TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Rindge, in the County of Cheshire, State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in Rindge Center in said Town of Rindge on Tuesday the tenth day of March next at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Polls will remain open until six of the clock in the afternoon.

The business meeting will be called to order at seven of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

Article 2. To hear and act upon the reports of the Selectmen and Town Treasurer, Town Clerk, Overseer of the Poor and reports of all agents, Committees and Officers heretofore chosen and act in any way relating thereto.

Article 3. To see if the Voters will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow money in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current year, and to issue in the name of the Town negotiable notes therefore, said notes to be repaid during the current year from taxes collected within the current year.

Article 4. To see what method the Town will adopt to collect taxes.

Article 5. To see what action the Town wishes to take regarding overdrafts and unexpended balances.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase a No. H-70 Hough Loader equipped with snow plow and wing, accept as an allowance for the present loader and Cletrac the sum of \$4000.00 which sum to be applied against the purchase price, raise and appropriate the sum of \$13,415.00, the amount of \$1415.00 to be raised and appropriated this year and that the Selectmen be authorized to issue in the name of the Town term notes in the sum of \$2000.00 each for the balance, one of each said notes to be redeemed each year for the next six years or act in any way relating thereto.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2000.00 to provide for the retirement and replacement of obsolete and worn out equipment in the Highway Department or act in any way relating thereto.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000.00 for the purchase of metal culvert pipes to replace broken and defective units or act in any way relating thereto.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1600.00 to be expended in cooperation with the Rindge Congregational Church to paint the church and Town Hall Building or act in any way relating thereto.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to increase the hourly rate of wage of Police Officers to \$1.25 per hour or act in any way relating thereto.

Article 11. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to secure the assistance of the State Tax Commission in the re-appraising of taxable property in the Town in order to secure greater equality as between tax payers, and to insure the assessment of all property in the Town on the same standard of value and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2500.00 to pay for same.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$25.00 to be expended in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission for the opening and maintaining of trails and old roads for forest fire protection. The New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission to provide a matching sum not in excess of \$25.00 for this purpose.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$550.00 to complete the dry hydrant program in West Rindge Village, or take any action relating thereto.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$800.00 to purchase four air-pressurized dry hydrants for winter protection.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to install a street light on Todd Hill Road between the residence of George C. Todd and Ray F. Haskell or act in any way relating thereto.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to establish a street light at the junction of Routes No. 119 and No. 202 and Thomas Road, so-called, or act in any way relating thereto.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the purpose of inspection and control of Dutch Elm Disease.

Article 18. To take up any matters that may properly come before this meeting.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to plow driveways at cost per operation, that said owners shall give a release to the Town for any liability of damage in regard to this operation by the first of December each year or act in any way relating thereto.

Article 8. Voted to indefinitely postpone action on this article.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to shingle the roof of the Town Hall and Steeple and repair the side wall in cooperation with the Rindge Congregational Church.

Article 9. It was voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200.00 to shingle the roof of the Town Hall and Steeple and repair the side wall in cooperation with the Rindge Congregational Church on an equal basis.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to purchase lights and fixtures for Christmas Trees for the three villages, raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 to carry out the provisions of this article.

Article 10. It was voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 to carry out provisions of this article.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to close subject to gates and bars a section of the unimproved road to the Cathedral of the Pines east of public way to Grassy Pond to west side entrance to Holdsworth place or act in any way relating thereto.

Article 11. It was voted that the Town close subject to gates and bars this road as specified in this article.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to pay the State Tax Commission for audit of the accounts of Town of Rindge, raise and appropriate the sum of \$309.16.

Article 14. It was voted that the sum of \$500.00 be appropriated for the construction of one or more Dry Hydrants in West Rindge Village. The work to be done under the direction of Fire Wardens in corporation with William B. Leeman, John B. Crosby, Jr., and Donald Smith.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to create a Development Commission for the purpose of developing the resources of the Town or act in any way relating thereto. (By petition)

Article 15. It was voted that a Committee of six be appointed at this meeting to act as a Development Commission for the purpose of assisting in the development of the resources of the Town. The members are to serve without salary.

The following persons were nominated from the floor and duly elected: Sidney B. Fitzgerald, Walter A. Cleveland, Gunner R. Anderson, Edward C. Brummer, William H. Stoddard, Lewis D. Gilmore, Jr.

Article 16. To take up any matters that may properly come before this meeting.

Article 16. The following resolution was presented and passed by a majority vote:

Resolved: That the Selectmen use money in the general fund to offset the amount raised for the purchase of the truck voted in Article 13.

The condition of your library continues to be very sound: culturally, physically, and financially.

E. WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the School District in the town of Rindge qualified to vote in district affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Memorial School in said district on the 6th day of March, 1959, at 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects: (Polls open from 2:15 to 7:15).

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

The teaching staff remained the same with the exception of the following: Mrs. Ruth E. Bean replaced Mrs. Dorothy Ann Ilg as teacher of Grade 1. Mr. Lawrence F. Woodward replaced Mr. Lawrence A. Castle as Music Supervisor and Mr. Ormsby J. Buck replaced Frank Petronzio as Art Supervisor.

B. SCHOOL PROGRAM

The storm created by Soviet Russia's advancement in science caused much criticism of public education in the United States. Regardless of the validity of the charges, it all served to challenge us to evaluate our schools and to examine our educational program more objectively.

The supervisors and faculty realize the importance of the total development of each pupil in all phases of education, especially the skilled subjects in our school curriculum. Continued emphasis is being placed on such educational fundamentals as reading, spelling, and arithmetic in an effort to develop better understanding in science, current community, and world affairs. Related activities are being conducted to insure an opportunity for personality and character development. A few of these activities are mentioned in this report.

The Christmas program, Memorial Day exercises, and our Annual Field Day program have been highlights of the past year. Every child was encouraged to take part in these programs according to his ability and interest. Therefore, in all of these activities the pupils have either assisted or participated in the programs under the teacher's supervision. The teachers express their appreciation to the parents who have assisted in these activities.

A variety of sports such as speedball, softball, touch football and other games were conducted for the children during recess periods. A few softball games for boys were conducted with nearby schools last spring.

The annual school trip to Sargent Camp gave the fifth and sixth grade children the opportunity to practice democratic group living and group planning. Such a camping program makes classroom instruction more meaningful in that it provides many experiences related to science, geography, history and conservation which are impossible to provide in the classroom.

Several field trips were taken directly related to the areas of curriculum under study. The primary grades made a trip to Upland Farm in Peterborough, where they observed all aspects of apple harvesting. At the Meadowbrook Fire Station in Fitzwilliam they studied fire fighting equipment and the training school. Grades four and five visited the local post office and telephone exchange. (A repeat on these visits is planned to acquaint the children with the changes from year to year.) While studying weaving in other countries, the class visited the Jaffrey Mills to observe our weaving machines in operation. Last spring the fifth and sixth graders visited the historic centers of Lexington, Concord, and Bunker Hill. A visit to Old Ironsides and the Children's Museum also proved of great interest.

During November the Iowa Achievement tests were given to grades three through six. The average for each class came close to the national average for each grade. This means our pupils can compete scholastically with youngsters in other parts of our country of the same grade level. These tests are being used as guides by the teachers to determine which areas of learning have been mastered, as well as the areas needing greater emphasis.

Under the auspices of the P.T.A., Open House attracted many parents to confer with the teachers on the progress of their children. We feel much was gained by these conversations and it is our hope that such conferences will continue throughout the year.

The school faculty and administration would like to express their appreciation to Mr. Howard Burt and Mrs. Natalie Whitney for their assistance and cooperation in the performance of their duties. Rindge can be proud of the attractive appearance of the school building and the many hours spent in preparing over 14,000 appealing well-balanced meals each year. These two conscientious people are an asset to our school program.

PART III. SCHOOL PLANT

A. REPAIRS

There were no major repairs needed at the school this year. The custodian completed the usual summer work of reconditioning floors, etc. and general cleaning.

B. INSURANCE

PART VI. AUXILIARY ACTIVITIES AND SPECIAL REPORTS**A. HEALTH**

The general health of the pupils in the Rindge Memorial School has been good with the exception of the usual colds, stomach upsets, 26 reported cases of German measles, and 3 cases of chicken-pox.

Dr. Franklin Sterling continues as school physician, examining the pupils in the odd numbered grades each year. He initiates the general school health policies and carries out any immunization programs he deems necessary and useful.

In addition to the examinations by the doctor, the school nurse conducts vision and hearing tests, weighing and measuring, and general checkups for defects. Recommendations are made to the parents as to necessary corrective work. Your nurse spends about half a day per week in the Rindge School.

The annual dental clinic, sponsored by the Rindge School Board in cooperation with the State Health Department Dental services, was carried out with 19 children attending. This took 7 half days with 42 appointments, 86 fillings, 16 extractions, and 3 cleanings. Twelve children were completed. Only those in most

need of dental work, who could not otherwise have it done, were selected because of limited funds. Many were left on the waiting list when the funds were exhausted. The children were transported to Dr. Moore's office in Jaffrey by the school nurse for their appointments.

Salk polio vaccine shots were given to 128 school and pre-school children by Dr. Sterling. Most of our Rindge children are now protected from polio.

This was the year for the Rindge T. B. patch tests. One hundred pupils and the school personnel were tested, including 6 chest X-rays. All were negative for tuberculosis.

In early June prospective first-graders were invited to school for the day for the annual pre-school registration and tests. At this time health histories are taken, birth certificates noted, record systems set up, classroom needs and school bus schedules planned. Children are checked for vision and hearing difficulties or any possible defects for summer correction and vaccinations. An opportunity is provided for pupils and parents to become familiar with the school and the teachers, as well as regulations, facilities, administrative personnel, and the school calendar for the year. If all incoming pupils register at this time, there is less confusion and fear in the fall, and school administrators are able to make definite plans for all the needs early in the summer.

Necessary professional meetings, conferences and workshops were attended by the nurse. These took nine days' time, much of it on weekends and during vacation weeks. Places of meetings were at Walpole, Laconia, Manchester, Keene and Concord.

YOU CAN HELP PREVENT FOREST FIRES

Twenty-five percent of all forest fires in New Hampshire are caused from careless debris burning — brush, paper, leaves, grass, etc. Most of them are started without the required permit from the local forest fire warden. The cost of extinguishing these fires annually runs into large sums of money.

According to law, responsible parties must pay the cost of putting them out. In addition, violators may be subject to court prosecution with fines running as high as (\$200) two hundred dollars.

In the interest of fire prevention why not eliminate burning at home? Use your town dump. It has been set up for your personal convenience. It provides a suitable place for the disposal of dangerous inflammable waste material and other useless items which accumulate around the home and local stores; brush, etc. cut on your property. Eliminate the hazard of burning yourself. It will be easier for you — personally and financially.

If, however, you do burn on your premises:

1. Secure a permit from your local forest fire warden — the law requires it.
2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning. Don't leave it.
3. Make certain your fire is DEAD OUT before leaving it.
