

## SELECTPERSON'S REPORT

---

This report is intended to be a general discussion of some of the things that have taken place in Sullivan during the year 1975. It is also intended to point up some facts of finance that the town should be aware of.

Early in the summer, the Selectpersons entered into agreement with Mrs. Freda Hastings. In return for a portion of land adjoining the Community Hall and water rights to a spring on that property, the town would provide her with a well with acceptable drinking water. That transaction is almost complete and we are presently waiting approval from the State Water Pollution Control Board so that water can be brought into the hall and a septic system installed.

During the calendar year, the Board has again utilized the services of a clerk in handling the increased work load associated with town business. We feel that this position has improved our liaison with county, state and federal governments and has provided improved access to the citizens of Sullivan and their needs.

Ted Parker, Freeman Pearl and others continue to work toward the remodeling and refirbishing of the new library. June 1 is the target date for completion.

To the many people that have contributed time, helping hands, gifts and services on behalf of the town, the Board of Selectpersons extends its appreciation.

Most of the departments have overrun their budgets. It is the Boards' feeling that increasing prices are the primary factor for these overruns.

There seem to be few alternatives to the solution of the growing deficit and the expanding budget. (a) There will have to be some concrete decisions of how to extract more goods and services out of a deflating dollar, (b) more money will have to be raised, or (c) goods and services to the citizenry will have to be cut back.

Selectpersons' meetings will continue to be held on Monday evenings at 7:30 pm at the Community Hall. In the best interest of good town government, citizen participation is welcome.

## MINUTES OF THE 1975 TOWN MEETING

The Moderator, Mrs. Stanley Walters, opened the polls at 2:00 P.M., in the afternoon, of March 4, at the Community Hall, to bring in votes for Town Officers. Richard Woodbury, Clerk Pro Tempore for the afternoon voting.

The business meeting opened at 7:00 P.M. with Linda Woodbury, Clerk Pro Tempore.

Question of legality of the meeting, because the Town Reports were not issued seven days before the meeting.

Voted, by voice vote, to proceed with the meeting.

### ARTICLE II

Voted by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the following amounts of money to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

### ARTICLE III

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$24,000.00 for the Maintenance of Highways and Bridges and for any other construction of the same for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE IV

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$438.08 for Town Road Aid in order to receive the full State's share of \$3,220.57.

ARTICLE V

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$900.00 to provide and maintain adequate Public Library service, and authorized the Library Trustees to receive and use supplemental funds otherwise provided.

ARTICLE VI

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the operation of the Fire Department and the purchase and maintenance of equipment.

ARTICLE VII

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for the Police Department and the purchase and maintenance of equipment.

ARTICLE VIII

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the Planning Board.

ARTICLE IX

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 for a summer Recreation Program for youngsters, administered by the Conservation Commission.

ARTICLE X

Voted, by voice vote, to authorize the Selectpersons to use Revenue Sharing money, plus other Revenue Sharing monies to be used for improvement to Town Buildings.  
Total \$3,500.00

ARTICLE XI

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the maintenance of the Town Cemeteries.

ARTICLE XII

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the completion of the Fire Station and Library Building and grounds.

ARTICLE XIII

First Article 13 - was on the posted Warrant:  
To see if the Town will vote to add the current surplus for 1974, to the Capital Reserve Fund or incorporate same amount with Revenue Sharing for improvements to Town Buildings.

Second Article 13 - was printed in the Town Report:  
To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,621.00 and to authorize the Selectpersons to contract with Keene for the use of their dump.

This article was voted in the affirmative, but not being properly posted, the Moderator has ruled that the Selectpersons do not have the present authority to carry out this Article.

ARTICLE XIV

Voted, by voice vote, to authorize the Selectpersons to borrow in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE XV

Voted, by voice vote, to authorize the Selectpersons to designate a day other than the first Tuesday of March, to transact the Town's business, to be held within (30) thirty days after the election of Town Officers.

ARTICLE XVI

To see if the Town will adopt the fiscal year instead of the calender year. Voted, by voice vote, to pass over this article.

ARTICLE XVII

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectpersons to appoint, the Road Agent. Voted, by voice vote, to pass over this article.

ARTICLE XVIII

Voted, by voice vote, to reopen Article 2, to increase Town Officers' Salaries Appropriation by \$675.00 to \$2,620.00.

#### ARTICLE XIX

To see if the Town will appropriate \$30,000.00 raising \$6,000.00 by taxes in 1975 and authorize the borrowing of \$24,000.00. \$6,000.00 to be raised by taxes each year in 1976, 1977, 1978 and 1979, to be used with any other money available to purchase a new fire truck, any unused balance to be put into a Capital Reserve Fund for new fire department equipment, or take any action relation thereto.

Voted, by voice vote, was undecided by the Moderator as to passing over this Article.

Voted, by ballot -- YES 59, NO 62-- not to pass over this article.

Voted, by voice vote, to consider this Article at a later date, so that additional information could be gotten together concerning the purchase of a new Fire Truck. The later meeting being the second Tuesday, the (13th) thirteenth day of May, next at 7:00 P.M., at the Community Hall.

#### ARTICLE XX

To see if the Town will require all dogs when off the premises of the owner or keeper to be on a leash, or confined in a cage, car, or otherwise, unless the dog is with the owner or keeper and under his control. Hunting dogs to be exempt when properly used for hunting or training.

Voted by voice vote, not to pass over this Article.  
 Show of hand to accept Article as written: YES 45-NO 48.  
 Ballot vote for the Article as written: YES 52-NO 54.  
 This Article was passed over as written.

#### ARTICLE XXI

To see if the Town will vote to require a permit before the construction of any building with an area of 100 square feet or more.

Voted, by voice vote, to pass over this Article.

#### ARTICLE XXII

To see if the Town will vote to require that all livestock and/or fowl be tethered, penned, fenced or confined to a building by owner or keeper.

Voted, by a show of Hand: YES 56 - NO 22 to pass over this article.

ARTICLE XXIII

To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Ordinance Relating to Campgrounds.

Voted, by majority voice vote, in the affirmative, to adopt the Ordinance Relating to Campgrounds.

ARTICLE XXIV

To see if the Town will vote to accept the agreement the Selectmen made with Bessie G. Jewett regarding land.

The Moderator, ruled that this Article could not be presented to the meeting for action, due to the fact that the Article does not clearly define the Agreement, with Bessie C. Jewett regarding land.

ARTICLE XXV

To vote to accept the Reports of Agents, Auditor, and Committees, as printed in the Town Report.

Voted, by voice vote, to pass over this Article, at this meeting.

ARTICLE XXVI

Voted, by voice vote, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the Monadnock Regional Bicentennial Committee to enable it to act as a regional coordinator for the celebration of the 1976 Bicentennial.

ARTICLE XXVII

Discussion indicated the following:

- Town reports to be distributed earlier.
- Better break down of accounts-especially Income items.
- A report by the Constable to be printed in the Town Report.
- Suggested a Finance Committee.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:00 A.M., to resume at 7:00 P.M., Tuesday, May the 13th, at the Community Hall.

The counting of ballots followed.

ARTICLES OF WARRANT  
FOR SPECIAL MEETING  
TOWN OF SULLIVAN  
May 13, 1975

1. To see whether the Town will raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$450.00 to be used for preliminary plans and specifications for a future Town Hall.

2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the use of absentee ballots for the election of town officers.

3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectpersons to appoint two alternate members to the Board of Adjustment.

4. To see if the Town will require all dogs when off the premises of the owner or keeper to be on a leash, or confined in a cage, car or otherwise, unless the dog is with the owner or keeper and under his control. Hunting dogs to be exempt when properly used for hunting or training. The penalty: Any dog found off the premises of the owner or keeper and not on a leash, or confined in a cage, car or otherwise, and not with the owner or keeper or is not under his control, the owner or keeper may be caused to appear in court or the dog may be taken to the Humane Society by an officer. If his dog is licensed, the owner shall be notified. The owner may pick up his or her dog at the Humane Society after paying the Society's board fee plus a \$10.00 fine which will go to the Town. The owner will also have to have the dog licenses if it is not at that time. After ten days and the dog is not picked up it shall, in the opinion of the Humane Society be placed for adoption or put to sleep.

5. To see if the Town will vote to require a permit, receivable from the Selectpersons for a \$2.00 fee, for any of the following types of construction: a building or addition with 100 square feet or more of floor area or an alteration that changes the structural make-up of the building.

6. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a proposed Ordinance Relating to Building within the Special Flood Hazard Area.

7. To see if the Town agrees to participate in the National Flood Insurance Program by directing the Board of Selectpersons to complete the eligibility application and submit the required information to the Federal Insurance Administration. Such information includes the following resolutions (summarized):

Resolution A.



The community recognizes that there are flood areas in the community; that federally subsidized flood insurance is available; that Town Meeting intends to evaluate land use in these areas; and that Town Meeting has the authority to enact appropriate land use control measures.

The Town Meeting resolves that assurances be given to the Federal Insurance Administration that the community will enact and enforce necessary land use control measures; that municipal officials and boards will be authorized to deal with the appropriate governmental agencies and private firms; and the elevations of buildings will be recorded when required.

Resolution B-1.

The community recognizes that regulations governing building construction in flood hazard areas have been enacted and are enforced.

The Town Meeting recommends that the Planning Board require all proposals for their approval that are in flood hazard areas be designed to minimize or eliminate flood damage and that the Planning Board require new or replacement water supply/sewage disposal systems be designed to eliminate or minimize flood damage.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,621.00 and to authorize the Selectpersons to contract with Keene for the use of their dump.

9. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectpersons to enter into an agreement with Bessie C. Jewett for the purchase of land on the westerly side of Town Farm Road, so called, and southerly of the Meeting House being seven (7) acres more or less, the conditions of which shall be that the Town shall pay to Bessie C. Jewett annually an amount of money equal to the amount of taxes levied against all of her real estate in the Town for that year, excluding any premises purchased or acquired after April 1, 1974, and the Town shall make payment by application of said payment to taxes due to the Town from Bessie C. Jewett in each such year. Said payments shall commence from April 1, 1974 and shall be made for a period ten (10) years from April 1, 1974 and further provided that the total of payments made by said Town shall not exceed Thirteen Thousand (\$13,000) Dollars. The agreement shall further provide that in the event that the remaining premises or any portion thereof of Bessie C. Jewett shall be conveyed to any other person not a child of Bessie C. Jewett, a spouse of such child, or child of such child, during the ten (10) Year period, the obligation of the Town to make such payment shall cease as to premises conveyed to such other person. And further to authorize the Selectpersons to accept said deed on behalf of the Town.

10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the Bicentennial Committee of the Town of Sullivan, said money to be expended only in the event that additional funds are obtained from Federal, State or private sources on a matching grant formula acceptable to the Committee, and further authorize the Committee to formulate and execute plans and projects and to enter into agreements with Federal, State, Local and other agencies whether public or private, relative to the financing and execution of said plans and projects.

11. To see if the Town will vote to accept a parcel of land, 4.5 acres, known as the Monument Lot, as a gift to be used in the best interest of said Town.

12. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting and to listen to opinions of a purely advisory nature in regard to the conduct of Town affairs for the ensuing year.

RECESSED TOWN MEETING  
May 13, 1975

---

Recessed Town Meeting was called to order, by the Moderator, Mr. Stanley H. Walters, May 13, 1975, at 7:00 P.M., in the evening, at the Community Hall, East Sullivan, to act upon Article 19.

ARTICLE XIX

To see if the Town will appropriate \$30,000.00 raising \$6,000.00 by taxes in 1975 and authorize the borrowing of \$24,000.00. \$6,000.00 to be raised by taxes each year in 1976, 1977, 1978 and 1979, to be used with any other money available to purchase a new fire truck, any unused balance to be put into a Capital Reserve Fund for new fire department equipment, or take any action relation thereto.

Voted, by ballot. YES 69 - NO 34 Total cast 103. 2/3 vote of those voting 68.66. Moderator declared Article 19 passed by a margin of 1/3 of a vote. An amendment was passed by voice vote that the new truck is to meet underwriters approval.

The recessed town meeting was adjourned.

SPECIAL TOWN MEETING

---

Special Town Meeting followed the Recessed Town Meeting, at the Community Hall.

Articles 1 - 8 - 9 - 10, could not be acted upon at this Special Town Meeting, because they dealt with requests for appropriations from the Town. RSA 31:5 states that one-half of the checklist voters need to be present. Checklist contains 279 names as of 3/4/75. Total number of ballots cast earlier in the evening was 103.

Article 2. Voted, by ballot, YES 74-NO 24. Total cast 98 to accept the use of absentee ballots for the election of Town Officers.

Article 3. Voted by a very distinct majority voice vote, to authorize the Selectpersons to appoint two alternate members to the Board of Adjustment.

Article 4. Motion to pass over this Article. Vote by voice, declared undecided, by the Moderator. Show of hands, 38 in favor of passing over, 41 opposed to passing over=79. Voted by ballot, YES 49 - NO 45. Article declared passed as written.

Article 5. Voted, by voice vote, to pass over this Article.

Article 6. Motion to pass over this Article. Voted by voice not to pass over this Article.  
Voted by a large majority voice vote, to pass Article 6 as written.

Article 7. Motion to pass over this Article. Voted by voice vote not to pass over this Article.  
Voted, by a majority voice vote, to adopt Article 7 as written.

Article 11. Motion to pass over this Article. Voted by voice not to pass over this Article.  
Voted, by voice vote, for the Town to accept a parcel of land, 4.5 acres known as the Monument Lot, as a gift to be used in the best interest of the Town.

Article 12. To give Thank's to Mrs. Jewett, for her gift, of the Monument Lot, to the Town.

Voted to adjourn the Special Town Meeting at 10:20 PM.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Sullivan in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Community Hall in said E. Sullivan on Tuesday, the 2nd day of March, next at 1:00 of the clock in the afternoon, Polls not to close before 7:00 of the clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

You are hereby notified to meet at Community Hall in said E. Sullivan on Saturday, the 13th day of March, next at 2:00 of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30,000.00 for the Maintenance of Highways and Bridges and for any construction of the same for the ensuing year.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$473.07 for Town Road Aid in order to receive the full State's share of \$3,153.79.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,175.00 to provide and maintain adequate Public Library service, and authorize the Library Trustees to receive and use supplemental funds otherwise provided.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for the operation of the Fire Department and the purchase and maintenance of equipment.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 for the Police Department and the purchase and maintenance of equipment.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 for the Planning Board.

9. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Recreation Commission of (5) five members including one ex-officio member from the Planning Board and (1) one from the Conservation Commission.

10. To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$750.00 for a recreation program to be administrated by the Commission.

11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectpersons to use up to \$3,500.00 Revenue Sharing money, if available, for improvements to Town Buildings.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the maintenance of the Town Cemeteries.

13. To authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

14. To see if the Town will vote to require a permit before the construction of any building with an area of 100 square feet or more.

15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enter into an agreement with the Foley-DiLuzio Ambulance Service of Keene under one of the following plans or take any action relating thereto.

Plan A. A subsidy request of \$936.00 based upon the number of Ambulance Calls in the Town of Sullivan from 7/1/74 to 7/1/75 and charged at the rate of \$52.00 per call. This charge reflects a base rate of \$40.00 and a mileage charge of \$1.50 permile. All calls are charged to the center of Town only and does not reflect an additional charge for longer distances. This figure would be reduced to a subsidy request of \$846.00 for the one year period if the Town has a rescue/EMT squad that will respond to all Ambulance Calls. This reflects a reduction of \$5.00 per call based on the eighteen (18) calls answered between 7/1/74 and 7/1/75.

Plan B. A subsidy request of \$756.00 based upon the 1973 population of the Town of Sullivan, 378 persons and figured at the rate of \$2.00 per person.

Plan C. A subsidy request of \$700.00 and the Town of Sullivan guaranteeing payment on all uncollected calls above the \$700.00 subsidy.

16. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to accept a deed from the First Congregational Church Society of Sullivan, Incorporated March 6, 1955 as United Congregational Chruuch of Sullivan, of certain buildings

consisting of carriage sheds together with the right to use the land under said buildings and a right to pass and repass over a driveway giving access thereto, and further to authorize the Town of Sullivan Bicentennial Committee to accept gifts and grants in connection therewith whether in kind or specie, and further to authorize the said committee to expend funds and use said gifts for the restoration and repair of said buildings.

17. To see if the Town will vote to require a fifty (50) foot set back for any part of a sewage system from any property line unless variance is received from the Board of Selectmen after proper hearing.

18. To see if the Town will vote to require a fifty (50) foot set back for any part of a water system from any property line unless variance is received from the Board of Selectmen after proper hearing.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$35,000.00 for the renovation of the E. Sullivan Community Hall. \$9,000.00 to be raised by taxes in 1976 and to borrow the balance with \$9,000.00 to be raised each successive year or take any action relating thereto.

20. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$27,000.00 as its share of the cost of reconstructing Bridge No. 089/099 on the Cross Road. The bridge to be constructed by the State under the Town Bridge Aid Program with Sullivan's share being  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the total estimated cost of \$108,000.00. To raise by taxes \$5,200.00 each year until the Town's share is paid, with the provision that the Selectmen be authorized to borrow the amount necessary to fulfill the Town's share, or take any action relating to the above. Further, to authorize the Selectmen to apply for any federal funds in anticipation of reducing the state and local shares.

21. To see if the Town will accept a deed of Bessie C. Jewett dated November 8, 1974, and affirm an agreement of the Selectmen dated November 11, 1974 for the purchase of land on the westerly side of Town Farm Road, so-called, and southerly of the Meeting House being seven (7) acres, more or less, the conditions of which shall be that the Town shall pay on behalf of Bessie C. Jewett, her heirs and administrators, annually an amount of money equal to the amount of taxes levied against all of her real estate in the Town for that year, excluding any premises purchased or acquired by her or her heirs after April 1, 1974, and the Town shall make payment of this obligation by application of said payment to taxes due to the Town from Bessie C. Jewett in each such year. Said agreement provides that it shall commence April 1, 1974 for a period of

ten (10) years from April 1, 1974, and it further provides that the total of payments made by said Town shall not exceed Thirteen Thousand (\$13,000.00) Dollars. The agreement further provides that in the event that the remaining premises or any portion thereof of Bessic C. Jewett shall be conveyed to any other person not a child of Bessie C. Jewett, a spouse of such child, or child of such child, during the ten (10) year period, the obligation of the Town to make such payment shall cease as to premises conveyed to such other person, and further to appropriate such funds as may be necessary to fulfill the said agreement.

22. To vote to accept the reports of Agents, Auditor,, and Committees, as printed in the Town Report.

23. By Petition: To see if the Town will vote to create a Budget Committee by adopting the provisions of the "Municipal Budget Law" in accordance with Chapter 32 of the New Hampshire Statutes, and, if these provisions are adopted, to determine the number of committee members and the members and the method of their selection of appointment.

24. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting and to listen to opinions of a purely advisory nature in regard to the conduct of Town Affairs for the ensuing year.

## LIBRARY TRUSTEES REPORT

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The library loaned 1,445 books to the townspeople in the year 1975, an increase of 135 books over last year. Of that number 870 were town library books; 575 were State Bookmobile books. The Bookmobile comes to our library four times a year. Sixty-two special request books came from the N. H. State Library.

Due to the increase in the cost of books we were only able to purchase 66 new books with our appropriation of \$175.00. This was done by joining the Doubleday Bargain Book Club. We continue to subscribe to the National Geographic.

Several townspeople have donated books to the library this year. We particularly wish to thank Mrs. Elizabeth Sweet, Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Talbot, Mr. and Mrs. Walter E. Roberts, Mrs. Persis Motter, and Mr. John Morressy. Also, we appreciated the donations of magazines and books for the book sale in June. Kindly keep us in mind for our 1976 flea market and book sale.

In April, 1975, six concerned citizens of the town signed a loan note for the purchase of the last remaining copies of Sullivan's official Town History which became

available from the Mary Whitcomb Estate. In June, 1975, the Library Trustees sponsored a Book Sale and Flea Market at the Community Hall. The money earned plus sales of town histories enabled us to repay the loan within the year. The few remaining two-volume sets that are left are under control of the Library Trustees and are available for sale at \$35.00 a set.

Two Memorial Book Funds have been established this year: the Bessie Jewett Fund and the Elsie B. Smith Fund (mother of Robert M. Smith of Sullivan).

Mrs. Jewett was a former town librarian and dedicated citizen of this town for many years. Monies in the Jewett Fund will be appropriated with the consent of Mrs. Jewett's family for books of lasting value for the library. Mrs. Smith of Keene was greatly interested in the development of the new Sullivan Library and the fund established in her name has been designated to purchase books in the fields of nature, biography and juvenile.

We were greatly honored in November to be the recipient of a \$400.00 grant from the New Hampshire Shieling Trust for the purchase of library equipment for the new library. This has been used to purchase wood for book shelves.

The Lady Volunteers have purchased and installed combination aluminum storm windows and door (\$519.00) for the new library building. Commercial wall-to-wall carpeting (\$950.00) has also been donated through the efforts of the Lady Volunteers and is awaiting installation.

Hopefully, the new library building which is being remodeled from the old town hall at the Center will be opened by summer. Work progresses slowly through efforts of a few volunteers. The Sullivan Bicentennial Committee sponsored a work bee in October at which time all the inside window glass was removed and reconditioned.

Plans are being made to form a Friends of the Library Committee. Such a group will be of valuable assistance to the library system.

Due to the resignation of Marie Kiburis as a trustee in October, J. L. Zini was appointed to serve the unexpired term of office.

Library Trustees have held weekly meetings throughout 1975.

SULLIVAN PUBLIC LIBRARY  
BOARD OF TRUSTEES BY-LAWS

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Considered: November 1975  
Adopted: January 1976

ARTICLE I

General Objectives: A. To assemble, preserve and administer, in organized collections, books and related educational and recreational material in order to promote and stimulate knowledge, wisdom, culture, and pure enjoyment for all citizens. B. To co-operate with the school and school libraries wherever possible and also supply services to the handicapped.

ARTICLE II

Board of Trustees: A. The Board of Library Trustees of Sullivan shall consist of three (3) members elected by the citizens of Sullivan. They are elected for a term of three overlapping years. If vacancies occur, members are appointed by the Board of Trustees with approval from the Board of Selectpersons to complete the term. The Senior Trustee shall be chairman and bookkeeper during the last year of his or her term. B. Trustees shall appoint the Librarian for a term of one (1) year with an annual review. C. Trustees shall be responsible for Town Library appropriations and make the annual report to the Town and the State. They shall be in control of book purchases and working materials connected with the Library. D. Annual dues for membership in the New Hampshire Library Trustees Association shall be paid from library funds. E. Regular meetings shall be held on the first Tuesday of each month at the library or such other time and place as the Board may determine. F. Special meetings may be held at any time at the call of the chairman or at the call of any two members of the Board, provided that written notice thereof be given to all trustees at least twenty-four hours in advance of the special meeting. G. A quorum at any meeting shall consist of two or more trustees.

ARTICLE III

Friends of the Library: A. The group shall be responsible to the Library Trustees.

ARTICLE IV

Gifts and Memorials: A. Books and other materials will be accepted on the condition that the library has the authority to make whatever disposition it deems advisable.

B. Gifts of money, real property, and/or stock will be accepted if conditions attached thereto are acceptable to the Board of Trustees and to the governing body of the Town of Sullivan. C. Personal Property, art objects, portraits, a tiques, and other museum objects will be accepted at the discretion of the trustees. D. The library will not store materials which are not outright gifts.

#### ARTICLE V

##### Guidelines for the Use of the Sullivan Public Library:

A. The library will serve all residents of the community. Persons residing outside the geographical area but owning property shall be considered residents. B. The use of the library shall be restricted to library related functions. C. Borrowing regulations-posted in the Library. D. Any damages caused to the Library property shall be paid for by the person or persons causing such damage and use of the library or its services will be denied by the librarian and trustees for due cause. Such cause may be failure to return books or to pay penalties, destruction of library property, disturbance of other patrons, or any other objectionable conduct on library premises. E. No smoking, no beverages, food or gum allowed in the building. F. Children may receive cards when they enter first grade or equivalent age, children under five (5) years of age must be accompanied by a parent, guardian or other responsible person. G. No animals shall be allowed in the library.

#### ARTICLE VI

Library Hours: A. The hours will be determined by the Trustees and will be posted in two public places.

#### ARTICLE VII

Amendments: A. Amendments to these policies may be proposed at any regular meeting but may become effective only after a favorable vote at a subsequent meeting.

## HIGHWAY REPORT 1975

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REPAIRS! REPAIRS! REPAIRS! That's about the story this year. The cost of parts and labor is still increasing and the equipment has aged! \$5,661.15 is the figure for parts and labor. As you can see listed below our equipment was all used when purchased by the town.

We have got to start doing something about a building to house our equipment. We need new equipment, but we have no place to keep it under cover.

We put out 32 ton of salt and 400 yards of sand last year. In January 1976 alone we have used 200 yards of sand and 32 ton of salt so far and we still have February and March left.

Our summer work program included Blind Ditches on Woodbury Hill and at the Village Store which has solved bad water and ice problems.

923 yards of gravel went on the Ferry Brook Road which is only half as much needed to bring it out of the mud. Plans are to finish graveling this year.

We put in more culverts this year and 486 yards of gravel throughout the town.

The bad curve on the Valley Road has had a face lifting and brush has been cut back on most roads which was an expensive project.

Minimum wage as of January 1976 is now \$2.30/hour.

## REPORT OF THE SULLIVAN POLICE DEPARTMENT

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As we all know, crime in the small towns is on the rise and the Sullivan police department is doing the best they can to combat this with their time, man, equipment and funds.

In 1975 many more hours have been put into patrolling. During this patrolling any complaints that could be taken care of at that time were. Most of this patrolling is done during the time the Ashuelot Ridge is open but this is not always the case.

Besides for the patrolling, which by just being out discourages crime, the police have been called out for accidents, breaking and entering, domestic complaints, and dog complaints. Three dogs have been taken to the Humane Society. Most persons after being warned, do keep their dogs under control, but some have to be reminded. This warning is usually done only when a dog is being a nuisance.

As far as equipment goes, the department has purchased a car mounted portable radio and two uniforms. A few small items were purchased also.

Arrests have been made and time has been spent in court. The department has been working closer with the Sheriff and the State Police and by doing this our men not only get valuable training but also they often make the arrests and reports which eliminates the department having to take off time from work to attend court which would add to the town's costs. Time was also spent in investigations with the Sheriff, State Police, and Fire Department.

In summary, as the town is in more need of police protection, we are trying to keep up by improving the department. It is most necessary for all citizens to cooperate with the department and to report anything suspicious as no department can be everywhere at the same time.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SULLIVAN FIRE DEPARTMENT  
FOR 1975

1975 was a busy year for us in many ways. The finishing touches have begun inside the fire station as with the onset of winter, outside activities have ceased. We are eagerly awaiting the arrival of the new truck due to arrive the second week of January. New hose and nozzles have been ordered and should be here before the truck.

The past year was extremely busy due to the unusually high number of fire calls we responded to. We answered 18 calls including 1 electrical fire, 2 chimney fires, 7 brush fires, 7 building fires and we stood by at 1 accident. The 7 building fires should be clarified that 4 buildings were involved with 1 requiring attention 3 additional times. The number of brush fires shows a marked increase over previous years, many being of suspicious origin. The fact that there were just two chimney fires is encouraging to us that people are being more cautious with wood burning appliances and maintaining chimneys and stove pipes more carefully. We required mutual aid 9 times, once from Nelson, 5 times from Keene, twice from Gilsum and once from Marlow. The dollar loss covered by insurance was \$5,175 and the total acreage burned was approximately one and one half acres. The members of the fire department spent a total of 326 man hours fighting fires with no injuries.

Many members attended training classes at Meadowood this year, greatly increasing our knowledge of fire fighting skills. Training is planned for the coming year through Fire Mutual Aid involving the new truck when it arrives. Election of officers was held at the March meeting with Walter Roberts re-elected Chief for three years, Francis Johnson Assistant Chief, and James Dyer, Captain. Four new members were added this year with a total of twenty years experience. At the close of 1975 we had 21 active members.

The old Ford will be returned to Bear Brook State Park shortly, after the tank and equipment have been removed and we will be getting a 1946 Mack with a 750 pump, assorted hose and equipment giving us three reliable trucks. The chicken barbeque was a tremendous success and the money raised went to help pay for the new radio to be installed in the new truck. We plan to have another barbeque this year at the fire station with entertainment.

We have launched a campaign with Project Rescue with window stickers which will mark the bedroom windows of children, invalids, elderly persons and people who are bedridden so that in the event of fire we will be able to affect a more rapid rescue. If you do not have these



stickers, please contact the Chief and you will be furnished with the ones you need. Members are at the fire station at various times during the week and Sunday mornings during radio check at 11:00 am and will enjoy showing you the new station and new equipment.

SULLIVAN CONSERVATION COMMISSION  
1975

During 1975 two events of particular interest have taken place:

1. A contract was signed with the Department of Agriculture Soil Conservation District for the completion of the Soil Survey of Sullivan authorized by the voters at the 1974 Annual Town Meeting. Much of the field work was completed this summer and fall. The full report, including maps, will be completed before December 1, 1976. This data will be of tremendous value to the Selectmen and Planning Board as well as to the Conservation Commission in making plans and reaching decisions.

2. A summer program for children 8 years and older was sponsored for the third year by the Conservation Commission. Forty-one children were enrolled in the 8 week program which included a Day Camp program (10 hours per week), Folk Dancing (one evening per week) and Band (one meeting per week).

Cookouts and overnight camping at a site prepared by the youngsters on the Town Farm were features of the Day Camp program along with games, crafts and hikes.

Expense to the Town for the Program was \$597.60 for salaries. The Town also contributed roofing boards for the cabin erected by the Commission to house supplies and provide shelter when needed. Expenses for this construction were paid from the funds raised by the Commission.

Jane Nims was assisted by William Clark in the Day Camp Program and also ran the Folk Dancing. Volunteer Townsmen Walters directed the band. Signe Motter taught macrame and several parents helped with the overnight camping.

The original purpose of the Commission in sponsoring this summer program was to encourage utilization and enjoyment of the natural resources of the Town of Sullivan and to teach the need for their conservation. The program has changed from that original concept to the point that it has outgrown or become broader than the legitimate interests of the Commission. The Commission, therefore, feels that its sponsorship of recreation in the Town should be turned over to a Recreation Commission, appointed by the Selectmen, which would be better suited to serving the Recreational needs of the community.
