Town Warrant

Articles in Warrant for Annual Town Meeting to be held March 8, at 9 o'clock A. M., 1910.

Article 1. To hear the report of the various Town officials and take action on the same.

Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk, Selectmen and Town Treasurer.

Art. 3. To choose all other necessary Town officers, agents and committees.

Art. 4. To take action in regard to Town debt and to raise money for Town charges.

Art. 5. To raise money for highways and elect highway agents.

· Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and to appropriate the amount of money necessary to secure State aid for the permanent improvement of highways, under the laws at the January session, 1905.

Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the Free public library.

Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to raise any money for the observance of "Old Home Week."

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to purchase one or more Chemical Fire Extinguishers, and raise money for the same.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to build a new fence at the south side of the cemetery at the Centre, and appropriate money for the same.

Art. 11. To see if the town will raise money to repair the building at the rear of the Town hall.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to dispense with the liquor agency.

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Town treasurer and selectmen to borrow during the municipal year beginning June 1, 1910, in anticipation of the collection of taxes of said year, the sum of five hundred dollars, giving the note or notes of the town therefor, payable within one year from date thereof. All debts incurred under the authority of this vote, shall be paid from the taxes of the present municipal year.

Selectmen of South Hampton.

South Hampton, Feb. 15, 1910.

As Mr. F. B. French has made an adverse report some explanation is necessary, as many will read this report who will not understand the true facts and circumstances.

He objects to the selectmen receiving money from owners of estates that have been sold in payment of taxes, a practise for many years past, which is a matter of convenience to the owners to redeem their property. The law says the owners may tender the money to the collector that sold the estates for taxes and provides for other ways to redeem; it does not say that the selectmen shall not receive it. The selectmen received it and paid it to the Town treasurer and received his receipt. This has been done for many years.

Mr. French hinges his objection principally upon Order No. 24, given to John O. P. Clifford for support of watering trough. The law says the selectmen may abate taxes for the support of watering troughs to the amount of \$3.00. As Mr. French says in his report, Mr. Clifford is a war veteran and his home property is exempt from taxation, and as Mr. Clifford has no other taxable property in the town of South Hampton it is a \$3.00 order or no water. The same thing came up in our annual town meeting last year and after an explanation of the facts there was no objection to its being paid.. It is a public benefit and our town's people are not quite so parsimonious as any one would suppose by Mr. French's objection.

I hereby certify that I have this day examined the accounts of the Selectmen, Treasurer, and Collector of Taxes of the Town of South Hampton, for the year ending Feb. 15, 1910, and find them correctly cast and properly youched.

BY F. B. FRENCH.

As Auditor I agree with Mr. Forsaith that the accounts examined by us were correctly cast; this I am very sure of for I did all the adding of the accounts. That they were well vouched, as so often stated, I also agree. But that they were properly vouched, I cannot not admit, for reasons herein stated:

COLLECTOR WYMAN.

In last year's annual town report, page 15, the selectmen inform us that there was due from Mr. Wyman \$189.68 for uncollected taxes. An examination of Mr. Wyman's accounts show that there was due the town \$199.48, which shows a slight disturbance of \$10.80. Mr. Wyman now owes the town only \$2.80 for uncollected taxes.

COLLECTOR BISHOP.

Mr. Bishop's account shows good business methods. His true loyalty to his adopted country is evident from his accounts, which show that he paid Treasurer Jewell more than he collected. The amount remaining uncollected is smaller than usual.

TREASURER JEWELL.

His accounts show that he was prompt to pay the many orders of the selectmen during the fiscal year. We were much pleased to find that the town's monies, in his hands, at the beginning of the fiscal year, 1909, were the same as those that he had at the close of the fiscal year 1908.

SELECTMEN.

Their accounts present a fine appearance in penmanship and arrangement. Double entry book-keeping system was first used but given up after the "dog tax account" was mastered.

Their account of cash receipts show that they received uncollected taxes from Mr. Paige and Mr. Perry.

It is the duty of the collector to receive all taxes, whether present year taxes or those in arrears.

• Order No. 24 was given to John O. P. Clifford for \$3.00 in payment of his claim on account of watering trough. Mr. Clifford's case was like John W. Smith's, who received a \$3.00 abatement from his taxes.

Mr. Clifford being a soldier, about all the taxes on his home property were not levied for collection. His other property could have the benefit of the \$3.00 abatement.

Our attention was called to the payments of large sums for notes and interest, to the banks, by the selectmen. They are to be congratulated upon their firm stand to pay notes and interest to the persons or bank only, to whom the town agreed to pay them to, thus refuting the decision of Albert P. Eaton and others (see report 1906, page 21)—that the town could legally pay notes and interest to others than those to whom we agreed to make payments to.
