycling and Disposal, Jane B. "Sunshine" Morse. It has been most gratifying to the Northwood Rescue Squad to receive the money from sales of items designated for that purpose in the reclamation area. An adequate building is needed for the protection of good items.

Recycling of newspaper, separation of glass, and scrap metal sales were turned in with the reclamation sales money. Close to four tons of newspaper was tied or boxed in an old tractor trailer. Because the bottom had dropped out of the scrap paper market, it was donated to Cub Scout Pack 338 from South Berwick, Maine in October 1975.

Disposal of trash in open burning has been a total success. The Fire Department had to be called only a few times. Burning is done a maximum of once a week and a minimum of once every three weeks on Mondays. Farmers who have had livestock die put them in a trench and cover them over with earth. The general public who use the disposal area are most cooperative in throwing their trash over the bank. Tires are accidently put in this area, then they have to be spotted and placed in the tire disposal area.

The summer hours are from June first to September 30th, which is the fire hazard time. Forest Fire Warden Carroll L. Bassett kept a close touch in regard to safe burning of the disposal area. District Fire Chief Clark M. Davis gave the open burning area a good standing report each time he turned it into the Selectmen. We received an open burning extension until July 1976.

One committee meeting was held and no funds were asked for in December.

This would include a covered, dry warm shelter. Also, a better location in Northwood other than the town dump.

We also petition the town to provide us with viable alternatives.

In 1974, the total enrollment at the beginning of school was 325. The pupil teacher ratio as a whole was 22.5, which is very good. However, it must be pointed out that the enrollments in grades 4 and 5 are higher than the minimum standards for elementary schools permit.

Northwood pupils attending secondary schools at District expense were distributed as the chart shows.

In addition to the secondary school pupils, there are two other pupils being educated outside the district. These are handicapped pupils for which provision may not be made within the local school facilities. One student is at Amoskeag and one is at the Concord Rehabilitation Center.

The chief problem with which the district is faced is that of providing suitable space, and sufficient space, for the programs it is operating. As directed by the last District Meeting, children with handicaps are being educated within the district in so far as possible. Educationally, this is not sound as it means that all programs being offered are "making do" with less than adequate facilities. There is no proper area for conducting the instrumental music program. The lessons are heard over most of the building and have a tendency to disturb classes. The Resource Area, because of its use for small group instruction, is no longer reasonably suitable for minimum exposure of the children to the training this area is intended to provide. The shop program lacks safe, well lighted quarters for its activities, which could prove to be dangerous to some child over the course of time. It is all very well to get by with what one has, but the point has been reached where there is a high investment in time, personnel, and effort, which produces a comparatively low return.

On the positive side, it should be pointed out that the pupils have many opportunities not often extended to pupils in schools of similar size. There is at least introductory development of skills in these activities. The pupils appear to be happy and well adjusted. They also seem to have some voice in making decisions which effect them directly at school. Their exposure to athletics and competition with neighboring schools has been good. School spirit and community support of the efforts of the children has been high, as evidenced by the continued support of the magazine subscription drive each year. We wish to thank the School Board, the staff, and the pupils, as well as the community, for their continued support and cooperation.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

To the Northwood School Board and the Citizens of Northwood:

In the past year, we have continued to strive to improve the quality of education for every student at Northwood Elementary School.

We have initiated a system of mainstreaming, which has allowed us to make better use of our existing facilities. Our former library area has been transformed into a total learning center. Miss Barbara Barry is the Director, and she has five people working closely with her - a Special Education teacher, Speech Clinician, Learning Disabilities Specialist, and two Aides. The main responsibility of this program is to handle any learning difficulty that has been observed by the home room teacher. The youngster is referred to the Center and works with whichever teacher or Aide that handles his particular problem.

The rest of our program has been going along without any major changes. The student enrollment as of January 5, 1975 is as follows:

These figures have varied from a high of 323 at the beginning of school year to the current student population of 311.

We have had quite a large turnover in teachers for this year. The new teachers are as follows:

Miss Becky Hackman, Level 3, is a graduate of Plymouth State College with one year's teaching experience in Hooksett.

Miss Gail Gustafson, Level 5, is also a graduate of Plymouth State, and is a beginning teacher.

Mrs. Pamela Thayer, Level 4, has returned to us after a two year's absence.

Mr. William Lambert, graduated from Plymouth State, and is teaching math in Grades 6 - 7 - 8.

Mr. Thomas Hall, graduated from Plymouth State, also, and teaches Social Studies in Grades 6 - 7 - 8.

Mrs. Linds Gayer is our new Aide in the Learning Center.

One renovation has taken place over the holidays. We have completed the accoustical work in the gym/auditorium area, which will allow us to utilize this area more effectively.

We have continued to maintain an active extra-curricular program for our students. This winter we have three coaches working with upwards of over 100 students in our basketball programs.

The graduating class of 1976 will be about 38 - 40 students.

In closing, I would like to thank the citizens of Northwood, on behalf of the staff at the school and myself for their continued support of quality education for our students.

I would also like to express my appreciation for the help given me by the Supervisory Union Office. Mr. Frank Black, the Assistant Superintendent, and Mr. Charles Morgan, Superintendent, have always been available when help was needed.

To the three members of our School Board, Mr. Robert Stout, Mr. Thomas Madson and Mr. Walter Jackson, my thanks for making this year a very productive year for the Northwood School. Without their backing and guidance, progress could not continue.

Washington's Birthday Anniversary falls on February 21, which is during the Winter Vacation, and Fast Day falls on April 25, which is during the Spring Vacation.

The above calendar provides for 185 days of school. The equivalent of 180 days must be devoted to classroom instruction as a minimum. This calendar allows for either 5 full days for staff development, curriculum review, staff planning and the like, or for 10 half days. Days missed due to storms, etc., would need to be recovered either during vacation periods, or by extending the number of sessions. If the staff development program is to be effective, it would need to be operated as a part of the contracted school year.

This calendar is subject to revision by the School Board.
