COOS, ss.:

To the inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown, in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said town of Stewartstown on Tuesday the twelfth day of March next at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose by ballot and major vote the following Town Officers:
 - (a) Town Clerk.
 - (b) Selectmen for the three years ensuing.
 - (c) Town Treasurer.
 - (d) Five Road Agents.
 - (e) One or more Constables.
 - (f) One or more Sextons.
 - (g) Collector of the Diamond Pond Rents.
 - (h) Overseer of the Poor.
 - (i) Trustee of the Trust Funds.
 - (j) One Library Trustee for the three years ensuing.
2. To choose by ballot and major vote all other necessary Town Officers.
3. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget as submitted by the Selectmen. If not to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year, as follows:
 - (a) Town Officers' Salaries.
 - (b) Town Officers' Expenses.
 - (c) Election and Registration.
 - (d) Town Hall Expenses.
 - (e) Damages and Legal Expenses.

- (f) Health Department.
 - (g) Vital Statistics.
 - (h) Interest on Temporary Loans.
 - (i) Interest on Long Term Notes.
 - (j) County Tax.
 - (k) State Tax.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Poor.
 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Libraries.
 6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the care of Cemeteries.
 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise seven hundred thirty-five (\$735.00) dollars for Street Lighting.
 8. To see what sum of money, if any, the Town will vote to raise, in addition to that required by law, for Town Road Maintenance.
 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Winter Roads.
 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the following Departments:
 - (a) Police Department, including the care of tramps.
 - (b) Fire Department.
 - (c) Sewer Maintenance.
 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay on Long Term Notes.
 12. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid.
 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of Taxes of the Municipal year and to pay debts out of the Tax Money when it is received.

14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through a Tax Collector's Deeds.
15. To see if the Town will authorize the use of the Hotel Lot in West Stewartstown Village for a public playground until such time as the Town may vote to recind this vote.
16. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.
17. To transact any other business that may be legally brought before this meeting.

Superintendent's Report

To the Superintending School Committee and the
Citizens of the Town of Stewartstown:

General

The schools of any community, in the final analysis, are the expression of the wishes of the majority of the people, of that community. The schools cannot advance beyond the support of the tax payers, neither will the people allow the schools to sink below the standards which they believe to be correct. The people want education for occupational efficiency and for citizenship, education for the sphere of life which the individual must occupy, in short, what they would term a practical education.

It is to those who pay the tax bills, and who control the destinies of the nation that the appeal for such an education must be made. The people should understand that the basis of business is education, that the barometer of business is culture, and that the background of business is knowledge.

Buildings and Equipment

Minor repairs were made on most of the school buildings, to mention only a few, Bear Rock was repainted and generally repaired, the chimney at Cedar Brook was partly relayed, the front of the building at West Stewartstown was painted and the stove was jacketed at Cedar Brook. Still other repairs are needed.

Many of the school houses are badly in need of paint outside and redecorating inside, not only to increase the attractiveness of the building but also to preserve the outside and make the interior lighter and more conducive to good study.

Health

The work of the school nurse, Frances Varney, extends over a part of two Supervisory Unions, namely, the school districts of, Colebrook Special, Colebrook Town, Columbia, Errol, and Stewartstown. The time is apportioned according to the part of her salary allotted to each district.

It is of little value for the school to discover and carefully catalogue the physical defects of children, if nothing is to be done to correct them. The nurse calls to point out the condition to the parents. Many times the parents effect an immediate correction. Other times, due to present circumstances parents are unable to attend to the defects promptly.

The State Child Recovery Program has had a limited fund available for just that need, not for the pauper class but for families where present circumstances have placed eye glasses and dentistry on the luxury level. From this fund we have spent our total allotment, as follows:

Stewartstown	81.00

The corrections have been for the vision, tonsils, and teeth. It has been done in the usual way, the families going to their own doctor or dentist, except that the state pays the bills.

The entire number of corrections of physical defects secured since school started this fall, both privately and publicly financed is as follows:

Fourteen others have had some dental work done.

A service which strives for prevention as well as a cure is difficult to measure. The part played by the teachers in helping the child to practice good health habits is highly valued.

Enrollment and Attendance

The total enrollment this year is a little smaller than it was last year. The attendance records last year, were for the most part very good. Those of the West Stewartstown schools and the Hollow were especially commendable. The number of tardinesses in most schools was larger than it should be.

Teachers

The following changes occurred in the teaching personnel: Annie Campbell of Keene Normal School was elected teacher at the Hollow School, Frances Gould returned to the Bear Rock School, and Florence Parsons became the teacher at Cedar Brook. All have had previous teaching experience.

Notes on the Budget

The total amount of the 1935-36 School Board's Budget is \$15,151.60 as compared with a budget of \$15,104.35 in 1934-35. The 1934-35 budget was increased by special appropriations to a total of \$16,406.45.

This year's budget calls for slightly larger amounts for Insurance, Repairs, High School Tuition and the Nurse. It should be remembered, however, that the nurse's salary all comes from the state in State Aided Districts. The increases are offset by a reduction in the amount required for transportation.

Conclusion

It is indeed gratifying to note the regard that individual citizens and local organizations have for their schools. This is clearly expressed by their generous support and hearty cooperation in all school

activities, and most cheering of all, the widespread interest in the well being of the entire school system.

I wish to thank the School Committee, teachers, parents and friends for the interest they have shown in the schools and for the loyal support and encouragement they have given me in my work.
