Town Meeting Warrant

The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Benton qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Benton Community Building in said Benton on the second Tuesday of March next, (March 13th) at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman for three years, (Alfred W. Mardin being the outgoing member), one Highway Agent, one Tax Collector, one Town Treasurer, one Auditor, one Trustee of the Trust Funds for three years, and all other necessary Town Officers and Agents for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To hear the Reports of Officers and Agents heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Officers' salaries and expenses, for the repair and maintenance and construction of highways and bridges, for the observance of Memorial Day and for all other Town charges and expenses for the ensuing year.

Article 4. To see what action the Town will take in regard to how Memorial Day will be observed.

Article 5. To see what action the Town will take to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to paint or stain the Benton Community Building and to raise such sums of money as may be needed for this purpose.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to dispense with delivery of inventory blanks until April 1st.

Article 8. To see if the District will vote to build a woodshed for the School and Community Building and raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Article 9. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

To the School Board and Citizens of Benton:

I herewith present my second annual report as superintendent of your schools.

The total enrollment for the school in 1943-44 was 12. The average membership 9.22. The percent of attendance 96.95 and the number of tardinesses were 0. There was 1 pupil attending Haverhill Academy. There were 4 elementary pupils at Pike School and 4 at Glencliff.

This year the total enrollment is 12. There is 1 pupil attending Haverhill Academy and 10 pupils attending an elementary school outside the district.

We were fortunate to retain the services of Mrs. Katie Paige of Groton, Vermont for this year. Mrs. Paige is well-liked by the children. Her holiday programs are exceptionally good. The sewing club, the craft work, and the supplementary work in cooking and home nursing are very worthwhile and not often offered in one-room schools. The fundamentals are well taught.

Your school is modern and well equipped. The school atmosphere is a happy, healthy one. The building is warm and comfortable.

The Benton School is undoubtedly outstanding in the state for its low tardiness record. None of the pupils who are in attendance at the school have been tardy during the past two years.

Additions made to the school since Mrs. Paige's arrival are the new state curtain, card tables, a sewing machine and new book cases. The Benton School could be improved by the addition of playground equipment.

Your School Board is cooperative. It is a pleasure to work in your community.

Forest fires require the spending of much money and material that might otherwise be diverted into vital war channels. Forest fires are, for the most part, unnecessary and avoidable for ninety-eight percent of such fires are, annually, the result of human carelessness-yours and mine. This can and should be remedied-NOW! YOU can HELP THE WAR EFFORT by PREVENTING FOREST FIRES! The rules of the game are simple.

- 1. Always be careful with fire in or near woodlands.
- 2. Comply with regulations governing the use of starting of fires there.

Remember

- a. You need written permission from your local forest fire warden for debris burning fires when the ground is not covered with snow.
- b. Be sure your match, cigar, cigarette and pipe ashes are OUT before dropping them.
- 3. Be fire-minded NOW as never before and thus help your warden, your town, your nation and yourself!
