

#### **Town Warrant**

To the inhabitants of the Town of Seabrook qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday the tenth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To elect a Town Clerk, one Selectman and Assessor for a term of three years, Town Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, three Constables, Highway Agent, three Overseers of the Poor, a Chief of Police and all other town officials for the year ensuing.
- Article 2. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for the expense of the general government, for the protection of persons and property, for health and sanitation, for highways and bridges, for the support of the town poor and all other necessary expenditures for the year ensuing.
- Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money on anticipation of taxes, and to renew and refund town notes.
- Article 4. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and act thereon.
- Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount on taxes.
- Article 6. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise to defray the expense for collecting garbage at Seabrook Beach, the same to be left in the hands of the Selectmen.

- Article 7. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for the observance of Memorial Day.
- Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred fifty (\$150.00) dollars to complete construction of a common at the junction of Collins and South Main Streets.
- Article 9. To raise and appropriate for the issuance and distribution of printed matter and otherwise publicizing the resources and natural advantages of the town in cooperation with other towns coordinated in the Seacoast Regional Development Association, the sum of \$84.00.
- Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$199.61, the state to contribute \$798.45 for Town Road Aid.
- Article 11. Upon petition of Florence D. Haley and ten other legal voters—To see what sum of money the Town will raise to repair the fire reservoir near the residence of Ralph O. Bragg.
- Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred (\$300) dollars for the purchase of a portable fire pump apparatus.
- Article 13. Upon petition of Charles Blanchard and nine other legal voters—To see what action the Town will take in regard to the purchasing of the property now owned by Charles Blanchard, said property bordering on the South School lot, South Main Street, and to raise and appropriate the money for the same.
- Article 14. Upon petition of Abram J. Miller and nine other legal voters—To see if the town will vote to adopt the recommendation made by the state auditor in his report and take action on any matter for the welfare of the town brought up by the sponsors of this article.

Article 15. Upon petition of Albert M. Smith and ten other legal voters—To see if the Town will vote to purchase a new fire alarm system and to raise and appropriate money for the same.

Article 16. Upon petition of Elihu T. Adams and ten other legal voters—To see if the Town will vote to buy the property of the Passaconaway Council, No. 7, Jr. O. U. A. M. located upon the west side of Lafayette Road in said town and bounded on the north by property of the Town of Seabrook known as the Locke School—for the use of the town as a town hall or municipal building.

To see if the Town will raise the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500) for the purchase of the above described property of the Passaconaway Council, No. 7, Jr. O. U. A. M.

Article 17. To transact all other business that may legally come before said meeting.

This help has been given willingly and is greatly appreciated by both myself and the townspeople. Help has been sent to Hampton Falls 4 times, for which the Town has been duly reimbursed, for which we are also grateful.

While we probably will not get a new piece of apparatus this year, I recommend appointing a committee to consider this matter.

In closing, I wish to thank again the surrounding towns, the Board of Selectmen, members of the Fire De-

partment and others who have helped us in our work.

The increase in the cost over that of last year is not due to the fact that more time was required to complete this audit but rather to an amendment passed by the last legislature to the Municipal Accounting Act. Under the provisions of this amendment it is required that one half the salaries of the accountants during the time which they are actually engaged in the audit, in addition to their traveling expenses, be charged to the town. This explains the added cost of this year's audit.

Gentlemen:

In accordance with the vote taken at your annual meeting in March, 1941, an audit and examination of the accounts of the Town of Seabrook has been made by the division of municipal accounting of the state tax commission, a report of which is submitted herewith. This audit covers the period from October 15th, 1940, (date of previous audit by this division) to November 20th, 1941. Schedules as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

### SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk and Trustees of Trust Funds.

### FINANCES

The changes which have taken place during the last ten year period affecting the financial condition of the town as reflected in the Indebtedness, Valuation and Taxes are indicated in Schedule A, a statement of:

Indebtedness, Valuation and Taxes: It will be noted that there was comparatively little change in the amount of assessed valuation and the amount of taxes assessed between the year 1931 (referred to as the fiscal year ended January 31, 1932) and the current year. A slight increase in valuation and a little lower tax levy resulted in a decrease in the tax rate from \$3.39 in 1931 to \$3.25 in 1941. The average tax rate for the state during these same years was \$2.90 and \$3.35, respectively.

Notes and bonds outstanding will have been reduced

from \$18,100 on January 31, 1932, to \$10,000 on January 31, 1942.

Net Debt: Unredeemed and uncollected taxes are not reported in Schedule A prior to the year ended January 31, 1939. This is due to the fact that previously property acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds was included as "unredeemed taxes", thereby making it impossible to obtain accurate and comparable figures.

However between January 31, 1939 and January 31, 1941, a decrease in Net Debt from \$13,211.49 to \$4,880.41 is noted.

A detailed statement of comparative property valuations over a ten year period will be found in Schedule B.

Revenues, Appropriations and Expenditures, 1940: (Schedules C and C-1) An analysis of revenues, estimated and actual, and appropriations and expenditures for the year 1940, is presented in detail in these schedules. A net excess of actual over estimated revenues of \$1,027.21, and a net overdraft of appropriations of \$140.39, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$886.82.

Bonded Debt and Annual Maturities: (Schedule D) Outstanding bonds as of January 31, 1941, amounted to \$12,000. Of this amount \$2,000 was paid in the current year. Annual maturities thereafter amount to \$1,000 a year up to and including 1951. Annual interest requirements are also indicated in this schedule.

It is recommended in this connection that a separate account in the depository bank be set up and designated as the "Town of Seabrook Bond and Coupon Account", against which all maturing bonds and coupons may be charged. Prior to the due date of principal and interest a town order and check should be issued by the selectmen and treasurer and deposited to the credit of this account. This procedure is preferable to the current practise of the bank debiting the treasurer's general account when bonds and coupons are presented for payment.

The importance of continued efforts by the town of-

ficials to dispose of property held by the town is again emphasized. The liquidation of such property accomplishes two purposes:

- (1) Reimburses the town for accumulated taxes, interest and costs invested therein.
  - (2) Returns the property to the tax lists.

Tax Collector's deeds should now be taken in cases where no redemptions have been made from tax sales on account of the levies of 1938 and previous years.

### TAX COLLECTOR

A summary of the Collector's Tax Sale Accounts for the tax levies of 1940, 1939, 1938, 1937 and 1936 is presented in Schedule G. Detailed lists of unredeemed taxes from sales on account of these levies, as of the date of audit, are included in Schedule G-1.

The Collector's Warrants for the levies of 1941, 1940, 1939, 1938 and 1937, were audited and balanced as of November 24, 1941, as indicated by Schedules H, I, J and K, respectively.

### ACCOUNTS OF SELECTMEN AND TREASURER

Vouchers issued by the selectmen during the period of audit were examined as were also the supporting invoices and highway agents' payrolls. The cancelled checks of the treasurer, issued upon orders of the selectmen, were compared with the vouchers and found to be in agreement. The receipts of the treasurer were checked by source, insofar as it was possible to do so. Totals of receipts and expenditures were verified. The treasurer's cash book balance as of November 20, 1941, amounted to \$2,802.95. The reconciled bank balance plus undeposited funds on hand was in agreement with this amount. (Schedules L and L-1).

### TOWN CLERK

The accounts of the Town Clerk, including the issuance of motor vehicle permits and dog licenses and collection of

filing fees, were examined. All funds received by the Clerk were accounted for either through remittances to the Treasurer or funds on hand at date of audit. (Schedule M).

### TRUST FUNDS

The savings bank books representing the invested principal and unexpended income of the various trust funds were examined.

It is recommended that a surety bond be furnished by the trustees of trust funds. In Seabrook the board of selectmen act in this capacity.

It is also recommended that the funds be deposited in a New Hampshire bank as required by Chapter 42, Section 22, of the Public Laws.

### TOWN OFFICERS' BONDS

The surety bonds of the treasurer, tax collector and town clerk, were examined and found satisfactory in form and amount. (Schedule O).

### GENERAL COMMENTS

When vouchers and checks are issued to the chief of the police and fire departments covering amounts due to employees of these departments, payrolls should be made out and the signatures of employees obtained thereon. These payrolls should then be filed with the vouchers as in the case of the road agents' payrolls.

Relief orders should be issued in all cases regardless of whether goods or merchandise are purchased locally or elsewhere. The signatures of relief recipients should be secured by vendors on all relief orders upon delivery of merchandise and the signed orders attached to bills when presented for payment. Payment of relief orders not bearing recipients' signatures should be withheld by the selectmen.

Other minor changes in accounting practises were discussed with the town officials during the course of the audit

and suggestions and recommendations made in connection therewith.
