To the inhabitants of the Town of Shelburne, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Shelburne on Tuesday the eleventh day of March next, at nine of 'he clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To hear the report of the budget committee and act thereon.
- 4. To hear the reports of Town Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of town highways and bridges.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Road Construction of highways.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the library.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.
- 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for relief of town poor.
- 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for fire prevention.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$57., based on a 1-100 of 1% of the assessed valuation, for the town's share of cooperative participation in the White Mountains Region Association.

- 12. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collectors' deeds.
- 13. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking inventory.
- 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Report of School Superintendent

Shelburne, N. H., February 1, 1941

To the School Board and Citizens of Shelburne:

Our school at the present date has an enrollment of twenty-two pupils with one pupil registered in the Eighth Grade.

Last June seven pupils were given certificates of completed work in the elementary grades and were graduated with appropriate exercises at the Grange Hall.

We now have fourteen Shelburne pupils registered at Gorham High and one at Berlin High. Six of these will probably complete their high school work this coming June, and as we have now only one pupil to complete the work of the grades, our tuition list for next year will be much reduced.

The work of the school is proceeding in a satisfactory manner and in accordance with the State Program. Your Superintendent has visited and inspected the various classes and has noted especially good progress in the lower grades.

The percentage of attendance for year ending June, 1940, was 95.5.
